

# The Future

atrick Henry once stated that, "I have no way of judging the future but by the past." Henry, like many of his contemporaries, believed that

we are beings of history. Our Alaskan moose will not learn from the mistakes of its parents. The salmon will not suddenly recall the fate of their ancestors and avoid the fisherman's net. To them, there is no history to recall because God has not given them the ability to reason. God has invested only mankind with such capacity.

In Deuteronomy 6, the people of Israel were warned about a coming time of their comfort. When they finally settled in the Promise Land, they would have all that God had promised them but He warned, "When you have eaten and are full—then beware, lest you forget the LORD who brought you out of the land of Egypt, from the house of bondage" (6:11b-12). It is so easy, with a full stomach, to forget God. We drift into a lethargic state, content and careless.

Our country was founded in war. In 240 years, it has been preserved through war. The battle cry of our fallen soldiers contended in honor and solace to maintain the liberties of their friends and families, standing between freedom and foe. Yet today, we have developed a philosophy of peace at any price, even the value of our liberty, as collateral to avoid war. We have become lethargic rather than vigilant.

God has blessed America. He has blessed it with prosperity, power, and peace. In the midst of a hostile world of tyrants and demons, He has blessed us with men and women convinced of the sanctity of those blessings. Yet, if we forget the source of those blessings, God has asserted, "You shall surely perish" (Deu 8:19). To do so would despise the souls we honor today.

We cannot remove the significance of the Biblical God from our politics or culture. History stands as the convincing witness against such foolishness. There will always be wars and rumors of war, but to negotiate the value of righteousness with platitudes of peaceful coexistence with evil, leaves our nation defenseless without the shield of God.

Memorial Day may peer into the past with honor and praise, but it is all about the future because the only thing we can judge about

the future is what we have learned from the past.


#### Pew workers needed!





#### Theme

Giving is a simple thing. It simply is a generous gift given to those we wish to share with or to those in need.

# Scripture Reading

Romans 12:3-8, "For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith. For as we have many members in one body, and all members have not the same office: So we, being many, are one body in Christ, and every one members one of another. Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, whether prophecy, let us prophesy according to the proportion of faith; or ministry, let us wait on our ministering: or he that teacheth, on teaching; or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, let him do it with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that sheweth mercy, with cheerfulness."

# Relating to the Scripture

Paul has already told us how we should give ourselves in service to God in the first three verses of this chapter, now he gives instruction on how to use our God-given abilities. One of the abilities God gives us is that of giving.

When giving, we are to give or contribute with simplicity. The word simplicity, according to Strong, means giving with "singleness, sincerity, not self-seeking, but with generosity." (Strong's Exhaustive Concordance, Greek Dictionary of the New Testament, #572)

Giving is simply that: giving! To give is to make a gift. To give is to do so without considering a return, "not self-seeking." If a return is considered then it becomes an investment, not a gift. A gift is simply sharing generously with others, without consideration of yourself receiving something in return. Simple, isn't it.

I can say no more and maintain the simplicity of giving. May we simply give our tithe and offerings today!
