Morris Williams

Since 1967 the Morris Williams Intercollegiate has been one of the top collegiate tournaments in the nation, consistently playing host to the best teams and individuals in college golf.

For the seventh consecutive year, Austin Country Club plays host to the annual tournament, providing a challenging setting for the two-day event.

Austin Country Club is home to former Longhorns greats Harvey Penick, Tom Kite and Bob Estes. Head Coach John Fields will again

serve as tournament director, but the contribution of numerous volunteers and UT golf supporters will help make the tournament a success.

Individual champions of the Morris Williams Intercollegiate include Ben Crenshaw, Fred Couples, Payne Stewart, Bob Estes, Justin Leonard and Brad Elder.

The Morris Williams Intercollegiate is dedicated to the memory of former University of Texas golf star Morris Williams, Jr., who died in a jet plane crash while in the Air Force in 1953.

An Austin native, Williams became the city's youngest junior champion at age 13 and dominated the local golf scene for the next several years. He starred on the Longhorn teams from 1947-50 and led Texas to Southwest Conference championships in 1947, 1948 and 1950. In his final year (1950), Williams was runner-up in the NCAA Championship as the 'Horns finished second in the team competition.

Upon graduation, Williams joined the Air Force and posted an undefeated record in service golf tournaments. It was shortly after his victory in the Worldwide Air Force Championship that he was killed.

The Harvey Penick Intercollegiate Tournament (1971-96)

In 1971 coach George Hannon created an annual fall tournament hosted by The University of Texas and named in honor of former coach Harvey Penick. The final Harvey Penick Intercollegiate was played in 1996 at the Morris Williams Golf Course and ended with Texas taking home the team trophy for the 11th time in 26 years.

Some of college golf's greatest players have graced the links at the Harvey Penick Intercollegiate, including former Texas medalists Ben Censhaw, Tom Kite, Omar Uresti, Mark Brooks, Bob Estes and Justin Leonard.

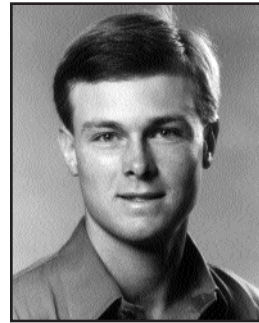

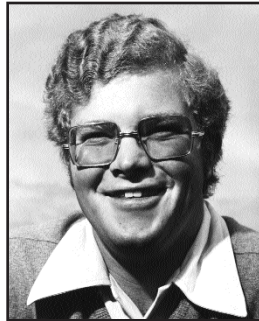
