PRESENTATIONS

Dr. Barbarino/Mr. Graham introduced Conference III Football Coach of the Year Steven LoCicero and Conference IV Soccer Coach of the Year Jennifer Dankenbrink. Mr. Graham thanked the Board of Education and Central Administration for their support of the District's athletic program. Dr. Barbarino also noted that every fall athletic team made it to the playoff season.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Barbarino reported that Governor Paterson had proposed mid-year cuts, but that the Legislature opposed same. The Governor is deferring payments to school districts, as a means to alleviate New York State's cash flow problems. This, however, creates a cash flow issue for school districts. Mrs. Papandrew asked if there is anything that the school district and community should be doing to voice their concern. Dr. Barbarino noted that the school district will be monitoring the situation closely and, if community support is needed, he will reach out to same. Mrs. Bresnihan asked if the District may want to send a letter to Senator Skelos, thanking him for his strong advocacy efforts on behalf of our District.

Dr. Barbarino reported that the PTA Curriculum Committee has submitted their 2008-2009 report: The Art of Writing and Computer Literacy. The District has developed a response, which Mr. Beleckas will share with the Committee and the Board.

Dr. Kayen reported that the Policy Committee will meet on December 11, 2009.

Mrs. Marcus reported that she attended Pippin, the Fly with the Owls Run/Walk, and many of the winter concerts.

A copy of the certificate shall be mailed to the District, with a provision that, in the event the policies are either cancelled or diminished, at least 30 days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, thereof shall be given to the District. Any endorsements affecting coverage for additional insured must be attached to the certificate. The activities shall not commence until they have obtained all insurance as required and such insurance has been approved by the District.

- I. <u>FOR ALL COVERAGES</u>: Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the District. Any failure to comply with reporting provisions of the policies shall not affect coverage provided to the District, its Board, officers, employees or volunteers.
- II. <u>COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE:</u> "Occurrence" form, including Premises-Operations, Products-Completed Operations, Contractual, Personal Injury, Owner-Contractor Protective and Fire Damage Legal Liability. Coverage shall be in the amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate.

With regard to Commercial General Liability coverage, the policies shall be endorsed to contain the following provisions:

- The Organization's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the District, its Board, officers, employees and volunteers.
- Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the District, its Board, officers, employees and volunteers shall be in excess of the Organization's insurance and shall not contribute to it.
- The District and its Board shall enjoy all rights and privileges of the policy without the responsibility to pay premiums.
