Camp Fulbright Junior Internship Application Letter to Students and Parents

Dear Students and Parents,

Greetings from Fulbright Korea! It is my pleasure to announce that we are now accepting applications for the Camp Fulbright Junior Internship Program (CFJIP). We hope to build upon the tremendous success of our 2009 and 2010 programs and make this summer our best Camp Fulbright program ever!

The Korean-American Educational Commission (KAEC), which administers the Fulbright program in Korea, has a long history of providing educational exchanges between the United States and Korea. 2010 marked the 60th anniversary of the Fulbright Program in Korea, but it was much more than a commemoration of the establishment of a program; it was a celebration of a history of excellence, of dedication to the goals of the worldwide Fulbright program, and of the pioneering spirit of our program and its alumni. It was in this pioneering spirit that KAEC created the English Teaching Assistantship (ETA) Program nearly 20 years ago, and again in this spirit that we established Camp Fulbright in 2005.

CFJIP, now in its third year, represents a new chapter in our tradition of pioneering exchange programs. At Camp Fulbright, program participants will be able to not only learn Korean language and culture in the classroom, but also work alongside Fulbright grantees, and make new friends with our campers. Participants will also learn valuable life skills such as leadership, academic excellence, teamwork, and responsibility.

When I talk about this program, I cannot help but mention that "spark" that led me to learn about Korea—that same spark that ultimately brought me here and motivated me to create CFJIP. Although our program is relatively young, our program alumni have already greatly benefited from the CFJIP experience:

About Camp Fulbright

Camp Fulbright is an English immersion and camp program that has been offered by Fulbright KAEC each summer since 2005.

The camp provides an educational experience that no other educational institution in Korea can offer. In addition to an excellent English immersion program, campers will have highly qualified teachers, all of whom have had experience teaching in Korean schools, and they will have the opportunity to interact with over 80 Fulbright grantees, and, of course, two weeks of fun!

Camp Fulbright Junior Internship Program (CFJIP) FAQ

The goal of CFJIP is to give both the participants (referred to as Junior Counselors, or "JCs") and the Korean campers at Camp Fulbright a chance to interact, learn about each others' culture, and also to give American students a unique opportunity to learn about Korea.

When and where will Camp Fulbright 2011 be held?

Camp Fulbright will be held at Jungwon University from July 17-30. Program participants and camp staff will arrive earlier for camp setup and depart after the Korean campers leave. **Participants must arrive on July 13, 2011 and depart August 3, 2011.**

Who is eligible to participate in the program?

The program is open to students of U.S. schools in the 8^{th} through 11^{th} grades. Strong applicants are highly motivated students who are in excellent academic standing, have leadership experience, participate in a variety of activities, and who have a strong desire to learn about other cultures.

What are the arrival and departure procedures?

Participants should arrange to arrive in Korea (Seoul-Incheon International Airport) on July 13, 2011. Camp staff members will meet program participants at the airport and transport them straight to the Jungwon University campus to get settled and begin orientation. On August 3, 2011, participants will be taken to Incheon International Airport for departure to the U.S.

What will participants do?

Upon arrival, participants will have a short orientation program during which they will meet other staff members, help with camp preparations, learn about Camp Fulbright, and participate in team building and leadership workshops.

During camp, program participants will have Korean language classes in the morning, after which will be a Korean cultural class or workshop. They will learn Korean traditional music, arts, crafts, and also learn skills that will help them throughout their academic careers and lives. In the afternoon, they will help the staff with activity preparations, and in the evenings after their homework, they will participate in activities with the campers. In some activities, they will be with the other campers in teams, in others, they will help the staff lead the activities.

After the campers leave, participants will help with camp cleanup and closing procedures. There will also be a trip to several major cultural sights in Korea and a day of fun before departing for the US.

What are the program costs?

KAEC will cover all program costs including Korean class fees, textbooks, room and board, activity expenses, and in-country transportation. **Air travel will be incurred by the student's family, school, or sponsoring institution.** Program participants should also bring extra money for incidental expenses, emergencies, and light shopping while in Korea.

Rules and Responsibilities

Rules

The basic rules of Camp Fulbright are RESPECT and RESPONSIBILITY.

Respect means:

- 1. Respecting oneself, others, and others' property.
- 2. Respecting cultural differences, even when in conflict with one's own cultural values.
- 3. Respecting the laws, rules, and ways of life of the host country.
- 4. Respecting different personalities and practices.
- 5. Doing one's best to understand others and relate to each person's particular situation.
- 6. Behaving in a manner that is appropriate for each situation encountered.
- 7. Respecting oneself by accepting challenges and achieving goals.

Responsibility means:

- 1. Complying with camp rules and regulations, and following instructions carefully.
- 2. Keeping track of personal property.
- 3. Taking care of one's health and notifying camp staff whenever medical attention is needed.
- 4. Knowing goals and daily tasks, and accomplishing them in a timely manner.
- 5. Ensuring that all tasks are done to the best of one's ability.
- 6. Keeping deadlines, arriving on time to all activities, and knowing schedules.
- 7. Asking questions and seeking help when necessary.

Note: Additional program details and guidelines will be provided upon acceptance. Failure to comply with these rules and responsibilities or any other guidelines set forth by Camp Fulbright may result in dismissal from the program.

Instructions

The CFJIP application consists of two main parts:

- 1. The main application (forms 1-6) for online submission

Submitting the Application

- 1. Fill out all information requested in forms 1-6.
 - 1.1. Be sure to consult with your parents/guardians when you fill out the information.
 - 1.2. For long answer questions, DO NOT exceed the space provided or send separate files. Extra materials will be discarded and will not be considered with the rest of the application.
- 2. Fill out the electronic application.
 - 2.1. Use the latest versions of Adobe Acrobat Reader or Mac Preview to fill out the forms and save them as a pdf file.
 - 2.2. Information in forms 7 and 8 can be entered by hand or printed and signed.

- 6. All materials must be <u>received</u> no later than April 30, 2011. It is highly recommended that application materials sent in the last week of April be sent by express post.
- 7. Note: We must receive ORIGINAL COPIES of any documents that require a signature.

Upon receipt of all application materials, promising candidates will be contacted as applications arrive to schedule an interview. Interviews will be conducted by internet conference or phone during the last week of April and the first two weeks of May. Decisions will be announced in mid-May.
