So please attend all these opportunities during the year as well as informally to develop a STRONG LEARNING PARTNERSHIP with us and your child.

MEET THE TEACHER EVENING WEDNESDAY 8 February is very important for all families to have representation. This is an opportunity to come along to school and hear about what we are all about here at Baverstock Oaks. It is also a chance to sit in the chair your child sits in during the day, meet their teacher and hear about a typical day, homework expectations and to hear about your part as a parent in educating your child.

This year we have kept the school donations and activity fees the same as 2011. School donations are \$180 per child for the year with no more than \$400 for a family. The activity fee is \$90 per child for the year. The activity fee includes a HUGELY discounted rate for your child to have 365 days access to their own Mathletics page. This would cost you \$90 for the year as a home subscriber, but costs \$20 per child if everyone in the school subscribes. Mathletics will be set for homework as well as used in class time.

Thanks again for taking the time to be part of our learning journey. We hope to see you all at various times over the year helping where you can.

PARENTING COURSE OFFER....

The **Triple P Research Group** at the University of Auckland is investigating the effectiveness of a new version of the Triple P – Positive Parenting Group Programme. The programme aims to enable fathers and mothers to develop positive relationships with their child and manage children's behaviour in a constructive way.



We are looking for parents of a child aged between **3-8 years** who want to enhance their child's development and who have some concerns about their child's behaviour

What does participation involve?

- Both fathers and mothers from each family will attend five 2 hour group sessions and three 20 minute telephone consultations over eight consecutive weeks. The programme will be delivered by a trained Triple P practitioner.
- Group sessions will be held in convenient community locations in Auckland
- Both parents will complete questionnaires at **three time periods**.

The programme is completely **free of charge** and includes helpful materials for you to keep.

Why school attendance is SO important....

Student attendance along with effective teaching has the greatest influence on student engagement and achievement. All students must be present at school so they can engage in learning. If a student misses five days each term or one day a fortnight they will miss the equivalent of one year of school over 10 years. We monitor your child's attendance each term and have been advised by Attendance Services that if a child who has an attendance rate lower than 94% their parents need to be contacted in writing. If low attendance occurs the Attendance Services will be contacted and they will work with you to ensure your child attends school regularly. We will also be monitoring your



child's punctuality as this greatly influences their ability to settle into school each morning and be prepared for learning each day. Both attendance and punctuality will be reported on in the mid year and end of year formal reports. Overseas trips in school time will affect your child's attendance rate and therefore we would appreciate it if trips could be booked during the 12 weeks holiday your child receives each year.
