PAT Maths: Some of us might remember these - the old green books with multi-choice answers. They have been updated and help us support your child's learning by determining the knowledge and understanding they have in maths. We can then focus children's learning more accurately. The content of the tests is divided into six content categories; number knowledge, number strategies, algebra, geometry and measurement, and statistics.

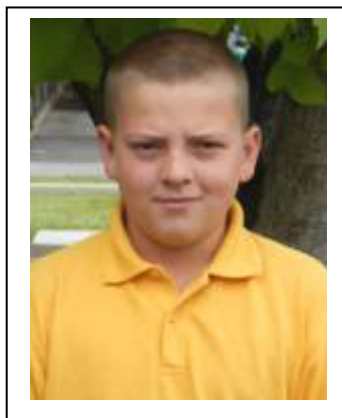
