A Note from Pastor Tom



A noted poet was once asked in an interview if he could explain one of his poems "in ordinary terms." He replied with some feeling, "If I could say what I meant in ordinary terms I would not have had to write the poem."

Ultimately the meaning of Christmas resists being fully spelled out "in ordinary terms." That's why we need to do the extra-ordinary during Advent. If we do the extra step, if we change our routine in order to do something different, then we will be more ready to step into Christmas and to accept the "good news of great joy" of the birth of Christ.

I'm inviting you to get some candles, blue, green, red or white. Blue is our liturgical color for Advent, but since green and red, and even white, are such good Christmas candles, they're also just fine. Set up your candle somewhere prominent at home so that you can see it while it burns.

Below you will see the prayers for each of the four weeks of Advent. Light your candle as you pray the appropriate prayer for the four weeks of Advent. Each week has its theme, as you can see. Obviously if the act of lighting and reading can be shared please do so. If your candle burns down too low then start a new one. Some people have large ones so the effect of lighting the first one is such that it ends up being shorter over the duration of Advent, giving all four candles a step like appearance, which is pretty.

Happy Advent, and of course, Merry Christmas soon enough!

1st Week of Advent: Hope

"O God, as we begin this Advent season, grant us the wisdom to hope. Rekindle our minds to hope for your presence, hope for your peace, and hope for your promise of the Christ Child to be born in our lives. Amen."

2nd Week of Advent: Peace

"O God, as we journey through Advent, we ask for the strength to create peace. We ask you to be the source of the peace in our hearts, the reason for the peace in our homes, and the power for peace in our world. Amen."

3rd Week of Advent: Joy

"O God, at the height of our Advent walk, lead us to the joy with which you surround us. Awaken us to your gift of joy even in times of uncertainty, joy in days of struggle, and joy in the night of our failing, for especially then you are with us. Amen."

4th Week of Advent: Love

"O God, as our Advent season draws to completion, grant us the wisdom to share your love. Renew in us our trust in love. For you have called us to love you, to love our neighbors, to love ourselves. Above all, you have sent us the babe of Bethlehem to teach us to love those who need it most, when they need it most. Amen."
