Week 1 Term 2

Dear Parents & Caregivers of Baverstock Oaks School

I hope you and your family have enjoyed the golden weather we experienced over this holiday break. It has been a great time for everyone to get outside and be active in the great outdoors. I know our year 6 team are keeping their fingers crossed for this weather to last for camp in week 3.

Term 2 opens with more new five year old children starting school. We welcome these new students and families to Baverstock Oaks. We also welcome Mrs Fiona Blest tour school. She is teaching in Room 18 and I know the children are looking forward to a great term of learning. Welcome back also to Mrs Jude Parkes who returns from leave for the last 3 terms.

Board of Trustee elections are nearly upon us. Nominations close this Friday and we will then find out whether we are having an election. I look forward to assisting the new board to transition into their role of governance of our great school.

Term 2 is normally a time of committed learning and growth. Students have settled well into the year, know what their goals are, have identified their next learning steps and the adults in their lives, teachers and parents, are aware of how to support their learning. I hope you have taken the time over the break to have your child/ren share their portfolio with you and explain their learning. I also hope you have written them some feedback about their learning and their progress towards their goals. This is all part of being in a learning partnership with your child. This is very much in line with two of our values - The Power of thinking and reflection & Questions, feedback and feed-forward.

Many thanks to those parents who completed our term I survey on how effective you feel our reporting process is. We had 373 and considering we have 406 families at our school this was an exceptional return. The following reporting processes scored above 80% in being effective as a way of reporting student progress to parents:

- Meet the teacher
- Parent Teacher Interviews
- Portfolios
- Written Reports
- Informal Communications

The form of reporting you found the least effective was Student Led Conferences, however many noted it depended on the child and the teacher. We are working on more development around this as it should be very effective and we hope you see much improvement later this term. It is shown very strongly in the research that a student knowing what they are learning, why they are learning it, and what their next steps are which creates very self driven, motivated and committed learners.

68% of our parents were aware of things they could do at home to support their child in their learning, 20% were neutral and 12% were unaware of how they could support their children at home in their learning.

58% of the parents believed that their child was aware of their learning process and what their next steps in their learning are, 30% were neutral and 12% felt their child was unaware of their learning process and the next learning steps.

Parents were asked if they knew what the expectation is of where their child should be for their age on reading, writing and mathematics:

Reading 61% aware 34% unaware

Writing 51% aware 44% unaware

Mathematics 48% aware 48% unaware

We will look at the feedback you provided us and make the necessary adjustments to ensure we create an effective reporting process that gives you a clear indication of how well your child is achieving. Thank you so much for your feedback.

Well it is into our new term of learning. Have you asked yourself how you can become more involved in learning partnerships within our school? We hope to see many of you at the next FAB meeting next week or involved in the various activities on offer this term.
