AFL Years K-6

The AFL is hosting a 4 week after-school AFL program for Our Lady of Lourdes students in Years K-6 on Fridays starting in Week 7. 2016 Diocesan School Fees

Dear families

As you may be aware, there is still uncertainty around long term government funding for Catholic schools. Indications are that federal government funding for education post 2017 will be linked to the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which historically has been much lower than the education inflation rate. Funding growth linked to CPI will not meet increases in the real costs of schooling.

To maintain our current service levels we will need to increase diocesan tuition fees by 5%. This increase will mean we can continue to fund important initiatives to improve student learning, including:

- literacy and numeracy programs such as Focus160, Reading Recovery, EMU, EM4 and professional learning for teachers and leaders to support the implementation of these programs
- increasing support for students with disabilities, behavioural and emotional needs
- improving our learning spaces, technology and infrastructure
- building new schools and expanding existing schools to cater for new places

Scholarships and fee arrangements We are committed to ensuring that no child will be refused enrolment due to a family's financial situation. There are a range of scholarship and support programs to assist families including:

- The Bishop Manning Scholarship Fund
- Fee arrangements and discounts
- The Byallawa co-contribution scheme for Indigenous families

Annual Diocesan Tuition Fees - 2016

Annual Diocesan Tuition Fee can be paid upfront at the start of the year or as three equal payments in Terms 1, 2 and 3. Flexible payment plans are also available around weekly, fortnightly or monthly payments. The fee is only charged for the first three children currently enrolled in the diocese. There is no additional Diocesan Tuition Fee for the fourth child attending a systemic school in the diocese or other participating Catholic schools.

Annual Diocesan Building Levy - 2016

The Diocesan Building Levy enables us to continue to maintain all schools to a high standard, and ensure we can expand or build new schools in high growth areas. To ensure this continues we will need to increase the building levy by \$33 per family per year. The levy for 2016 will be \$735 per family, payable in three equal instalments of \$245 in Terms 1, 2 and 3.

We continue to make every effort to contain educational costs and we do not take the decision to raise fees lightly. If a school fee increase will be difficult for your family to manage, please contact your school principal. We will provide every assistance to families in financial need.

Thank you for your ongoing support of Catholic education.

Annual Diocesan Building Levy - 2016

All families with one or more children in a Parramatta Diocesan school or at St Dominic's College, Kingswood are required to pay the annual Diocese of Parramatta Diocesan Building Levy. This levy has replaced the various building levies that parents previously paid to school building funds (managed by either parishes or schools). The levy for 2016 is \$735 per family, payable in three equal instalments of \$245 payable in terms one, two and three.

Annual Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents - 2016

The Diocesan Education Fee Temporary Residents for 2016 is \$1,815 per student, payable in three equal instalments of \$605 in terms one, two and three. The fee applies to new students on the following Visa numbers: 173, 401, 411, 415, 416, 418, 419, 420, 421, 422, 423, 426, 427, 428, 442, 457, 459, 476, 485, 497, 580, 600, 601, 651, 675, 676, 679, 685, 944, 956, 976 and 977 including where any of these are the preceding visas for families on bridging visas 010 to 090.

Families charged this fee in 2013 will continue to be charged on a per family basis to the eldest student whilst the family has continuous current students.

Breathe easy this bush fire season

With bush fire season well underway, we are urging parents and school staff to be extra prepared and aware of asthma signs and symptoms.

Asthma Foundation NSW CEO Michele Goldman warned wood smoke poses a serious threat to people with asthma, particularly children.

"Children, the elderly, and people with asthma and other breathing problems are usually the first to feel the effects of smoke," Ms Goldman said.

"Parents and carers of people with asthma need to be on the alert during bush fire season because wood smoke can trigger a flare-up or even a potentially fatal attack," she said. "During this period it is absolutely vital that people keep taking their asthma medication. We are advising all people with asthma to carry their reliever medication at all times and to take

their preventer medication regularly, as it can take some weeks to be fully effective. "On days when wood smoke levels are high, people should consider the places they intend to visit and weigh up the risks carefully."

The NSW Rural Fire Service recommends everyone in bush fire prone areas to put their bush fire plan into place. Current information on the status of bushfires can be obtained on the Rural Fire Service website at www.bushfire.nsw.gov.au or call 1800 679 737.

Tips to reduce the effects of smoke on asthma

Visit your doctor to update your written Asthma Action Plan.

Continue using your preventer medication and ensure you have reliever medication with you at all times.

When there is smoke from a fire in the area, unless you are advised to evacuate you should stay indoors, and close all windows and doors. If you have an air conditioner, switch it to recycle or recirculate.

If you are in your car, put the air conditioner onto recirculate to reduce your exposure to smoke.

If you are exposed to smoke and your reliever medication is not controlling your asthma symptoms start asthma first aid: sit upright and try to be calm, using your spacer give yourself 4 puffs, taking 4 breaths between each puff. Re-evaluate after 4 minutes. If no improvement, repeat the 4 puffs. If your situation does not improve seek medical assistance.
