

About Eva Kor



About the Trip

Through our immersive educational experiences, we hope trip members not only witness history, but also help our world shine with hope, healing, respect, and responsibility. We have led group tours of Auschwitz in 2005, 2007, 2010, 2012, and 2013 with up to 100 people on a trip. Our surveys conducted during and after the trip indicate that 100% of all trip participants are "highly satisfied" or better with their experience. Everyone is welcome on this trip regardless of religion, race, occupation, ethnicity, or any other factor.

This year we are excited to announce a new opportunity for those with a special interest in the story of Eva Mozes Kor. After our Poland portion concludes, Eva will lead an optional tour of her hometown in Transylvania, Romania, as well as other sites in the region that were important to her experiences pre- and post-war. This is an educational experience that has never been presented before and a journey Eva has not taken since 2001. In fact, she has only been back to her village three times since that fateful day in 1944

Option A: Auschwitz-Birkenau, 9 days

Walk in the footsteps of survivor Eva Kor as she recounts her harrowing and inspiring story of survival, triumph, and forgiveness in the very place where it all happened. Learn about the lives of the victims, the Nazi system of destruction, and the courage of survivors from the expert tour guides of the Auschwitz-Birkenau State Museum. Tour the historic Jewish

quarter where Steven Spielberg filmed *Schindler's List*. Soak in the splendor and beauty of Krakow, Poland's charming, medieval royal city, and visit the Wieliczka Salt Mine, a UNESCO World Heritage site. *Cost: \$3,700-\$4,200*.

Option B: Romania Heritage Tour, 9 days

Be part of the first group to ever tour Eva's home village of Portz in Transylvania, Romania. Visit the site of her family home and



schoolhouse, then ride through the countryside past rustic villages. Stand on the site of the regional ghetto where Eva's family was deported to Auschwitz, and tour the Northern Transylvania Holocaust Museum in Simleu Silvaniei. Explore the burgeoning arts city of Cluj, where Eva and her sister Miriam lived after the war, where Eva defied the ruling Communist party, and the synagogue where the twin girls participated in their first Holocaust remembrance ceremony in 1946. Conclude the tour on the Danube, with three nights and two full days exploring Budapest, Hungary, known as one of the world's most beautiful cities. *Cost: S3.700-S4.200*.



Option C: Poland + Romania, 16 days

Includes full itinerary for Options A and B. After the Auschwitz experience, fly from Krakow to Budapest and trace Eva's life story before and after the Holocaust. Cost: \$5,000-\$5,800.
