We visited the beach to look at and collect fossils and were lucky enough to see the dinosaur footprints in the rock.

At the dinosaur farm, the children were digging for fossil teeth and chose 3 to take home with them.



The journey was quite long but they managed really well. A brilliant time was had by all.

#### Learning this week

Mondrian Class- We are lucky enough to have one of our mums come in and explore photography with the children and they have really taken to it. Lots of photos have been taken at all sorts of angles and of lots of different subjects, including me!!

We have been introducing coins and money into our daily routine in maths as well as doubling and halving. The children have really picked up on this well.

This will be our last week for our topic of dinosaurs and to end it, we had a brilliant trip Fossil hunting, at Brook Chine, followed by a visit to the Dinosaur Farm. The children's behaviour was outstanding and their enthusiasm was commented on by the owners of the farm.

Warhol Class—Began the week with a shock when we discovered a crazy tea party scene in our classroom.! The children became investigators using prepositions in their sentences to describe the crime scene! We started to piece clues together after we had read the book The Tiger Who Came To Tea that was left in our classroom. The children had a very interesting and enjoyable trip to Tesco to take part in their 'Farm to Fork' project. We trailed the store learning about where the foods from different departments comes from, what types of foods we should be eating to keep healthy and even got to make our own healthy breakfast cereals. Warhol class had a visit from Miss Cottee who spoke to the children about how to keep safe when using the computer.

Banksy Class—We have been busy as usual over the last few weeks. The children have been learning and practising two dances ready for the Country Dancing Festival in June and will be showcasing these dances at the school's Spring Fayre. In Literacy, the children have been working hard on their character descriptions and Mrs Jacobs was very impressed with their progress and work ethic when she visited the class earlier in the week. ICT has seen Y2 out in the school grounds counting bugs. They have then used this data to create tally charts and graphs on the computer. Well done Y2 - keep up the hard work!

Lowry Class—In maths, we have been adding, subtracting, measuring, ordering and comparing length in mm, cm AND m! Next week we are moving onto volume and capacity. In literacy, we are starting to write our own narrative stories similar to pebble in my pocket. In topic, we have been locating volcanoes around the world using an atlas. We have also been researching famous volcanoes such as Mt Etna and Mt Fuji. We are also really excited for our upcoming sleepover!

Goldsworthy Class— Have been extremely busy editing and improving their stories; "Fortunately the..." They have shared their stories with each other and some of them read them to Year 3. They have also used the computers and typed them up. In maths they continued with multiplication but have now progressed to multiplying 3 digits by 1 digit. They have also enjoyed additional sporting activities this week with Mr Eighteen which they thoroughly enjoyed.

Monet Class—In class this week we have been calculating the area and perimeter of rectilinear shapes. In literacy we compared the book and original film of 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory' and wrote our own non-chronological comparative report. Science this term is based on forces and this week we learnt about the force of gravity and Sir Isaac Newton. Mrs Feist taught us the difference between mass and weight. Did you know weight is how much gravity is acting on an object and mass is how heavy an object is?

Picasso Class—We have been enjoying another busy week and with SATs fast approaching -the week beginning 9th Maywe have been getting in lots of practice! In Grammar, we have been getting to grips with recognizing whether a word is being used as a conjunction or a preposition (as depending upon how it is used in a sentence a word such as 'after' could be either of these) and also experimenting using the same word as both a noun and a verb. Well done Year 6.

Please remember we are unable to authorise absence from school due to holidays during term time.

Due to changes in government legislation the fixed penalty notice for unauthorised absence during term time is now £60 per parent per child.

The Government have now altered the percentage at which concern is raised for attendance—if your child's attendance falls to 90% they are now considered to be a 'Persistent Absentee'. This triggers a process of support, School Attendance Meetings, and monitoring from ourselves along with the Education Welfare Service.
