## From the Rabbi's Study

The festival of *Purim* is often referred to as one of the minor holidays of the Jewish calendar year. It doesn't share the same *Torah* pedigree as *Shabbat*, the High Holy Days or the three Pilgrimage Festivals. While *Purim* comes with its own set of *mitzvot*, including reading the *Megillah*, the *Purim Seudah* (feast), exchanging gifts of baked goods and



giving *tzedakah*, it lacks the intricate ritual choreography and grandeur of the other Holy Days. *Hallel* is not even recited on that day, as it is throughout *Hanukkah*, because when all was said and done, the saved Persian Jews still remained in exile, living subject to the whims of Ahashverosh and his successors.

In reflecting upon the nature of *Purim*, I think it is appropriate to label it a "minor holiday," but not for the reasons mentioned above, Looking at the Megillah it becomes clear that the salvation recorded in this tale unfolds through a series of relatively minor events: a queen who just decides not to appear before a horde of feasting nobles; a charming Jewish girl, passing as a Persian, happens to be chosen as her successor; a Jewish notable, who is about to run afoul of Persia's viceroy, stumbles upon an assassination plot and has it reported; a king struck by insomnia years later is reminded of that event when his attendants randomly choose to read that entry in the Royal Chronicles, and; that same viceroy whose self-centered arrogance blinds him to the true intent of Esther's twin invitations. Though God's name isn't mentioned in the Megillah, we can see Persian Jewry's redemption advance through this chain of what appear on the outside to be small coincidental occurrences.

It is amazing how such moments of deliverance can be traced back to what, upon first glance, might have appeared insignificant or coincidental. The archives of Israel's Knesset contain the story of a meeting between Rabbi Shlomo Lorenz, a former Knesset member of Agudat Yisrael, and President Harry S. Truman. President Truman told Rabbi Lorenz that, contrary to prevailing opinion, he, President Truman, did not recognize the State of Israel in 1948, against his advisors' counsel, because his Jewish partner in the haberdashery business came to the White House to ask this favor.

Instead, President Truman stated, "When I was little, every boy growing up in the United States dreamt of becoming president. That was my dream. I was a good Christian boy and I learned my Scripture. My Bible hero was the Persian

King Cyrus, who let the Jewish people go back to their homeland and build their Temple. I said, if I ever became President of the United States and got the opportunity to let the Jewish people go back to their country and rebuild their Temple like Cyrus that was what I was going to do." "And that," he concluded, "is why I recognized the State of Israel.

There was probably not another person whose main Biblical hero was Cyrus, but that was the minor idiosyncrasy of Harry Truman. And *Purim* comes each year to remind us that from just such hidden "minor" quirks or seeming happenstance can great salvation be revealed. Hence our Sages observation that the words, *Megillah* Esther can well be translated as "Revealing that which is Concealed."

At a recent MBIEE Sisterhood meeting, members voted to make a charitable gift to a private, state-licensed, non-profit home care agency call Community Care Center of the Northeast. We are sharing information about this agency, in case you would like to help by volunteering or by making a personal charitable gift.

Community Care Center serves homebound seniors and persons with disabilities who live in northeast Philadelphia, eastern Montgomery County and parts of Bucks County. Some of the clients are food insecure. To promote lifelong independence and enable seniors to age safely in their homes, Community Care Center provides in-home support and transportation services. In-home services include home health aide, homemaker/companion, live-in care, companion aide for short medical procedures, and training/education. Transportation is provided to seniors who are able to walk independently or with the aid of a cane or walker. This transportation service enables clients to participate in the activities of daily living, including rides to grocery stores, meetings and other local destinations, and to reach medical appointments, including dialysis, safely and on time. The volunteer drivers use their own cars, and a donation of \$10 per ride is offered by passenger to driver.

## Yeast Dough Hamantaschen from Marilyn Senders kitchen

2-1/4 tsp. or one envelope dry yeast 1/4 cup lukewarm milk

1/2 cup plus 1/4 tsp. sugar, divided 3-1/4 cups all-purpose flour, divided

1/2 cup (1 stick) cold butter, cut into pats 1/2 cup whole milk Greek-style yogurt

grated rind of 1 lemon

2 large eggs, well beaten
1/4 tsp. salt
non-stick cooking spray
Filling or fillings of choice
Egg/honey wash made by combining 1 Tbsp.
honey with one egg

Swirl yeast, milk, 1/4 tsp. of sugar and 1/4 cup flour in a one quart jar with a lid. Let rest for 20 minutes.

Put 2 cups of flour and butter pats into mixer bowl and mix with flat beater at lowest speed until mixture resembles coarse crumbs.

Add yeast mixture and remaining sugar, yogurt, lemon rind, eggs, and salt. Mix at medium speed until a smooth dough results.

Switch to dough hook and beat in the additional 1 cup of flour. Spray a large clean bowl with cooking spray and transfer dough to it, covering tightly with plastic wrap. Refrigerate overnight.

Preheat oven to 350°F. Spray baking pans with non-stick cooking spray.

Roll out dough on a well-floured surface (I use a pastry cloth and stockinette-covered rolling pin) into 1/4-inch thick large rectangle. Fold like a business letter into three layers. Turn 90-degrees and roll out again. Again, fold into thirds, turn, and roll out again. Repeat this process one more time to make three separate folding operations in total. This helps the dough form flaky layers.

After the dough has been folded three times, roll out to 1/8-inch thickness and cut circles close together with a three-, to three-and-a-half-inch-round cookie cutter.

Place circles on baking sheets.

Place a scant tablespoonful of filling in the center.

Turn up opposing edges of the circle and pinch together at the corner where they meet.

Bring up remaining edge of the circle and pinch together at the corners where it meets the first two edges to form a triangle. With yeast dough, it helps to twist the corners slightly to better seal them and prevent them from opening.

Re-roll scraps and proceed to cut more circles, etc.

Brush lightly with honey/egg wash. Place baking sheets in a draft-free place and allow the dough to rise for 30 minutes.

Bake at 350°F. for 15-20 minutes, or for 12-15 minutes in a convection oven until golden brown. Remove from baking sheets while still warm.

Makes 3 to 4 dozen. These freeze well.

Do not attempt this recipe unless you can obtain Wondra flour. It is a special granulated flour which gives the cookies a toothsome crunch. I have it from friends who tried it with all purpose flour that the recipe does not come out the same.

## Hamantaschen from Marilyn Senders kitchen

1 cup sugar

1/2 cup (one stick) unsalted butter or pareve margarine

3 large or extra-large eggs

1/2 tsp. kosher salt

3-1/2 cups Wondra flour

2-1/2 tsp. baking powder

1 tsp. pure vanilla extract

2 oz. orange juice

Assorted fillings (lekvar, honey-walnut, cherry, poppy seed, almond, raspberry, strawberry, etc.) Cream butter or margarine with sugar in bowl of electric mixer.

Add eggs, one at a time

Add salt, flour and baking powder. Add vanilla and orange juice. Mix together well, wrap in plastic wrap, and chill for at least two hours in the refrigerator.

Divide into four portions and roll out on a well-floured surface until about 1/8-inch thick.

Cut with a large, thin edged cup or drinking glass or round cookie cutter making cuts close together to avoid rerolling wherever possible.

Place on floured cookie sheet or baking pan.

Place a scant tablespoonful of filling in the center.

Turn up opposing edges of the circle and pinch together at the corner where they meet.

Bring up remaining edge of the circle and pinch together at the corners where it meets the first two edges to form a triangle.

Bake at 400°F, for 8-12 minutes. Bake for 5-7 minutes in a convection oven.

Re-roll scraps and proceed to cut more circles, etc.

## Fillings for Hamantaschen

In this country, prepared fillings can be purchased in the supermarket baking supplies section and are made by such companies as Solo, Lucky Leaf, and Musselman's. The following recipes are offered for those who wish to make their fillings a little more unique.

**Lekvar Filling (Prune Butter)** 

1 1-lb. 1 oz. jar lekvar

1/2 cup raisins

1 Tbsp. honey

1 Tbsp. sugar

1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon

1 tsp. pure vanilla extract

Stir these all together and use as filling for hamantaschen.

**Honey-Walnut Filling** 

3/4 cup honey

1 cup coarsely chopped walnuts

1/4 cup sugar

1/3 cup fine dry bread crumbs

1/2 tsp. grated orange rind

Place honey, walnuts, sugar and bread

crumbs in a saucepan.

Stir constantly over low heat until the mixture becomes thick. Scrape the bottom as you stir to prevent sticking.

Remove from heat and stir in grated orange rind.

Cool before using.




