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#### ORMATION

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Decades of conflicts' and severe droughts in Somalia has resulted in the internal displacement of 1.35 million Somalis in their own country. Large populations left their homes, walking thousands of kilometers in search of food, most of them ended up in IDP settlements. The majority of the IDPs from the southern regions of the country have flocked to IDP settlements in cities such as Mogadishu where they are living in deplorable camp setups without dignity, decent shelter, food or water. The IDPs living in camps in Mogadishu face significant risks that included 1) Protection -women and girls are targets of sexual assaults and abuse; while young men and boys suffering recruitment from militias/extremist groups due to lack of jobs and safety in the settlements, (2) Unsafe hygiene and sanitation situation resulting in unsafe drinking water likely to cause major increased outbreaks of diseases in the camps. (3) Lack of livelihoods contributes to more debt and in turn increased poverty. (4) Increased conflict between the IDP camps inhabitants as a result of competition for the little resources. (5) Evictions leading to a second displacement of IDPs as landlords increasingly reclaim their land many of the families are female headed households facing many difficulties relocating. Supporting the IDPs resettle in their villages of origin will contribute to offer a durable sustainable solutions and resilience of these vulnerable populations

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Recently local and international agencies (peer agencies) through an initiative under the Return Consortium hosted by UNHCR have been engaged in the voluntary returning of IDPs in Mogadishu IDP camps to their village of origin (VoO) after IDPs groups approached humanitarian actors to seek support to return them back to their villages of origin following the recent improved political instability and the improved livelihood opportunities due to recent rains. The Return Consortium is a hub of different expertise from relevant UN agencies and International NGOs committed to ensure multisectoral approach in the implementation of the IDP voluntary return programme. Mercy Corps did during 2012 facilitate the return of 200 IDP households to Bay, Bakool and Middle Juba. Recently (2013) as part of the RC, Mercy has returned 300 IDP households from Mogadishu IDP camps to villages' of origin in Afgoye and Wanlaweyn districts of lower Shabelle region and plans to participate in the return and support of the 3000 HHs returned to Middle Shabelle districts (Merka). The main gaps identified through the last intentional survey and feedback from the partner agencies in the Return Consortium Working group included the lack of shelter. The majority of the IDPs who are headed by vulnerable female and have children live in makeshift structures in Mogadishu camps that cannot be transferred and shelter services are non-existence in the return villages & districts

3. Activities. List and describe the activities that your organization is currently implementing to address these needs

Mercy Corps is currently supporting 300 beneficiary households (260 IDPs and 40 Host beneficiaries) in Afgoye and Wanlaweyn district villages. MC has provided decent and safe transport to the IDPs, emergency and shelter kits and food cash stipend to the beneficiaries over 3 months period as they settle in their villages of origin. Mercy Corps also provided agricultural input support including seeds, fertilizers, tools and livelihood trainings to the farmers/agropastrolist and livestock restocks. Mercy corps is conducting Cash for Work (CFW) activities to improve the local infrastructure and thereby strengthen the resilience of the communities. Mercy Corps is also contributing to the creation/revitization of community support groups by training the beneficiaries on developing early warning systems, disaster preparedness and disaster risk reduction. Mercy Corps is regularly involved in the feedback and monitoring activities of the return consortium and utilizes its local knowledge gained through implementation of activities in the Shabelles' to guide the IDP return activities. In addition, Mercy Corps have distributed over 5000 NFI/Shelter kits in Mogadishu and Shabelles' regions.

## **LOGICAL FRAMEWORK**

Objective 1 Provide emergency Shelter kits to 3,000 IDP returnee HHs to Merka District. Outcome 1 3000 IDP returnee HHs receive emergency shelter kits (4X5 plastic sheeting, 20 mt of ropes, 50 gr of nails or pending wire). A total of 18,000 beneficiaries (6900 Men & Boys and 11,100 Women and Girls) have better shelter condition.
