

Brain Tumor Survivor Helps Sick, Needy Children

When John Theissen was 17, he was hospitalized for a brain tumor at a local children's hospital. During his stay, he befriended a 7-year-old girl who was receiving treatment for her own serious illness. Theissen noticed that Tasha had no visitors and little family support, yet despite that, her generous spirit and positive attitude shined. Inspired by his new friend, Theissen became determined to help children like Tasha and the many others he encountered during his journey as soon as he recovered from his ordeal.

It began with a holiday toy drive in 1992 to collect gifts for children in Long Island hospitals. In two weeks' time, Theissen personally delivered more than 800 toys to three hospitals. Thirteen years later, the John Theissen Children's Foundation has collected over 300,000 new toys through its annual drive for children in more than 180 local hospitals, childcare facilities and homeless shelters. The nonprofit has also expanded, providing pediatric healthcare facilities with recreational and therapeutic equipment, such as televisions, VCRs, video game systems, wheelchairs and arts and craft supplies. Granting children's wishes and providing assistance to defray the cost of medical expenses are other ways the organization makes a difference in the lives of families and children facing difficult challenges. "Sometimes a smile is the best medicine," Theissen says. He and his team, which includes his wife Heather, feel privileged for their yearround involvement with these

children. "Our doors are always open," he adds.

The Back to School Program offers school clothing and supplies to youngsters from kindergarten through high school from low-income families across Long Island. Shirts, pants, shoes, notebooks, backpacks and other classroom necessities are among the many items distributed. The program was launched to ensure that children whose families may not have the means for back-to-school expenses could start school feeling good about themselves.

"The reactions of our young recipients inspire us," says Heather Theissen, President of the Board. "We realize that we can't cure an illness, but to provide things that can create a diversion and smile — even if it's brief — we feel we've made a difference. In addition, if we can somehow help needy families and lighten their burden during rough times and throughout the holidays, we feel fulfilled." Theissen adds that her husband has made a difference in the lives of countless children and is known by many as "the man of a million smiles."
