Read hapter 5 of John begins with a paralytic man who had for thirty-eight years sought a miracle by the Pool of Bethesda. When Jesus asked him, "Do you want to

be made well?", he could only envision access to the waters.

Jesus did not have to move the man an inch; He healed him just where he was.

This miracle, however, drew the attention of the Jews and they immediately targeted Jesus for healing on the Sabbath.

Like the man who was hopelessly trapped in his physical infirmities, the Pharisees were hopelessly trapped in their spiritual blindness, a condition that was not so easily healed. So Jesus began a dialog regarding who He was. First, He presented Himself equal with God in power and authority (v.19-30). He then provides His witnesses: John the Baptist (v.31-35), His works (v.36), and the Father, Himself (v.37-38). Finally, He presented the Scriptures. "You search the Scriptures for in them you think you have eternal life; and these are they that testify of Me" (v.39). Regardless, His audience was totally deficient of any contact with the Spirit of God and refused to accept Jesus.

The Bible is recommended reading the way breathing is a recommended activity. Breathing, however, requires access to oxygen to produce its ability to sustain life; the Bible requires access to the Spirit to bring life from the Scriptures. This is the primary reason Jesus, in Matthew, had to ask eight times of the learned spiritual leaders of Israel, "Have you not read..?" Without the Spirit of God leading us, we are always learning but are never able to come to the truth.

Theme

Giving up during hard times only adds to our problems. It is faithfulness that turns the tide and brings restoration.

Scripture Reading

Job 1:1-3 "There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name was Job; and that man was perfect and upright, and one that feared God, and eschewed evil. And there were born unto him seven sons and three daughters. His substance also was seven thousand sheep, and three thousand camels, and five hundred yoke of oxen, and five hundred she asses, and a very great household; so that this man was the greatest of all the men of the east."

42:6 "Wherefore I abhor myself, and repent in dust and ashes."

42:10 "And the LORD turned the captivity of Job, when he prayed for his friends: also the LORD gave Job twice as much as he had before.³

42:12-13 "So the LORD blessed the latter end of Job more than his beginning: for he had fourteen thousand sheep, and six thousand camels, and a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand she asses. He had also seven sons and three daughters."

Relating to the Scripture

Job was blessed of the Lord. At the height of his blessings, Satan attacked him in every way that he could. Job lost his children, his livestock, his crops and his wealth. During this time, Job was often tempted to lose faith in God. Though he complained bitterly from time to time, he kept his faith. That faith led him to repentance and prayer for his friends.

Because of Job's faithfulness through hard times, God restored Job in every way. He gave him ten children. His livestock was doubled. His friends and family brought him gold and money. "... every man also gave him a piece of money, and every one an earring of gold" Job 42:11. Even the years of his life were doubled. Job lived 140 years after his calamity; making his total life span 210 years. (Jamieson, Faussett, and Brown Commentary, Job 42:16 notes)

Faithfulness to God is always rewarded. Like Job, we can rest assured that as we faithfully support the Lord's church each and every week, God's blessings will be poured out in our lives. And if hard times are upon us, it is no time to lose faith, but it is time to be more faithful than ever. Let us show our faithfulness today as we give to the Lord's work.
