

Can you imagine one day you're in the store where you're working when all of a sudden twenty Homeland Security officers storm in, filling up the whole place! You are shocked, uncertain, even afraid. They separate you from the owner, taking you into one room and the owner into another. You're questioned as to what you know about the business and the owner. Fortunately, you don't know about anything behind the scenes with the business or the owner. The owner however does.

He's been buying merchandize from China snuck in without going through Customs. He was warned to stop a year or more ago. He didn't stop, and now he's arrested.

The business is gone, you're out of a job—but at least you're not going to the Big House! They say what you don't know can hurt you, which is true. Fortunately, it's not true this time. You've been spared.

I know somebody who lived this recently.

I think there's another saying we could use for us and our church: What we don't know will not help us.

What I mean is that there are things we should know that might help us as a church, and you as members and friends of our church. What I am talking about is known as United Church of Christ Firsts. These first are highlights of how over the past 300 or more years UCC ministry has shaped America's religious, social, and political life. And there are some goodies in here!

• 1773: First act of civil disobedience

Five thousand angry colonists gather in the Old South Meeting House to demand repeal of an unjust tax on tea. Their protest inspires the first act of civil disobedience in U.S. history—the "Boston Tea Party."

• 1785: First ordained African American pastor

Lemuel Haynes is the first African American ordained by a Protestant denomination. He becomes a world-renowned preacher and writer.

• 1852: First woman pastor

Antoinette Brown is the first woman since New Testament times ordained as a Christian minister, and perhaps the first woman in history elected to serve a Christian congregation as pastor. At her ordination a friend, Methodist minister Luther Lee, defends "a woman's right to preach the Gospel." He quotes the New Testament: "There is neither male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

• 1972: Ordination of first openly gay minister

The UCC's Golden Gate Association ordains the first openly gay person as a minister in a mainline Protestant denomination, the Rev. William R. Johnson. In the following three decades, General Synod urges equal rights for homosexual citizens and calls on congregations to welcome people of diverse sexual orientation and identity.

The first three Firsts are unquestionable goodies. We were on the side of good and God, even if many, many people at the time opposed our position. Over time, the vast majority of America caught up to this vision of God's extravagant and gracious openness.

The last one may still be more difficult for some, and it certainly was in 1972. But as we can see, being a first at something doesn't mean we will be the only or last. Like the other three Firsts, America, because of people, faith and churches likes ours, is coming to accept the vision of God's extravagant and gracious openness toward our gay and lesbian sisters and brothers.



THIS MONTH'S TEACHINGS

"I Hate Him!"

Two Messages on the Destructive Power of Hatred

February 1 Genesis 4:1-16 Communion ...Yes You Are.

The famous question Cain asked God after God asked him where Abel was is, "Am I my brother's keeper?" While Cain may have been rather flippant in asking this, since it doesn't actually correspond perfectly with God's initial question, the obvious reason for the question is to point us to the Great Question of our moral existence: How much responsibility do we have for others? But first, we've got to understand how quickly we move to seeing others through the lens of hatred, how often we let life turn our heads to the solution that is no solution: hating others.

February 8 1 John 3:11-17

Try Picking on People Your Own Size!

The most obvious result of building a life where feelings of anger get amplified and aggravated into hatred is that people have to find a target to fire upon—and they do. Too often it's someone who is a rather easy target, like someone smaller when we're young. And then there are the targets that societies use to vent their collective venom. This hatred has massive destructive power, as we have seen. We need to take a good look at where we are with this.

February 15 1 John 4:7-12

It's a Good Day to Love

Of course it is...but so is every day. After talking so much the last two weeks about hatred and getting rid of hatred in our lives, it's a good day to bring up the fact that God is love. The Letters of John are very clear about the focus of the Christian life—learning to love God and love others. Let's try to get that to sink in a little deeper this time...!




