

o tell the story of my walk in Christ up to now is to tell the story of how a gracious God dealt with an entire family. I was born in Brooklyn, NY in the mid-50's to a Mom and Dad who loved me very much as the first of

five children. My parents both came from a somewhat conservative Jewish heritage,

and kept many of the rules and regulations that define most peoples' understanding of Judaism. They kept the Sabbath, to an extent. They went to synagogue, most of the time. They kept a kosher home, usually. And they kept close ties with their parents.

My Dad's job with the Social Security Administration moved us to Baltimore. Though there is a strong Jewish presence in that area, the change seemed to provide my family with the opportunity to change the way in which we practiced our faith. We joined a Reform synagogue, abandoning some of the defining practices in the process. About the time that I began studying for my Bar Mitzvah, my father became disillusioned with the attitudes of the Temple, and of most of the Jewish infrastructure. He announced we no longer would be attending synagogue, and would instead "worship God in our own way." As you might imagine, this soon degraded to no worship at all.

Nevertheless, God was in the wings, engineering outcomes as only He is able to do.







I recently had the pleasure of interviewing the director of the woman's Teen Challenge Center here in Providence, RI, and was quite frankly amazed at the many traumatic and heart wrenching obstacles she has managed to overcome in her lifetime. By the time Pastor Jacqueline Strothoff hit rock bottom, she had *nothing*...nothing but a tiny amount of faith, no larger than the size of a mustard seed.

Jacqui was born in Pittsburgh PA the oldest of six children. In her opinion she had a fairly normal childhood-good parents and a nice home in the suburbs. Yet at an early age Jacqui became aware of an emptiness inside her, an emptiness that caused her to view her young life as futile and meaningless.

Many of us can claim to have felt this way at one time or another in our lives, but few of us actually embark upon that path of selfdestruction that inevitably leads to drugs and suicide. That is the path, however, that Jacqui chose, albeit unwittingly; after all, she was only 12 years old when she first began to experiment with alcohol and drugs. Addiction does not discriminate, it takes whomever it can, and when it enters into your life you can be fairly certain that suicide - or the idea of suicide - is part of the package. Jacqui was 14 years old when she first attempted suicide; she slashed her wrist open with a razor blade. That was how it started.

When Jacqui was 16 years old she found herself pregnant and married, married to a man who verbally and physically abused her at the slightest provocation. At 6 months pregnant she was rushed to the hospital, hemorrhaging from a beating inflicted upon her by her husband. Needless to say, she lost

the baby; the doctors told her that it had been stillborn.

Several days later she went back to the hospital, where the doctors, after having discovered that she had been pregnant with twins. proceeded to surgically remove the second

child from her womb. They told her that she would never again be able be bear children, for the ordeal had left her sterile.

Her parents sent her to Pittsburgh to live with her grandparents, who then enrolled her in the private school from which she would graduate. In the fall of 1966 she entered Penn State University and looked forward to a "fresh start". Jacqui, however, had attempted several "fresh starts" before, always to wind up right back in the arms of drugs. This time was no different. During her first year at Penn state she was introduced to heroin, and from that point on her life truly became a rollercoaster of ups, downs, and everything in

In 1972, while confined to a mental institution in Pittsburgh (placed there by her father), Jacqui was arrested, transferred back to Virginia, and charged with the illegal disposition of a dead body. She and her friend Michael had been partying heavily on a stash of stolen narcotics earlier that year when Michael passed out. Assuming he would come out of it sooner or later (this was not an uncommon occurrence with them), Jackie went to sleep herself. When she woke up the following morning she saw that he was dead; his body was ice cold and his lips were blue. She called

ing that Michael was indeed dead, helped her to bury the body at a construction site. Jacqui was sentenced to treatment in a therapeutic community drug program, along with a suspended sentence.

Once out of the program Jacqui went back to the streets, and back to the drugs. Over the next few months Jacqui exhausted every treatment option available-- from support groups to 12 step programs-- and yet she continually relapsed. In 1974 she again attempted to take her own life, and again she failed. By an ugly

twist of fate her younger brother died from a drug overdose that same year. Unfortunately, it was an overdose that Jacqui played a part in, for she injected the cocaine that caused his untimely death. Subsequently, Jacqui was admitted to a hospital, placed in an isolation room and strapped down to the bed with an attendant sitting beside her. Jacqui could not have been in a more hopeless situation...or in a more hopeless state. It was while she was in this state that the Lord sent someone who would lead her to the saving power of Jesus Christ.

"If you surrender to Him, He will come into your heart and change you." Jacqui was told. "He will

After her graduation, Jacqui went on to attend the David Wilkerson Bible College—a leadership training academy designed specifically for people who had graduated from the program and wanted to continue working with addicts and alcoholics. She attended the college for two years—one year in training and one year interning in the teen challenge center located in

> Riverside, California. By this time Jacqui had gotten married-- to fellow Bible College graduate no less-and after finishing up her internship she joined her husband in York. New Over the years Jacqui and her husband had two children, a boy and a

girl; something the doctors had said was impossible.

For nearly 33 years Jacqui has been working in different ministries for the Lord. She has worked at several teen challenges across the country including New York and California and for nearly 2 years she worked directly for David Wilkerson on his crusade team in Texas. She went back to school in Springfield MO-to South West Missouri state where she received her bachelor's degree in social work. In 1988 Jacqui and her husband Robert were called to New England in order for Robert to lend a hand in the opening of a men's Teen Challenge. her husband did indeed help to open the men's center in Providence (a center that unfortunately has since closed), Jacqui was given the opportunity to at last fulfill a vision she had been given by the Lord some years back. This vision was, and is today, the Teen Challenge Center for Women located on Elmwood Ave. in Providence. And while Jacqui spent numerous years there as the director—"I was there the day we received our very first resident--Thanksgiving Day"-- she inevitably gave up the position in order to move to Florida with her husband.

Serving customers since 1970

She and her husband moved to Florida in the late nineties, where they remained for several years in ministry for the Lord. While in Florida, Robert suffered a heart attack and was called home to glory. Shortly after his death, Jacqui moved back to New England, and in 2006 picked up right where she had left off -- as Director of the Woman's Teen Challenge in Providence. She remains there still, an inspiration and a messenger of hope to all those who enter.

"The women who come to Teen Challenge tell me that they feel, from the very start, something different here. They feel "a warmth" that they never felt in a secular program. They feel a presence in the house, and although they cannot put their finger on it, they see something different in the staff as well. Rather than inundate or overwhelm them with all kinds of Gospel stuff, we just try to love them accept them, and get them settled in."

"I never imagined that me getting my life straight was going to last. I never had the hope or expectation that it would be anything other than short term. When I look back on it, it amazes me that it's

been 33 years. I've realized since that drugs were the least of my problems. I mean, if drugs were the real problem, then how come every time I got off drugs, I wasn't able to stay off drugs? I finally figured out that I didn't really have a drug problem, I had a sin problem I had a problem because I wasn't connected to the One who created me, the One who knew me best and loved me most. Once I made that connection, everything else started falling into place for me. Everything started making sense. After awhile I realized that being clean from drugs and alcohol is really the least of what God had done for me. He made me to be a person of purpose. He gave meaning to my life. And once he did that, once I had meaning in my life and I felt like I was a worthwhile and valuable person, it was just like....wow! It's amazing the difference that one life can make, when that life is in the hands of God."



overseas missions rather than on the people all around them? It's so easy just to mail a check...and feel smug. Sure, it helps to have a food pantry open a few hours per week or an annual clothing drive but is it really enough when the truly hungry or desperately homeless are among their midst and largely ignored? Have they forgotten that Jesus' mission was to the poor, (Luke 4:18) or, His warning to those who ignore people in need of food, shelter, or clothing? (Matthew 25:35-46)

There are some within the homeless population, of course, who seem to have no desire to improve their circumstances and year after year they seek their creature comforts wherever they can. Some are governed by substance abuse and some are emotionally unstable. These folks are those that we are quickest to judge. There are, however, many who are there due to circumstances beyond their control. For example, a growing number of the homeless are hard working people who were driven out of their apartments or houses due to much higher rents and rising utility costs. Even with the income of a husband and wife combined, it is very difficult to keep afloat. This group is referred to as the "Working Poor" by Pastor Gene Giguere and others.

Pastor Gene is the senior pastor of the Harvest Community Church in Woonsocket, RI, a church that decided to do something about helping the homeless. He said that the church was introduced to the homeless problem in a big way when three homeless men attended their church service on an elevendegree Sunday morning. After the service he learned that they were homeless. That night Pastor Gene Pastor Gene is missionary minded. Born in Woonsocket he has one brother and one sister .He decided to profess his faith in Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior while serving with the US Navy in Sicily in 1981. Later his girlfriend, Mary, accepted the Lord as well. They married and now have two girls in college, Amy and Alison. Pastor Gene and Mary later became missionaries in Thessalonica, Greece where they started a Bible School. They also helped build a church in Bulgaria and spent time in Macedonia. After four years they returned to the US. Pastor Gene and Harvest Community like to call themselves missionaries to Woonsocket. The church, in fact is perfectly located in the center of it all, easily accessible by all. It is no surprise that the church decided, missionary fashion, to address a problem head-on, to plow forward and do what needed to be done. In their sixth year their shelter, referred to as their "Sanctuary Ministry" is truly a success.

One very cold evening last month my son Matthew and I went to visit the ministry. I was there to interview and observe; Matt was there to photograph. There were twentyfour men there that night and most were awake and active although at 8pm. several were already sound asleep on their mats. The men, some of whom were watching a movie, appeared weary, perhaps having just spent a day walking the streets. There was some cheerful bantering going on. We learned of the diversity among the group; there were men of a variety of trades and abilities among them.

Some seemed at peace and some wary of Matt and I since we were two intruders in their territory.

We were greeted by Doug Lachance, director of the mission, his wife Mary, staff member Charles Britton and volunteer Scott Carpenter. Mary was visiting and frequently volunteers to help in many ways. The men love her homemade pies, a specialty, which she brings, warm from her oven. Seldom have I spoken with a group of people so totally committed to their mission. In this case, they assist in providing men with a warm meal and a bed for the night with a sincere non judgmental attitude and a Christian theme.

Doug Lachance spent most of his life in foster homes and other settings, he was ejected from the Child "welfare" system without a plan, resources, or supports due to his age. Doug was homeless for several years, eating at soup kitchens and sleeping in shelters and wherever else he could. His past, coupled with an increasing reliance on God's Word has shaped him into a determined man with an unwavering conviction to provide a listening ear and genuine interest in helping the men, and they know it. Don't call the men "Those people" in front of Doug because "Those people" are people, individuals who are valued by God and

him and unique in their own ways. A most meaningful scripture that Doug shares with the men is Jeremiah 29:11 which reads: "For I know the plans that I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for calamity to give you a future and a hope."

Charles Britton understands the needs of the men because he was once homeless. He has a competent,

dependable look about him and he seems very capable of addressing anything that might come up. Because of his past he knows the needs, the frustrations and simply the ins and outs of homelessness. Scott is also an impressive presence; he has volunteered for over four years and seems quite proficient and committed to providing a caring and safe haven for the men.

The Harvest Community Church Sanctuary mission is a professionally operated, safe environment that can house up to thirty-five men. There are security cameras and a security person that stays awake each night as well as a volunteer. There is warm food for the men when they arrive at 7: 30 pm and a secure place to store their belongings which in itself is unique; it is common for people who are homeless to carry all that they own with them each day. The area is very clean, and the sleeping mats are sterilized daily. "Why" a man is homeless is not questioned; the goal is to get him out of the cold for the night. The sanctuary mission operates from November 1 - March 30 each year.

Pastor Gene had an important meeting scheduled later in the day after our interview; a summit with four other Woonsocket churches which, working together, are a voice for change. These churches are listed for two reasons: first they deserve recognition as ones who have left their comfort zone and, second, to illustrate the diversity of the churches in the group. They are the Apostolic Pentecostal Church (Pastor Ken Jarre), St. James Baptist Church (Pastor Sammy Vaughn), St Charles Catholic church (Father Jerry) and All Saints Catholic Church (Father Mark). This is not to be mistaken as a group of churches unifying and professing the "same faith." which has nothing to do with it. This amounts to five men attempting to become one voice to address critical needs in the city.

Harvest Community Church leaders and members moved forth in faith over five years ago to take on a project in which they had no knowledge or experience. Now they are doggedly moving towards opening a "transitional house" that could house up to twelve men at a time. People eligible for the home are those who display a true desire to help themselves. God's Will is done when a church moves forward in faith. With the group of pastors listed above all interested in accomplishing this goal, there is more clout and action.

There is an opportunity for much more to be done for the homeless and the poor in RI but first the disunity among churches must

cease. Churches, banded together regardless of "denomination," should speak against poverty and do something about it. They truly could become a voice for change and progress. To do less is to deny God and His Word. Pastor Gene reminds us of His Word in Ephesians 4:3 which reads: "Be

diligent to preserve the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace..." Here, and other verses exhort churches to unify." Pastor Gene believes that churches have lost their voices through disunity for the following reasons: first, there have been scandals in churches which discredit them. Then, there is a major shift in thinking, as the Bible in

2 Timothy 4:3-4 describes this period: "For a time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but wanting to have their ears tickled, they will accumulate for themselves teachers in accordance to their own desires and will turn away their ears from the truth and will turn aside to myths." Enough said. Finally, there is division not only within churches but among churches.

Pastor Gene believes his church exists to "demonstrate the love of Christ to people; not just to staple a tract on their heads." By this he means that he has nothing against tracts, in themselves: instead it is the hit and run method used by so many churches which he dislikes. It is much more effective to meet a need, gain trust, and display His love first before proclaiming

So there you have it, God's work in action, carried forth by a church body that cared enough to move

> forward and create meaningful change in the lives of many men during the past six years. They would love to introduce you to some of the fruit they have borne. One in particular is Adam, age 32 who came to the ministry three years ago heavily addicted to drugs. He is now free of the substances and it actively taking steps to improve

While my dad explored different confessions and professions, my brothers were active in the Cub Scout pack that met at a local United Methodist Church. They sponsored a Cub Scout Sunday event that featured a speaker from the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. He testified of Jesus' saving power in his deliverance from drugs and alcohol abuse. My Dad was unimpressed, having been an upright individual all of his life. Yet he was in seeker mode. His testimony was, "I looked up to the ceiling and said, 'God, isn't there something for someone who hasn't lain in the gutter?' And I heard God say to me, 'Yes, there is! Follow Me!" But Dad didn't go forward at that time. There was in that same Cub Scout pack another family. The dad was a lawyer, but the mom was the pastor of a United Church of Christ that met in South Baltimore. God put it together in such a way, with such acceptance on the part of the church and its members, that my dad and our whole family were baptized and received into membership in June of 1972.

But this is meant to be my testimony. The pastor gave our family a copy of "The New English Bible", which my dad looked through and then placed on a shelf in our dining room. Several months went by as I saw it laying there. Finally, in late September of 1972, I saw it and grabbed it. I said to my assembled family, "I think I'll take this Bible upstairs and read it. It's supposed to be ruling my life, you know." I decided that since I had a Jewish heritage, I wouldn't start in the Old Testament. So opening to Matthew, I began to read about the life of Jesus and His teachings. I soon arrived at the twelfth chapter and verses 31 and 32:

"Therefore I say to you, every sin and blasphemy will be forgiven men, but the blasphemy against the Spirit will not be forgiven men. Anyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man, it will be forgiven him; but whoever speaks against the Holy Spirit, it will not be forgiven him, either in this age or in the age to come. (NKJV)

I was shaken to the core, and cried out to God, concerned that perhaps I, by making light of this new found faith, had committed this unpardonable sin. It was my turn to hear the reassuring voice of God inside of me, saying "No, not yet; but unless you repent...." I didn't wait to hear anything more, but immediately asked God to forgive me and come into my life. Two years later, as a result of my father's involvement with the Full Gospel Businessmen's Fellowship and other connections, I asked the Lord to fill me with the Holy Spirit, which He graciously did.

So began my spiritual journey. I found myself enjoying a youth fellowship that met in a Presbyterian church. I was entrusted with teaching the youth at the United Church of Christ where my family first joined. I became involved with a charismatic prayer group that met in an Episcopal church, leading as God gave me insight in His word.

House Pets the Biggest Victims of US Economic Woes

As the more and more private home foreclosures occur as a result of a slumping housing market and economy, the biggest -- and most silent -- losers are family pets who are being deserted by their

"Economists and analysts are predicting a serious recession and politicians are making empty promises that could actually increase the suffering of Americans. Yet not one of the current presidential candidates in both parties is articulating a solution to the suffering of our most vulnerable creatures -- dogs and cats," warns political analyst Mike Baker.

"We're seeing quite a few animals being surrendered due to economic

reasons, including foreclosure," Angie Wood, assistant director of the Naperville, Illinois Humane Society, told the Chicago Tribune.

According to The Daily Green, Wood's shelter is currently caring for a small number of

animals that were turned over when their owners lost their homes, including a cat, a black Labrador retriever and a shiba inu.

Several animal welfare experts say the US is witnessing an increase in the number of abandoned animals as a result of the housing crunch. "It seems people are giving up their pets after they are forced to move to a place where animals are forbidden, or when they end up crowding in with family or friends who are not amendable to furry friends. It's also possible some folks just can't afford Fido or Fluffy's chow or vet bills anymore," said Woods

Last year, the number of homes at some level of bank foreclosure in the US more than doubled from the previous year -- one for every 196 homes, according to the tracking company RealtyTrac. In response, the Humane Society has issued a statement this past month saying

> ing too many animals who have starved to death," said Stephanie Shain, director of outreach for the Human Society of the United States.

"While some people dump their pets on the street, others go so far as to lock the animal in a closet where their cries for help are harder to hear," she said.

"We're findto ingest something," Shain said in a telephone interview." Other Americans are also not waiting for government bureaucrats to address the problem of pet abandonment. They are springing into action to save the most vulnerable among us.

For example, after more than 60 cats were discovered weeks after abandonment in a Cincinnati house in May 2007, a local artist sprung into action. The felines were near death from starvation and soaked in urine, but Robin Moro adopted two, and created a

website, ForeclosureCats.org, to help the others. Artists around the country created portraits of the rescues, called the Foreclosure Cats Project, and an eBay auction of the resulting work was set up to raise funds for their care.

Animal welfare experts say that if someone can no longer care for their pets, the best and most humane thing would be to locate a reputable shelter or animal adoption group, rather than just releasing the pets to fend for themselves, or simply leaving them to fate in abandoned dwellings. According to Foreclosure Cats Project, in some cases, people have been able to re-adopt their animals after getting their physical, and financial, houses in order.

God has since led us to other fellowships in the area to be of service in whatever way we could. We currently attend North Providence (RI) Assembly of God where my wife and I find varied opportunities to serve.



Rhode Island school to track students with RFID tags

OneNewsNow.com - A Rhode Island school district plans to begin using Radio Frequency Identification -- or RFID -- technology to track students, starting next week. But the plan is not without opposition. Neal McCluskey with the Cato Institute says while the program may have good intentions, it is still a bad idea.

The Middletown, Rhode Island, school district will attach RFID tags to the book bags of about 80 children who ride buses to and from school. The system is supposed to allow the district and parents to know whether their children are on the bus. Global Positioning System (GPS) devices will also allow officials and parents to locate buses.

A spokesperson for the district told Associated Press that the system will improve accountability and efficiency of the schools' transportation services. But McCluskey, education policy analyst for the Cato Institute, says Americans should be concerned any time any government entity, like a public school, wants to gather more information about them.

"And I think a lot of people, with good reason, see this sort of as the camel's nose under the tent of greater tracking, more

intrusion on personal freedom and independence," he says.

"It'll all be cast in terms like 'It's for their safety. It's for efficiency' -- which, you know, might be legitimate reasons to do it," the Cato Institute analyst acknowledges. "But when it comes from a government entity ... unless it's truly, fully voluntary, people are very worried that it's going to become something much bigger than it starts out as and it's a legitimate concern."

The fundamental problem, according to McCluskey, is that the plan will be imposed upon parents who pay for the school through their taxes and who may have legitimate concerns about privacy and other tracking applications of the technology -- such as tracking students during and after school.

In addition to privacy concerns and fears of expanded use of such electronic monitoring of children, security experts point out that the system would only track whether the RFID tag, not the actual child, is or is not on the bus. Advocates for school choice say the program is evidence of the laziness of some public school administrators, who should -- they say -- already have systems in place to know the location of every student for the entire school day.

Thirty-Five Years and 45 Million Preborn Babies Later

(EP News)--Thousands of life advocates gathered Jan. 22 in the nation's capital for the 35th March for Life to remember the more than 45 million preborn babies who have died since the Supreme Court legalized abortion in 1973.

On Jan. 22, 1973, the court voted 7-2 to overturn all state laws banning abortion. Thus, Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton made abortions legal for any reason through the first six months of pregnancy, and for virtually any reason thereaf-

Yet, polls show most Americans want more limits on abortion. A December Time magazine poll revealed that more than half of Americans oppose abortion in nearly every circumstance. A Fox News poll in October showed that

45 percent of Americans want to know a candidate's position on abortion before they vote.

Carrie Gordon Earll, senior bioethics analyst for Focus on the Family Action, said that, notwithstanding 35 years of tragedy, the pro-life movement should be encouraged. "Abortion advocates surely expected the debate to be over by now — but it's far from it," she said. "Pro-life voices continue to raise moral objections to abortion and offer true choice to women in unplanned pregnancies. The number of abortions is steady, even declining, thanks in part to the passage of state pro-life laws. We can expect to see continued progress toward our goal of making abortion both illegal and unthinkable."

Twenty-six states provide women seeking abortion with information about its risks and alternatives. Thirty-five states have laws providing for parental involvement in a minor daughter's abortion decision.

Ultrasound technology also has played a huge part in America's pro-life shift. Ten states allow women to view ultrasound images of their preborn child before an abortion. "Technology has been a great assistance in humanizing the unborn," said Christian Brugger, a fellow at the Culture of Life Foundation. "Fetal imaging technology has shown us beyond question that the unborn is human life. As the information gets out, it's clear that those who are most educated on the issue go in the direction of pro-life. The heart of the next generation is not going to those who defend abortion. It's going to be life."

New Jersey Passes Hate-Crimes Bill

(EP News)--New Jersey lawmakers voted Jan. 7 to give transgendered individuals special rights. If Gov. Jon Corzine signs the legislation, the state would be the 12th to grant such strong rights. According to gay-activist groups, New Jersey has 153 laws to protect homosexuals and transgendered people.

The first section of the bill adds "gender identity or expression" to the existing hate-crimes law, which includes sexual orientation, race and religion. The bill also requires all new police officers to attend a mandatory, two-hour hate-crimes sensitivity training. "This par-

Wal-Mart's Pro-Family **Strategy Pays Off**

(EP News)--While other retailers saw their Christmas sales figures slip, Wal-Mart, the world's largest retailer, reported December sales rose 2.4 percent. There's a good reason for that, said Tom Minnery, senior vice president for government and public policy at Focus on the Family. "Wal-Mart isn't afraid to embrace the values embraced by most Americans," he said. "It's not hard to see why it's No. 1. The company's genius is in simply recognizing that The Salvation Army bell-ringers and the phrase 'Merry Christmas' are woven into the American fabric. "May a thousand companies do likewise next Christmas." Wal-Mart had come under fire from the Biblically-Responsible Investing Institute for pro-homosexual policies, including financial support for the Gay and Lesbian Chamber of Commerce. The criticism from the BRII, Focus on the Family, and other Christian organizations ultimately caused Wal-Mart to change its policies.

Study Shows Students Grow Spiritually During College

(EP News)--A study by UCLA shows the majority of U.S. college students experience spiritual growth during their time on campus. Researchers followed more than 14,000 freshmen through their junior year and found the students were more likely to be engaged in a spiritual quest, were more caring and showed higher levels of "equanimity and an ecumenical worldview." The study also revealed that, as freshmen, 41.8 percent of the students were interested in integrating spirituality into their lives. Three years later, 50.4 percent were actually engaged in that spiritual quest. "Student interest in spirituality and religion is at a level not seen since perhaps the 1950s," said Colgate University President Rebecca Chopp, a scholar of religion and American culture. "Religion and spirituality are important aspects of well-being and character development, and colleges need to support the growing interest and activities of our students."

Iowa Grandmother Jailed for Discouraging Abortion

Christian Newswire - In March. 2007, Donna Holman was convicted of a charge of "harassment" as she engaged in "sidewalk counseling" to discourage women from entering a Planned Parenthood abortion clinic in Iowa City, Iowa. Judge Karen Egerton found Mrs. Holman guilty on the hearsay testimony of Planned Parenthood employees. The woman Mrs. Holman allegedly harassed did not even show up for the hearing. Evangelist Arrested for Publicly Preaching to Halloween Revelers in Salem, Mass.

Christian Newswire - The Foundation for Moral Law, a non-profit, religious-liberties legal organization led by Judge Roy Moore, has agreed to represent Michael Marcavage of Repent America against the misdemeanor charges filed against him for preaching in a Salem, Mass. public square on Halloween night, Oct. 31, 2007. Even though Salem's laws allow the use of speech amplification until 10:00 p.m., Salem police officers on Halloween night confiscated Mr. Marcavage's megaphone at 8:30 p.m., threw him to the ground, and arrested him on

charges of allegedly violating the noise ordinance and "disorderly conduct"--all for calmly preaching the gospel to a large crowd of Halloween revelers.

About this case, Judge Moore said: "Michael Marcavage believes he is called by God to preach a message of repentance and forgiveness of sin. He is just as free to preach that message in Salem, Mass., as the Halloween party-goers are free to listen to, disagree with, or ignore him. Instead of protecting his rights to free speech and freedom of religion, however, the Salem

police decided to shut Mr. Marcavage up by unlawfully arresting and charging him. It seems that the days of "witch hunts" are not over in Salem."

Attorneys at the Foundation for Moral Law will vigorously defend Mr. Marcavage against the charges brought against him. The next court hearing in this case is scheduled in Salem District Court for January 23, 2008. If the case is not dismissed, a trial will most likely be scheduled within the next month or so.

ADF files suit against MA"buffer zone" law to squelch pro-life speech, but

Attorneys with the Alliance Defense Fund (ADF) filed a lawsuit in federal court Friday against a new Massachusetts law that creates a 35-foot "buffer" zone around abortion clinics. The law essentially eliminates free speech rights within the zone by restricting pro-life advocates from sharing their message with people entering the clinics.

"Pro-life advocates shouldn't be penalized for expressing their beliefs," said ADF-allied attorney and lead counsel Michael DePrimo. "The buffer zone law is breathtaking in scope. It obviously was designed and intended

outlandish restrictions on peaceful speech." "It's ironic that Massachusetts,

the 'cradle of liberty,' would pass a law that effectively creates a First Amendment-free zone that silences those who seek to share the truth about abortion," said ADF Legal Counsel Tim Chandler. "Those with pro-life views have the same First Amendment rights as anyone else in America."

On Nov. 13, Gov. Deval Patrick signed into law S.B. 1353 which created the "buffer" zone. Firsttime violators face a fine of up to \$500 and three months in jail. Repeat offenders face fines of up to \$5,000 and $2\frac{1}{2}$ years in prison.

ADF attorneys filed suit on behalf of several pro-life advocates whose ability to communicate peacefully with people entering the clinics has been severely compromised by the new law. In some instances, the new law leaves only about one foot of public sidewalk open to free speech, making it virtually impossible to engage in reasoned conversation.

grant such rights. The first section of the bill adds "gender identity or expression" to the existing hatecrimes law, which includes sexual orientation, race and religion. The bill also requires all new police officers to attend a mandatory, two-hour hate-crimes sensitivity training. The legislation also creates a Commission on Bullying in Schools, which has nine months to investigate and make recommendations to the governor. "New Jersey already has anti-bullying laws in place," Quinlan said, "but the bullying commission is set up to be totally sexually oriented."

Evangelical Leaders Pledge Common Cause with Islam

(EP News)--An attempt by leaders of the National Association of Evangelicals (NAE) to win friends and influence Muslims is generating controversy among NAE members. Islam expert Dr. Patrick Sookhdeo has called a statement signed by NAE leaders a "betrayal" and a "sellout." Dr. Albert Mohler, president of Southern Seminary (Southern Baptist), termed it "naiveté that borders on dishonesty." In November, NEA President Leith Anderson and NEA Vice President Richard Cizik signed onto a Christian response to an invitation to dialogue from 138 Muslim leaders around the world. Their response — initiated by Yale Divinity School and endorsed by other liberal Christian leaders

- apologized for the sins of Christians during the Crusades and for "excesses" of the global war on terror, without mentioning Muslim atrocities. It appeared to leave the fundamentals of Christianity - especially the deity of Christ open for discussion. Mohler said the agreement "sends the wrong signal" and contains basic theological problems, especially in "marginalizing" Jesus Christ. He also condemned the apology for the Crusades.

Bible put on a pinhead-size chip

This could

be the

smallest

Bible ever

printed

HAIFA, ISRAEL (ANS) -- Researchers in Israel say they have succeeded in putting a version of the Bible on a chip smaller than a

pinhead. According to the BBC, "Its 300,000 words in Hebrew were inscribed on a silicon surface at the Haifa Institute of Technology. "Scientists say the aim of the project is to increase young people's interest in nanoscience and nanotechnology."

The BBC story went on to say that the record for the smallest copy is held by a Bible measuring 2.8x3.4x1cm (1.1x1.3x0.4in), weighing 11.75g (0.4 ounces) and containing 1,514 pages.

The 0.5sq-mm (0.01sq-in) nano-Bible was written on a silicon surface covered with a thin layer of gold (20nanometres thick - 0.0002mm).

It was written using a device called

Focused Ion Beam (Fib). "When we send the particle beam toward a point on the surface, the gold atoms bounce off of this point, thus exposing the silicon layer underneath," Ohad Zohar, one of

> the project's managers at Technion, said. "By sending a particle beam towards various points on the substrate, we can etch any pattern of points, especially one that represents text."

are now coming in as a result of the Muslim clerics who protested the presence of Christian missions in Afghanistan, first reported by ANS on January 6.

"All missions web sites are being scrutinized and if they refer to any Christian activity, wherever it occurs, then visas are refused. This does not mean those doing evangelism, but just their presence is not wanted," writes a correspondent in-country who wished not to be named for security reasons.

"It may be a phase and restrictions relaxed at a later date or it may be a way of tightening up generally. Often governments must be seen to be acting and so these could just be temporary gestures," the writer says in an e-mail to ANS.

Christian presence, missionary activity, not wanted in Afghanistan

The writer says: "Christian money and expertise has gone a long way to rebuild the country, nurses, doctors and technicians have served the land well and, of course, soldiers of many nations have sought to bring safety for all. Schools have been built, hospitals, clinics, and many other developments have been the result of Christians serving the country."

The author continues: "An old Afghan proverb says 'bae laeq saeg daerya murdar naeme sae (waed)' which, loosely translated, means 'A river is not contaminated by having a dog drink from it.' Christians must maintain their good character in spite of any accusations."

The correspondent concludes: "The pacification of Helmand province is slowly taking place and suicide bombings have increased in Kabul itself as a result of Jihadists being pushed out. The modernization of Afghanistan is at stake and that process cannot be stopped. It will only lead to other pressures and realities taking place."

Compassion Projects Located at Center of Unrest in Kenya

COLORADO SPRINGS, COLORADO (ANS) -- About 500 people have died and 250,000 have been displaced from their homes in Kenya in violence that has erupted since a disputed presidential election Dec. 27. Compassion International, one of the world's largest Christian child-development organizations, has 29 projects at the center of the chaos.

According to a news release from Compassion, many of the centers are located in the slums - melting pots of tribal diversity - which place Compassion-assisted families in the middle of the violence. Compassion Kenya reported that hundreds of Compassion-assisted

families and children have been affected and whole communities have been displaced by the turmoil, as property has been destroyed, looted or vandalized.

Compassion Kenya said in a news release it is providing medical aid and counseling, while working with other agencies to help families who aren't part of a Compassion child development center. Compassion Kenya is also disbursing funds for relief supplies, including food and blankets. But 11 of the centers are currently inaccessible, with children and parents receiving support from the government and other agencies.

According to a news release, Compassion Kenya is working with its church partners to assess needs for additional support to include rebuilding of classrooms and houses, school supplies for children, and bedding and mattresses.

Compassion said it does not currently have a list of affected children as the situation has not stabilized. Operations at all the affected centers have been temporarily suspended.

Compassion International works with more than 800,000 children in 24 countries in Africa, Asia, Central and South America and the Caribbean. About 4,000 indigenous churches from more than 65 denominations partner with Compassion. For more information go to www.compassion.com

Car bomb explodes outside Iraqi church

MOSUL, IRAQ (ANS) -- A car bomb has exploded outside a church in the Iraqi city of Mosul on Thursday, January 17, where two persons were reported to be injured.

The motor vehicle carrying the explosive device was found parked outside the Chaldean Tahira church in western Mosul's al-Shifaa neighborhood had slightly injured a police officer and a little girl who were both wounded in the blast. No fatalities were recorded though the church building was damaged.

According to the www.christia ntoday.com web site, this was the second time the church was bombed after it closed down from the first attack. Around 10 days ago, a series of coordinated bomb attacks were carried out in both Mosul and Baghdad against Christian buildings such as churches and convents, in what a Chaldean bishop had described as a planned

attack to intimidate Christians into leaving the country.

This seemed to be working, according to the figures provided by Neal Youngquist, the International Services Director for Asia with Prison Fellowship International, who wrote the Christian community suffered a 50 percent decline in their population since the 1990s.

He said, "Consequently, the Christian community has decreased to some half million - a decrease of almost 50 percent since the 1990s. since June 2004 forty churches have been the targets of bomb attacks resulting in destruction, death and injury."

The Prime Minister of Iraq, Nouri Al-Maliki, has committed his government to protect the Christian community in the war-ravaged country, reported the Christian Today web site.

Early release from Hubei Labor Camp for three female House Church leaders

WUHAN, HUBBEI PROV-INCE, CHINA (ANS) -- In another stunning legal victory, three Chinese female house church leaders have been unconditionally released from their labor camp in Hubei province.

China Aid Association (CAA) says the decision was made at 4: 30 PM Beijing time on January 23, and follows on the heals of the January 11, appellate ruling to release four male house church leaders from their labor camp following dismissal of charges from government officials.

CAA says the church leaders were arrested and sentenced to 18 months and 12 months re-education through labor respectively on August 6, 2007 after they were detained on July 15 and accused of the "crime of engaging in organizing and making use of evil

cult organization to undermine the enforcement of State laws."

In an interview with one of the recently released male pastors, China Aid Association was told that the director of the Hubei labor camp made a formal apology to the house church leaders for their wrongful imprisonment.

Furthermore, the director went on to state that he and other officials had learned their lesson and would seek to do a better job in the future. He then expressed to the leaders that they should be patriotic and upright citizens.

The admonition from the director was easy to take for the leaders who find empowerment in their true Christian faith to be the best citizens they are able to be in society.

"The Chinese house church is

deeply committed to helping China realize the goal of becoming a 'Harmonious Society,'" said CAA's Bob Fu. "The released leaders expressed their gratitude to the labor camp officials for their willingness to discern true Christianity from common criminality and for setting a remarkable precedent of progression towards true religious freedom and rule of law in China."

The leaders are also thankful to the international community for their efforts and prayers during this time.

Sharp Escalation Along Gaza Border Taking Toll On Both Sides

(EP News)--More than 40 Kassam rockets and mortars rained down on the western Negev region on Jan. 16, as Hamas sought to exact revenge for Israel Defense Forces (IDF) operations in Gaza which killed 19 Palestinians, including at least 15 militants, among them the son of senior Hamas leader Mahmoud Zahar. The IDF killed Hussam Zahar, the son of ex-Hamas foreign minister Mahmoud Zahar, during an operation Jan. 15 to stop rocket launches into southern Israel. IDF troops killed ten more Palestinians when troops backed by tanks and helicopters ambushed rocket squads in northern Gaza. On Jan. 16, an Israel Air Force air strike killed two more Palestinians in a vehicle carrying a load of weapons in the central Gaza Strip, while earlier that day, three Palestinian civilians were killed in an IAF strike that targeted a car carrying a group of militants east of Gaza City. The air strike came shortly after Defense Minister Ehud Barak vowed that Israel would step up its military offensive on Gaza in response to the barrage of Kassam rockets on southern Israel, with at least 11 landing in Ashkelon and 12 in Sderot. Hamas has blamed the escalation on the visit of President George Bush to the region.

Australian Hotel Owner Pulls the Plug on Poker Machines

(EP News)--A Queensland, Australia, hotel owner has pulled the plug on his poker machines, saying he could no longer stand to watch patrons losing all their money and leaving in tears, Australia's Courier Mail reported. "In the end, I just couldn't stand it," said Scarborough Hotel owner Roger Okalyi. "The pokies (video gambling machines) just prey on people who can't afford to gamble. "I've seen people walking out in tears. They've got kids, and you're just hoping that they haven't done their weekly wage and will still be able to put food on the table." Chad Hills, analyst for gambling research and policy at Focus on the Family Action, said "Australia's had an opendoor policy toward gambling for years now, but this country can no longer hide the bodies," he said. "Pokies have devastated this country with addiction and broken lives. It's encouraging to see business owners care enough about their patrons to remove gambling from their premises. "Pokies are the crack cocaine of the gambling industry. No other form of gambling in history has been this addictive. U.S. citizens need to encourage local business owners to remove — or oppose - any video gambling machines on their property." Okalyi plans to replace the pokies room with a family games area.

Tony Blair converts to Catholicism

(EP News)--Former British prime minister Tony Blair has converted to Roman Catholicism. He was formally received into the Catholic church at a service on Dec. 21. "I am very glad to welcome Tony Blair into the Catholic Church," the cardinal said in a statement. "For a long time he has been a regular worshipper at Mass with his family, and in recent months he has been following a program of formation to prepare for his reception into full communion." Anglican Archbishop of Canterbury Rowan Williams, head of the 77-million member Anglican Communion, said, "Tony Blair has my prayers and good wishes as he takes this step in his Christian

Two IDF reservists murdered while hiking near Hebron

(EP News)--Two reservists in an elite Israel Defense Force (IDF) combat unit were killed by Palestinian gunmen Dec. 28 while hiking near Hebron. The IDF insists the killings were acts of terroism and not "criminally motivated," as claimed by the Palestinian Authority (PA). Both the al-Aksa Martyrs Brigades and Islamic Jihad quickly claimed responsibility for the attack, saying it was in retaliation for the IDF's killings of Palestinian militiamen in Gaza. The PA eventually took the assailants into custody, as they feared arrest by IDF forces conducting an intensive manhunt for them. After interrogation, PA offcials said the Palestinians attacked the two Israelis simply to steal their weapons. But the IDF is convinced the attack was carried out for "nationalist" reasons, and has revealed that two of the attackers are Fatah loyalists and one a member of the PA security

Winter frost hits Israel hard

(EP News)--A homeless woman was found dead from hypothermia on a bench in Bat Yam, a district of Tel Aviv, on Jan. 15. Similar incidents were reported on Jan. 13, when two people died from the cold in Beersheba -- a 40year old man, and a 78-year old woman. The Israeli Electric Company reports record high usage since temperatures in Israel have dipped below zero for four successive nights. Many homes in Israel are not equipped for cold weather, many families live below the poverty line, a number of invalids live alone, and homeless people roam streets in the larger cities. (EP News)--A media group in the United Kingdom has banned all personal-services advertisements from its publications over fears the ads could be linked to criminal activity.



MEN Media, a group of more than 20 daily and weekly newspapers, became concerned that if the advertisements were used for criminal activity, the media could be seen as profiting from a crime.

A U.S. pro-family group is using the news to encourage Americans to pressure local media to follow suit. Daniel Weiss, senior analyst of media and sexuality for Focus on the Family Action, agrees the media have a responsibility not to contribute to criminal and destructive behavior. He also encouraged concerned Americans to examine their local newspapers

"If these types of ads are present, contact these papers and find out if they have a policy concerning what kinds of ads they will accept," he said. "Then, kindly request they stop accepting ads that could contribute to criminal activity.

"This is the kind of activism that anyone can do and which can have a very positive outcome for their community. I would also encourage friends, family and churches to get involved."

Book Finds Missing Link Between Evolution, Racism

'Darwin's Plantation' Breaks New Ground in Study of Subject

the new Creation Museum, ministries that uphold the authority of the Bible from the very first verse. Ware is the president of Crossroads Bible College (training Christians to reach a multiethnic urban world) and a national leader in promoting multiethnic ministry.

With Darwin's birthday coming Feb. 12, and his 200th birthday and the 150th anniversary of the publication of "On the Origin of Species" little more than a year away, the time seems right for an accurate assessment of his legacy.

Ham and Ware show that although racism certainly did not begin with Darwin, his beliefs did more to fuel racism than the ideas of any other single individual. "Racism is a consequence of sin in a fallen world infused with evolutionary thinking," Ham writes.

The subtitle of Darwin's "Origin of Species" is "The Preservation of Favoured Races in the Struggle for Life." Darwin himself writes in "The Descent of Man" that he would rather be descended from a monkey than a "savage."

Even Stephen Jay Gould, the late leading evolutionist, agreed that the publication of "Origin of Species" had a negative impact on the discussion of racial issues. "Biological arguments for racism may have been common before 1859, but they increased by orders of magnitude following the acceptance of evolutionary theory," he wrote.

Ham and Ware note that evolutionary theory made its way to American shores during the time of the Civil War and the Emancipation Proclamation (the 1860s).

"Without the legal ability enforce slavery, many people turned to the theories of Darwin to justify racism in its many forms," the book says. "They began to use evolution as justification of their views that African-Americans were an inferior 'race' and

a 'sub- species' that was not really fully human and not deserving of fair and equal treatment."

Ham, originally from Australia, studied environmental biology at the Queensland Institute of Technology. He notes that the remains of perhaps 10,000 Aborigines, some slaughtered as "specimens," were shipped to Britain to prove that they were the "missing link."

Perhaps most tragically, Hitler used evolutionary thought to justify his concept of a "master race" and the extermination of the Jews and other so- called "inferior" groups of people.

"As soon as one believes that human beings have evolved from creatures of lesser intelligence, it is an easy corollary to assume that some people groups are more evolved than others," the book says.

Ultimately, though, the book is not about assigning blame. Instead, it sets out a Biblical blueprint for harmonious race relations. In fact, with man's history of racial conflict, the authors say that "GRACE (God's Reconciliation At Christ's Expense) relations" provides a much better model than race relations. This concept mirrors the teaching found in a compelling exhibit inside the Creation Museum on the origin of the different people groups.

Ware adds: "'Darwin's Plantation' presents the scientific and Scriptural case for the origin of

"I pray that each person who reads Rochelle's story will understand His message to us in times of personal tragedy, rejection, failure, and loss: 'I don't leave you at those times--I Am right here!' "says the author.

Through years of ever-spiraling poor choices and damaging behavior, Rochelle continues making serious mistakes and railing against God for everything that has gone wrong in her life, finally hitting rock bottom. Even her shallow attempts at faith end in increased bitterness.

In all, God never leaves, nor gives up on Rochelle. But can her wounded heart finally hear Him and fully embrace His love and peace?

The authors paint a picture of a world where churches are multiethnic and interracial marriage is no longer a problem. How can this happen? According to this book, it can only happen when Christians accept the Bible's truth that there is only one race - the human race (Acts 17:26; Genesis 1).

Answers in Genesis is a biblical apologetics ministry which conducts more than 300 teaching meetings each year, hosts an award-winning Web site and produces the "Answers" radio program heard on more than 900 stations throughout the United States. The high-tech Creation Museum, which opened in May, has seen over 300,000 visitors in less than eight months of operation.

Crossroads Bible College is a Christian undergraduate institution in Indianapolis whose particular concern is to train men and women of many cultural and ethnic backgrounds for effective roles in Christian service. "Tomorrow's generations of unbelievers will not be drawn to the church behind four walls, but to the church that is found serving in local food pantries, homeless shelters and hospices," said author Tom Ellsworth in his new book, Beyond Your Backyard: Stepping Out to Serve Others

(Standard Publishing, January 2008).

"We cannot do less than GO! Christians of all generations are called to demonstrate their love, share their faith and serve humanity...all for the privilege of introducing others to Jesus."

Ellsworth, who is also a successful

minister of a congregation of 2,500 In Bloomington, Indiana, peppers his easy-to-digest book with practical suggestions to make outreach approachable for Christians and churches of all types.

He uses the example of the old but still popular children's finger exercise from Sunday school in which you have to "open the doors" of the church to "see all the people."

"I still believe the two-fisted children's poem has value," Ellsworth comments. "But as we look to the future, I would suggest we teach a slightly modified poem to our kids: 'here's the church, here's the steeple: open the doors, and SEND OUT the people."

Using examples from the lives of those in the Bible, Ellsworth teaches his way through the principles of assisting others in our families, neighborhoods, communities, as well as nationally and internationally.

His encouragement applies equally

to the individual Christian as it does to a whole congregation.

"It is all too easy to become inward focused instead of outward focused, if we aren't careful," he explains. "Oh sure we are still passionate for the truth, we still desire to exalt Jesus Christ, and



we still long for the moment of his return. But in some ways we've lost the urgency of the GO! It is so easy to become satisfied to offer the invitation to COME. Anyone who makes it past the front doors is welcome."

Ellsworth's book will prompt thought and discus-

sion around a dinner table or at a small group, and a discussion guide for group study is also available.


"Identifying those who qualify as neighbors isn't difficult; determining how I should be a neighbor is the challenge," he concludes. "There is no time to waste. Faith factor seen in NFL conduct policy

PHOENIX (BP)--The National Football League has used an unstoppable combination of marketing muscle, longtime loyal-

ties and on-field performance to create the most successful professional sports league in America, if not the world.



Its annual season-ending showcase, Super Bowl XLII, on Sunday, Feb. 3, in Phoenix, has become secular sports' high holy day, drawing interest and global TV ratings on par with the Olympics and soccer's World Cup.

NFL officials, fearful highly publicized illegal and immoral behavior by some of the sport's biggest stars was jeopardizing the league's multi-billion-dollar success, instituted a new Personal Conduct Policy this spring.

The behavior policy, spearheaded by newly hired commissioner Roger Goodell, draws a clear line between right and wrong, and it says players may be punished for behavior that does not result in a legal conviction.

Among the incidents specifically mentioned in the new policy are gun violations, drinking and driving, domestic disputes and gang-related activities. The commissioner also cracked down

on NFL clubs' alcohol use by limiting or outlawing open beer and wine possession in locker rooms and other team facilities.

"It is important that the NFL be represented consistently by outstanding people as well as great football players, coaches and staff," Commissioner Goodell said. "We hold ourselves to higher standards of responsible conduct because of what it means to be part of the National Football League."

While the NFL has not specifically cited Christian principles, and league spokesman Brian McCarthy denied there was any method in place other than to see good behavior, some in the faith-based NFL community see it differently.

"There are absolutely Christian principles involved in all of this," said Don Davis, a former NFL linebacker and now the New England Patriots' team chaplain. "The league would never say

they're putting Christ first, but it's exactly the same thing if you look at their new rules.

"Those of us who are behind the scenes [have been]

on our knees about this," he added.

Former player and Chicago Bears chaplain Harry Swayne isn't sure what to make of the new policy and the NFL's heightened interest in mandating right and wrong for its players.

"Bad behavior is just bad business for the league," Swayne said. "Until the Lord changes a person's heart, a man won't get right by himself. This is a knee-jerk reaction and a small answer to a big problem. The problem is sin in a person's life."

New York Giants chaplain George McGovern said his team hasn't had a public lawbreaking scandal in nearly two years, partly because New York players have seen what's happened to once-bright stars such as Michael Vick and Adam "Pacman" Jones.

McGovern said another reason for the heightened emphasis on good behavior is the number of outspoken Christian coaches and players in today's NFL.

"They are certainly more outspoken about their faith than they were 35 or even 20 years ago," McGovern said. "I've had coaches personally tell me they are taking a bolder stand in their faith after

hearing [Indianapolis Colts head coach] Tony Dungy share his faith last year. He's a good example of a bold witness for Christ."

Davis, who played in the league 11 years, the last four with the New England Patriots, said it's been a gradual progression

star players sharing their faith in Jesus Christ publicly.

"First you had some like Reggie White who people respected, then you had Kurt Warner, then Shawn Alexander and Curtis Martin, guys who wanted to share their faith.

"Even the worldly player

has an overall sense of right and wrong," Davis said.

Goodell said the new conduct policy would continue into the coming years, and the league would not relent on its stand that players recognize the basic difference between right and wrong.

"We made it very clear what was

expected of players, coaches and anyone affiliated with the NFL." Goodell said. "That standard is clear. From our standpoint, people understand that. I think they are responding to that."

While Sunday's game will pit the history-seeking Patriots, looking

to become the NFL's first 19-0 team, against the upstart Giants, who have won three straight road playoff games to get here, the Super Bowl offers an entire week of faith-based activities and other opportunities for players to express their faith.





Basketball coach goes barefoot to provide shoes for the shoeless in Africa

Indianapolis, Indiana (ANS) - A staggering 110,000 pairs of shoes have so far been donated to Samaritan's Feet, a nonprofit, Christian-based charity that seeks to put shoes on 10 million people

throughout the world over a 10-year span. Ron Hunter, Head Basketball Coach at IUPUI (Indiana University, Purdue University



Four years ago, Manny left a lucrative marketing and supply chain job to start Samaritan's Feet, a 501c3 organization whose goal is to put 10 million pairs of shoes on children's feet in 10 years around the world.

According to the outreach's dedicated website, Manny is originally don't have a voice. I have from Nigeria and grew up very poor. He received his first pair of shoes at the age of 9 from a missionary, who also taught him how to play basketball. These shoes allowed him to run and play without getting hurt and helped him get better at sports, specifically basketball.

He started playing travel basketball during his childhood and eventually played high school basketball in Nigeria. God blessed him with the ability to play basketball at a high level and eventually earned a scholarship to play at the University of North Dakota - Lake Region.

While in school, Manny earned his bachelors and masters degrees. He had a chance to play basketball overseas, but he turned it down to

concentrate on his education. After graduation, he spent ten years in the logistics business until God called him to fulfill His plan for his life. Samaritan's Feet was formed in 2003 and four years later over 500,000 pairs of shoes have been donated.

> Coach Hunter was so moved by Manny's story that, after much thought and prayer, he decided

to coach in his bare feet for the IUPUI basketball game on January 24th against Oakland.

Why would he do this?

Hunter said: "Dr. Martin Luther King Day was January 21, 2008. Therefore, in recognition of what Dr. King did for our country, I want to honor his life by standing for the children around the world who always looked up to Dr. Martin Luther King and what he stood for. 2008 is the 40th anniversary of his death. I want to honor the late Dr. King by raising 40,000 pairs of shoes for children throughout the

world. There are hundreds of millions of children who don't have shoes. They suffer from diseases, infection and many other ailments because they don't have shoes to wear. Needless to say, they can't play sports without shoes. We have been given an incredible opportunity and platform as coaches to use our status as role models for others and help children in need."

Hunter added: "I am asking you to join me to accomplish the task of putting 40,000 pairs of shoes on children's feet. Give the children hope in our country and around the world by displaying courage in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King. He had courage, I know you do too."

According to www.Indystar.com, the internet presence of the Indianapolis Star newspaper, coach Hunter got his game victory, his pedicure and, as a bonus, more athletic shoes than he'll ever be able to carry to Africa in July. All on bare feet.

Hunter completed one of the most inspirational walks in this year's college basketball season by coaching Thursday night's game shoeless for children of impover-

ished homes.

An announced crowd of 1,059 were on hand at IUPUI Gymnasium for the 82-69 victory over Oakland and only a few of them went barefoot, but significantly more nationwide recognized Hunter's effort, the newspaper reported.

IUPUI announced that the Department of Homeland Security, which offered 10,000 pairs, told Samaritan's Feet to hang loose while officials determine how many

more shoes they can donate.

Hunter, who appeared on ESPN's top morning shows Thursday and was featured as ABC's Person of the Week Friday on "World News Tonight," was humbled by the response. His goal was 40,000 pairs of shoes, a figure symbolic of the 40th anniversary of the death of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. He had that many by lunch.

The newspaper reported that Soles4Souls, a Nashville, Tennessee-based charity, donated 40,000 pairs. Wal-Mart gave 25,000; Nine West, a women's shoe company, offered another 5,200. During Hunter's appearance on ESPN

Radio's "Mike & Mike in the Morning" show, a Converse representative joined the program and promised another 15,000.

Most were directly shipped to Charlotte, N.C., where Samaritan's Feet is based. Hunter's office took all it could hold, becoming an impromptu warehouse. An estimated 500 pairs arrived at the gym prior to the game. At one point in the afternoon, Hunter looked up to find 20 bags

of shoes dropped off. They came without a name, just a note that read, "Coach, hope this helps."

"When we started this I thought 40,000 was going to be tough," Hunter said. "When they told me before the game we already had 100,000, honestly, I almost broke down in tears." And, at that moment, he cried. "Imagine if every coach would pick a game to coach barefoot and use their influence," said Emmanuel 'Manny' Ohonme, a Nigerian who founded the charity four years ago. "We'd

exceed our goals pretty quickly.

"And we're getting e-mails every couple of minutes from people who want more information or to say they just bought a pair," he said. "Plus, there's all these high school coaches around the country who say they want to coach a game barefoot."

The newspaper noted for the record, Hunter's exposed feet weren't stepped on during the game and commented: "It bears noting that he almost never sits down when the action -- and the feet -- are flowing." "My feet hurt so bad," he said after the game. "But imagine a child or a human going their whole lives without shoes."

Hunter, 43, said his month-long association with Samaritan's Feet has already affected him, and he knows it could be on the verge of changing the lives of others, the newspaper said. Several of his players have vowed to join him on the summer trip, which he'd like to take to Cameroon, home to Jaguars freshman guard Christian Siakam. In Siakam's family, shoes are a luxury; not everyone has them.

Now, a man with no ties to IUPUI has offered to charter a jet to fly the team to Africa, pending NCAA approval, of course. "I knew when I saw Siakam's face we were doing the right thing," Hunter said.

evil, no devil, and that God is "in" everyone and everything. A Course in Miracles teaches its students to rethink everything they believe about God and life. The Course

Workbook bluntly states: "This is a course in mind training"5 and is dedicated "thought reversal."6

Teaching A Course Miracles will be Oprah's longtime friend and special XM Satellite Radio reporter Marianne William-

son—who also happens to be one of today's premier New Age leaders. She and Conversations with God author Neale Donald Walsch co-founded the American Renaissance Alliance in 1997, that later became the Global Renaissance Alliance of New Age leaders, that changed its name again in 2005 to the Peace Alliance. This Peace Alliance seeks to usher in an era of global peace founded on the principles of a New Age/New Spirituality that they are now referring to as a "civil rights movement for the soul."7 They all agree that the principles of this New Age/New Spirituality are clearly articulated in A Course in Miracles-which is fast becoming the New Age Bible. So what is A Course in *Miracles* and what does it teach?

MIDLIFE

A Course in Miracles is allegedly "new revelation" from "Jesus" to help humanity work through these troubled times. This "Jesus"—who bears no doctrinal resemblance to the Bible's Jesus Christ-began delivering his channeled teachings in 1965 to a Columbia University Professor of Medical Psychology by the name of Helen Schucman.

> As a former New Age follower and devoted student of A Course in Miracles, I eventually discovered that the Course in Miracles was-in reality—the truth of the Bible turned upside down. Not having a true understanding

of the Bible at the time of my involvement, I was led to believe that A Course in Miracles was "a gift from God" to help everyone understand the "real" meaning of the Bible and to help bring peace to the world. Little did I know that the New Age "Christ" and the New Age teachings of A Course in *Miracles* were everything the real Jesus Christ warned us to watch out for. In Matthew 24 Jesus warned about false teachers, false teachings and the false "Christs" who would pretend to be Him.

When I left the New Age "Christ" to follow the Bible's Jesus Christ, I had come to understand that the "Jesus" of A Course in Miracles was a false "Christ," and that his Course in Miracles was dangerously deceptive. Here are some quotes from the "Jesus" of A Course in Miracles:

• "The recognition of God is the recognition of yourself."15

- "The oneness of the Creator and the creation is your wholeness, your sanity and your limitless power."16
- "The Atonement is the final lesson he [man] need learn, for it teaches him that, never having sinned, he has no need of salvation."17

Most Christians recognize that these teachings are the opposite of what the Bible teaches. In the Bible, Jesus Christ's atoning death on the cross of Calvary was hardly a "useless journey." His triumph on the cross provides salvation to all those who confess their sin, accept Him and follow Him as their Lord and Saviour. His victory on the cross rings throughout the New Testament. 

that she had already bought a thousand copies and would be handing them out to everyone in her studio audience. Oprah's endorsement skyrocketed Williamson's book about A Course in Miracles to the top of the New York Times bestseller list. Ironically, all of this was happening after I had left the Course and the New Age. In fact, I was doing the final editing on my book "The Light That Was Dark" that warned about the dangers of

the New Age—and in particular

A Course in Miracles.

After being introduced to the world on Oprah, Marianne Williamson has continued to grow in popularity and, as previously mentioned, has become one of



Listeners are encouraged to buy A Course in Miracles for the year-long course. An audio version of A Course in Miracles recited by Richard (John Boy Walton) Thomas is also available on compact disc.

Popular author Wayne Dyer told his PBS television audience that the "brilliant writing" of A Course in Miracles would produce more peace in the world.21 Williamson's New Age colleague, Neale Donald Walsch, said his "God" stated that "the era of the Single Saviour is over"22 and that he ("God") was responsible for authoring the teachings of A Course in Miracles.23







The FDA Is Sued

The New Year brings a surprise for the FDA – a lawsuit filed by Public Citizen seeking to force the FDA to do its pretended job of protecting American citizens from the dangers of drugs. Of course, the real FDA job, as prioritized by top FDA management, is to protect the sales of Big Pharma and create new market opportunities for Big Pharma and Big Biotech

while using Americans for experimental purposes.

Public Citizen had petitioned the FDA for a clear black box warning, rather than a warning buried deep in the fine print that no person fighting an illness would have the energy to read. The FDA refused to force the drug companies to make the warning clear, knowing that such a warning would reduce sales of the drugs and open the companies to lawsuits by those who have been injured.

Now the FDA will get a chance to defend its pro Big Pharma anti-American position in court. Happy New Year, FDA. Hopefully this is the start of a new trend.

Spotlight Shines on Ineptitude of Medical Sinus Treatments

The *Journal of the American Medical Association* has just published a double-blind, randomized, placebo-controlled study showing

that the use of antibiotics and nasal steroids is ineffective at treating sinusitis.

Each year there are 25 million visits to a doctor in the United States to treat sinus problems; the overwhelming majority are viral in nature. Despite repeated warnings of germ resistance from antibiotic prescription overuse, U.S. physicians still prescribe an antibiotic at least 85 percent of the time. Epidemic Feared - 'Gays' May Spread Deadly Staph Infection to General Population

WASHINGTON, Christian Newswire - Reuters has reported that, "A drug-resistant strain of potentially deadly bacteria has moved beyond the borders of U.S. hospitals and is being transmitted among gay men during sex, researchers said on Monday.

"They said methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus, or MRSA, is beginning to appear outside hospitals in San Francisco, Boston, New York and Los Angeles."

"'Once this reaches the general population, it will be truly unstoppable,' said Binh Diep, a researcher at the University of California, San Francisco who led the study."

According to the study, at this point, homosexual men are 13 times more likely to contract the potentially deadly, drug-resistant strain of staph infection, but the fear is that, because the infection is spread via skin-to-skin contact,

homosexual men may soon spread it to the general population.

Experience winter veggies while you can

I dedicate this column to neglected seasonal vegetables. Most home cooks pass on these because they don't know what to do with them. It's intimidating to tackle a strange ingredient, even though most winter vegetables are simple to prepare. Leeks, turnips, rutabagas, beets, Brussels sprouts, parsnips and kohlrabi can be steamed and eaten with a sprinkle of salt and pepper or drizzle of extra-virgin olive oil or melted butter. However, here are additional ways to enjoy these and more of my favorite winter treats.

BEETS

- Prep: If you've never tried fresh beets you are in for something special. Boil them in salted water about 10 minutes. Remove them and let cool or plunge into cold water to cool immediately. Rub off their skins with a kitchen towel that you don't really want as it will be dyed bright red. Or use a pan sponge that has a slightly abrasive surface. If peeling raw beets, wear plastic gloves and peel with a vegetable peeler. Then you can grate them for salads.
- Cook: After boiling and peeling, cut into wedges and place in a baking dish. Add a splash of orange juice and a drizzle of honey or maple syrup. Bake in a 375-degree oven about 20 minutes until tender. Season with salt and pepper.

BRUSSELS SPROUTS

- **Prep:** Cut the stem end off and then cut a cross into the bottom with a paring knife, which allows them to cook quickly. Remove the outer leaves from the sprouts.
- Cook: Cook in boiling water until almost tender; drain. Heat a mixture of olive oil and a bit of butter in a skillet over medium heat. Saute the par-cooked sprouts until golden. Season with salt and pepper and toss with some chopped scallions or chives.

KOHLRABI

- **Prep:** Peel tough outer skin with a sharp paring knife. Slice or shred the remaining tender bulb.
- Cook: Kohlrabi is sweet and can be eaten raw in salads. It is also wonderful sauteed in olive oil with fresh dill and lemon.

LEEKS

• **Prep:** They are always very sandy so the key to enjoying leeks is proper cleaning. Cut off the top 6 inches of dark green leaves and the bottom root end; discard. Either slice the remaining leek in 1/2-inch-thick discs and rinse well in several changes of water or cut in half lengthwise and rinse each

layer of leaves until all the sand is removed.

• Cook: Leeks are delicious sauteed in butter or olive oil until caramelized. They can be sauteed with diced tomatoes until a thick sauce or ragu forms. This leek ragu is good over rice, pasta or grilled vegetables.

PARSNIPS

- **Prep:** Peel as you would a carrot and slice into 1/2-inch-thick discs or quarter lengthwise and then cut into 2-inch lengths.
- Cook: Parsnips are great boiled with potatoes and mashed with butter, salt, pepper and a pinch nutmeg. I also like them roasted along with other root vegetables. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Toss the cut parsnips with olive oil, salt, pepper and any chopped herbs. Place in a roasting pan and roast 45 minutes until tender and golden.

RADISHES

- **Prep:** Wash them well then snip off both ends and slice thinly.
- Cook: I don't cook these but find that the classic way to eat them is delicious: Put them on bread with sweet butter and a sprinkle of salt. I also like them tossed with Asian sesame oil, tamari and rice vinegar.

RUTABAGAS

- **Prep:** Rutabagas come waxed and are difficult to peel. Cut off both ends first so the rutabaga sits flat on a cutting board. With a sharp knife, cut from top to bottom under the skin and wax. After peeling, cut into 1-inch chunks or small wedges.
- Cook: Roasting rutabagas brings out their natural sugars. Roast the chunks or wedges following the instructions for roasting parsnips.

TURNIPS

- **Prep:** Peel and dice into large cubes, shred or slice thinly.
- Cook: Simply boil them in salted water, drain them and add some butter to serve. But my favorite method is to cook them with an equal amount of peeled potatoes. When the turnips and potatoes are tender, drain and mash them, adding some warm milk and a pat of butter or some olive oil and a sprinkling of salt, pepper and nutmeg. They are like supercharged mashed potatoes.

"Behold, the days come, saith the Lord GOD, that I will send a famine in the land, not a famine of bread, nor a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the LORD: And they shall wander from sea to sea, and from the north even to the east, they shall run to and fro to seek the word of the LORD, and shall not find it." -- Amos 8:

America is dying from malnutrition. How long can a people survive eating junk-food? I turn on the TV or radio and listen to the sugar being fed to the listeners and I nearly fall into a diabetic coma.

I expect this type of "preaching" from Dr. Phil, or Oprah, or a myriad of "pychobabalists" who dot the world of plasma TV's. But it is tragic that the best selling Christian books in America today happen to be of this ilk. "Self-help Christianity" (Your Best Life Now, Purpose Driven Life, Becoming a Better You) has replaced the Bible as the most popular reading among church-going folks. Instead of meat, church-goers are eating candy. Is it any wonder our nation is in the condition it is in?

I'm sure the temptation is great for pastors. How can a man watch Mr. Osteen with his 30,000 The Good Rews TODAY

member congregation, worldwide television ministry, and cadre of best selling books and not be envious? Rick Warren sold millions of "Purpose Driven" books. Pastors and church leaders adopted the resources as a means of training their flocks to a more "successful" Christian-life. Like an infant crying for milk in the middle of the night American's are squealing for food. As harsh as it may sound, and as judgmental as you may like to think I am, the Truth is, instead of feeding God's children milk, and eventually meat, our peoplepleasing pulpiteers have served up a steady diet of sugar-water.

America's pulpits have caused spiritual diabetes to destroy the church. If we are to regain our spiritual-health our pastors must once again preach the Word not a warmed-over plate of "Christian maple syrup." It is our only hope. Why is the preaching of the word so important?

The Word restores the authority of God into the lives of people. Whenever anything is substituted for the Word, God's authority over souls is usurped. The Word of God does not need the dime-store psychology of man to enhance It's power. Can you think of anything more disrespectful of God than to use anything besides His Word when feeding his sheep? Do you love me? FEED MY SHEEP! Stop passing out candy!

The Word reinforces Jesus as the ultimate authority in the church. The purpose of the advent of Christ was the annihilation of sin. The appearement of sin by the modern "cotton candy dispensers" has caused the Gospel to be compromised and the power to destroy sin is minimized. The direct result is a taking of the Name of the Lord in vain. Jesus came to deliver us from evil, not make us comfortable rubbing shoulders with it. It keeps the nation on course.

The Word introduces people to their One True source of help. Failure to preach the Word robs us of the ability to submit to Divine Authority. Would you seek a Savior if you didn't know you needed one? Today's "easy-believism" is convincing folks to trade what they cannot earn to accumulate what they cannot keep. Those in the church are seeking the same things as the pagans seek....and they think Jesus will help them get it. I've never seen a Brink's truck following a hearse.

- Heart Disease. (Where your heart is, there shall your treasure
- Kidney Disease. (Eliminates the impurities from the body.)
- Blindness (Israel's Watchmen are blind. Isaiah 56:10)
- Nerve Damage (The inability to feel and react to stimuli.)

• Impotence (The Gospel is the Power....no Gospel, no power. Romans 1:16))

The battle for the culture will be won in the pews. Judgment must first begin in the house of God. "Preach the word; be instant in season, out of season; reprove, rebuke, exhort with all long suf*fering and doctrine.*" 2 Timothy 4: 2 Reprove and rebuke. Those are harsh words. SHOUT BALL (youth ministry tip)

One of the most important things we can learn about a person is their name. One way to remember a person's name is to hear it repeated several times. Shout Ball requires us to repeat and therefore remember names.

To play Shout Ball you need: Bibles, Bible concordances, several soft balls, copier paper, self-stick name badges and pens.

Instruct the students to write their name on a badge and wear it in plain sight. Gather the children in a circle and hand a ball to one child. The child is to yell the name of a person on the other side of the

circle and throw them the ball. Each child is to repeat this until every young person has caught the ball.

Tell the students that they did a good job so far, but now they will play the game at the advanced level. Pass out several balls and instruct them to play the same game with several balls going at once. As the game progresses,

encourage them to play faster and faster until everyone is confused.

Break the young people up into several teams and ask them to sit together. Distribute Bibles and concordances and instruct each group to make a list of peoples' names from the Bible. After a set period of

time everyone must stop. Allow each group time to read their list of names, and share the total number of names they found. (Some of the pronunciations could be quite interesting!) The group with the most names wins! You may wish to distribute pieces of wrapped candy or some other small items for prizes.

Explain to your students that peoples' names are important and we should do our best to learn them. Remind your students that God knows our names and everything else about us. Remind them that God knows them, cares for them and loves them very much. Some Bible passages you may wish to share with your students include: John 3:16, Psalm 23, Psalm 46:1, Psalm 50:15, Isaiah 40:31, Joshua 1:9, Psalm

27:1, and Psalm 121:2.

St. Valentine, The Real Story

Flowers, candy, red hearts and romance. That's what Valentine's day is all about, right? Well, maybe not.

The origin of this holiday for the expression of love really isn't romantic at all -- at least not in the traditional sense. Father Frank O'Gara of Whitefriars Street Church in Dublin, Ireland, tells the real story of the man behind the holiday -- St. Valentine.

"He was a Roman Priest at a time when there was an emperor called Claudias who persecuted the church at that particular time," Father O'Gara explains. "He also had an edict that prohibited the marriage of young people. This was based on the hypothesis that unmarried soldiers fought better than married soldiers because married soldiers might be afraid of what might happen to them or their wives or families if they died."

"I think we must bear in mind that it was a very permissive society in which Valentine lived," says Father O'Gara. "Polygamy would have been much more popular than just one woman and one man living together. And yet some of them seemed to be attracted to Christian faith. But obviously the church thought that marriage was very sacred between one man and one woman for their life and that it was to be encouraged. And so it immediately

presented the problem to the Christian

Valentine was eventually caught, imprisoned and tortured for performing marriage ceremonies against command of Emperor Claudius the second. There are legends surrounding Valentine's actions while in prison.

"One of the men who was to judge him in line with the Roman law at the time was a man called Asterius, who's daughter was blind. He was supposed to have prayed with and healed the young girl with such astonishing effect that Asterius himself became Christian

In the year 269 AD, Valentine was sentenced to a three part execution

of a beating, stoning, and finally decapitation all because of his stand for Christian marriage. The story goes that the last words he wrote were in a note to Asterius' daughter. He inspired today's romantic missives by signing it, "from your Valentine."

"What Valentine means to me as a priest," explains Father O'Gara, "is that there comes a time where you have to lay your life upon the line for what you believe. And with the power of the Holy Spirit we can do that --even to the point of death."

Valentine's martyrdom has not gone unnoticed by the general public. In fact, Whitefriars Street Church is one of three churches that claim to house the remains of Valentine. Today, many people make the pilgrimage to the church to honor the courage and memory of this Christian saint.

"Valentine has come to be known as the patron saint of lovers. Before

you enter into a Christian marriage you want some sense of God in your life -- some great need of God in your life. And we know, particularly in the modern world, many people are meeting God through his Son, Jesus Christ. If Valentine were here today, he would say to married couples that there comes a time where you're going to have to suffer. It's not going to be easy to maintain your commitment and your vows in marriage. Don't be surprised if the "gushing" love that you have for someone changes to something less "gushing" but maybe much more mature. And the question is, will this young person be ready

"So on the day of the marriage they have to take that into context," Father O'Gara says. "Love -- human love and sexuality is wonderful, and blessed by God -- but also the shadow of the cross. That's what Valentine means to me."

Isat, with two friends, in the picture window of a quaint restaurant just off the corner of the town-square. The food and the company were both especially good that day. As we talked, my attention was drawn outside, across the street. There, walking into town, was a man who appeared to be carrying all his worldly goods on his back. We continued with our meal, but his image lingered in my mind. We finished our meal and went our separate ways. I had errands to do and quickly set out to accomplish them. I glanced toward the town square, looking somewhat halfheartedly for the strange visitor. I was fearful, knowing that seeing him again would call some response. I drove through town and saw nothing of him. I made some purchases at a store and got back in my car.

Deep within me, the Spirit of God kept speaking to me: "Don't go back to the office until you've at least driven once more around the square." Then with some hesitancy, I headed back into town. As I turned the square's third corner, I saw him. He was standing on the steps of the store front church, going through his sack.

I stopped and looked; feeling both compelled to speak to him, yet wanting to drive on. The empty parking space on the corner seemed to be a sign from God: an invitation to park. I pulled in, got out and approached the town's newest visitor.

"Looking for the pastor?" I asked. "Not really," he replied, "just resting." "Have you eaten today?" "Oh, I ate something early this morn-

ing." "Would you like to have lunch with me?" "Do you have some work I could do for you?" "No work," I replied. "I commute here to work from the city, but I would like to take you to lunch." "Sure," he replied with a smile.

As he began to gather his things, I asked some surface questions. Where you headed?" "St. Louis." "Where you from?" "Oh, all over; mostly Florida." "How long you been walking?" "Fourteen years," came the reply.

I knew I had met someone unusual. We sat across from each other in the same restaurant I had left earlier. His face was weathered slightly beyond his 38 years. His eyes were dark yet clear, and he spoke with an eloquence and articulation that was

startling. He removed his jacket to reveal a bright red T-shirt that said, "Jesus is The Never Ending Story."

Then Daniel's story began to unfold. He had seen rough times early in life. He'd made some wrong choices and reaped the consequences. Fourteen years earlier, while backpacking across the country, he had stopped on the beach in Daytona. He tried to hire on with some men who were putting up a large tent and some equipment. A concert, he thought.

He was hired, but the tent would not house a concert but revival services, and in those services he saw life more clearly. He gave his life over to God. "Nothing's been the same since," he said, "I felt the Lord telling me to keep walking, and so I did, some 14 years now."

"Ever think of stopping?" I asked. "Oh, once in a while, when it seems to get the best of me But God has given me this calling. I give out Bibles. That's what's in my sack. I work to buy food and Bibles, and I give them out when His Spirit leads."

I sat amazed. My homeless friend was not homeless. He

was on a mission and lived this way by choice. The question burned inside for a moment and then I asked: "What's it like?" "What?" "To walk into a town carrying all your things on your back and to show your sign?"

"Oh, it was humiliating at first. People would stare and make comments. Once someone tossed a piece of half-eaten bread and made a gesture that certainly didn't make me feel welcome. But then it became humbling to realize that God was using me to touch lives and change people's concepts of

My concept was changing, too. We finished our dessert and gathered his things. Just outside the door, he paused. He turned to me and said, "Come Ye blessed of my Father and inherit the kingdom I've prepared for

other folks like me."

you. For when I was hungry you gave me food, when I was thirsty you gave me drink, a stranger and you took me in."

I felt as if we were on holy ground. "Could you use another Bible?" I asked. He said he preferred a certain translation. It traveled well and was not too heavy. It was also his personal favorite. "I've read through it 14 times," he said.

"I'm not sure we've got one of those, but let's stop by our church and see" I was able to find my new friend a Bible that would do well, and he seemed very grateful. "Where are you headed from here?" I asked. "Well, I found this little map on the back of this amusement park coupon." "Are you hoping to hire on there for awhile?" "No, I just figure I should go there. I figure someone under that star right there needs a Bible, so that's where I'm going next."

He smiled, and the warmth of his spirit radiated the sincerity of his mission. I drove him back to the town-square where we'd met two hours earlier, and as we drove, it started raining. We parked and unloaded his things. "Would you sign my autograph book?" he asked. "I like to keep messages from folks I meet."

I wrote in his little book that his commitment to his calling had touched my life. I encouraged him to stay strong. And I left him with a verse of scripture from Jeremiah, "I know the plans I have for you, declared the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you; Plans to give you a future and a hope."

"Thanks, man," he said. "I know we just met and we're really just strangers, but I love you." "I know," I said, "I love you, too." "The Lord is good!" "Yes, He is. How long has it been since someone hugged you?" I asked. "A long time," he replied

And so on the busy street corner in the drizzling rain, my new friend and I embraced, and I felt deep inside that I had been changed. He put his things on his back, smiled his winning smile and said, "See you in the New Jerusalem." "I'll be there!" was my reply.

He began his journey again. He headed away with his sign dangling from his bedroll and pack of Bibles. He stopped, turned and said, "When you see something that makes you think of me, will you pray for me?" "You bet," I shouted back, "God bless." "God bless." And that was the last I saw of him.



Why Are Ron Paul's Supporters So Angry?

In addition, Ron Paul's own party continues to treat him and his supporters as secondclass citizens--or perhaps even as aliens from a different planet. They are subjected to insults of every type. Not to mention enduring every conceivable method to censure or remove Dr. Paul from the political process. He has been denied access to platforms, excluded from debates, removed from GOP Presidential lists, etc., ad infinitum, ad nauseam.

I say again: if anyone has a right to be angry, it is Ron Paul supporters. But perhaps the greater question is, Why are not all of us angry? No, I do not mean in a cruel or unkind way, but where is our outrage for what the ruling elite are doing to our country?

We should all be angry at the way politicians lie to us, deceive us, and manipulate us. We should all be angry at the way both major parties have completely ignored and trampled constitutional government.

In addition, I can even understand whatever anger and exasperation Ron Paul's supporters feel regarding my fellow evangelical believers. Today's Christians--and especially our pastors--have become little more than toadies for the establishment elite. They apparently have never read our U.S. Constitution, Declaration of Independence, or Bill of Rights. They are seemingly oblivious to our great American history and heritage. They seem to lack the most elementary understanding of even the most basic American principles.


