I hope you worshiped Sunday Oct 30 or Nov 13, heard our Confirmands talk about their Biblical characters and their

own relationship with God (8:15) or heard them say "Yes" to the promises of baptism (10:30). They made it clear why we do that kind of mission in addition to away from Pine Island mission.

I hope you worshiped Nov 5 or 6, saw the video and heard the Baja group talk about the experience. They made it clear why we do that kind of mission in addition to our local mission.

Both are key parts to the mission we have through Saint Paul Lutheran Church. When we realize **we are the church**, the body of Christ, we see the difference between being a congregation member and being a disciple who seeks to follow Jesus. Disciples use all resources: time, talent + treasure to accomplish the mission. That's why Baja 2011 worked better than Baja 2008. That's why more Confirmands each year speak about their relationship to God. Using words to tell our relationship with God teaches us the mission God has for us: God's Work - our words and hands!

Last Saturday, I quoted her speech – "I was not there, but we were there". Words between the pictures explain the quote. The event was a meeting with NCC staff person ELCA Pastor Anne Tiemeyer + Leymah Gbowee that included the signing of her new book, Mighty Be Our Powers: How Sisterhood, Prayer, and Sex Changed a Nation at War. She learned she was 1 of 3 to receive the Nobel Peace Prize the same day as the NCC event. Ann was there with Leymah representing us who are part of the NCC. Mon. night Leymah told her story on the Jon Stewart TV Show.

Liberian civil war tore apart her life claiming the lives of relatives and friends. Years of fighting shattered her girlhood dreams. As a young mother trapped in a nightmare of domestic abuse, she found the courage to turn her bitterness into action. She realized that women suffer most during conflicts and the power of women working together can create an unstoppable force. She organized the Liberian Mass Action for Peace, a coalition of Christian and Muslim women who sat for months in public protest, confronting Liberia's ruthless president and rebel warlords, and even held a sex strike. Leymah + an army of women, led Liberia to peace. So she became an international leader who changed history for the better.

You take part in missions like hers thru SPLC. Your generous gifts are needed this year's end as much as ever. God bless all you do in mission. Pastor John
