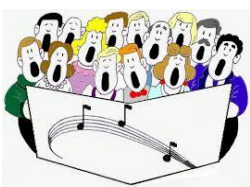
New signs have been erected at either end of the new footpath between The Craft and Edwards Road

Rector's Ramblings

I'm back! Do I hear cheers, groans, alleluias, loud applause, guttural moaning? Well, probably a mixture of all of those! From my perspective it is good to be back amongst you all.

So what shall I ramble about this month? November, for me is a month of remembering both the conflict in our world and loss in our personal lives; time to remember loved ones departed this earthly life. On 2nd November the Church commemorates All Souls, a time when we think about that great cloud of witnesses that have gone before us; not just the famous saints but also our own personal saints who have shaped our lives and continue to do so by our simply remembering them. It is a great honour to offer services to help people at this time of year. So on 27th October at 3.00pm in Winterton church there will be the opportunity for you to come and remember, light candles and just be at peace with God. On 3rd November, also at 3.00pm, in Hemsby there will be a similar service. Please do take the opportunity to come and remember; to give thanks and know you are loved by God.

Don't forget your flu jab

If you're an older person or have a chronic health problem, now's the time to have your seasonal flu jab.

Anyone aged 65 and over, care home residents, pregnant women and people with chronic illnesses such as asthma, diabetes, heart or kidney disease is entitled to receive a free jab.

And from this year, a nasal spray vaccine will also be available to children aged two to three years, as well as children aged two to 18 with long-term health conditions.

Many GP practices will invite people automatically, but if you think you need the flu jab, talk to your GP or practice nurse.

An estimated 20 per cent of the population develops seasonal flu each year, and in some cases it can be fatal. The illness can also place a strain on hospitals, causing sudden rises in emergency admissions.

Norfolk County Council Public Health is also encouraging everyone in Norfolk who knows anyone who may be at risk from flu to tell them how important it is to get protected. Carers and frontline health and care workers are also encouraged to get a jab to protect themselves and those around them.

The flu vaccine changes every year to fight the latest strains of flu, so even if you had a jab last winter you need another one this year to stay flu safe. The jab doesn't contain the 'live' virus so it cannot give you the flu.

WINTERTON ON SEA PARISH COUNCIL

Eight residents were welcomed to the Parish Council meeting held on Thursday 17th October 2013 together with Cllr Weymouth.

1. Public discussion:

- A resident raised concerns about potential flooding in the Village. Terry Byrne (Coastal Erosion Steering Group) advised that there is a slim chance that water could get into the valley but there are soakaways so if this was to happen there would not be a huge threat to the village. As for the dunes disappearing and the erosion of the cliff face near The Hermanus, this is many years away.
- A Resident noted that from Beach Road to the Long Beach area of Hemsby there is no coastal protection in place.

2. To receive a report from the County/Borough Councillors

- Cllr Weymouth noted that the seas are very high at the moment. The Borough Council Coastal Watch is reviewing the situation daily.

3. To receive a report from the PCSO: -

The PCSO was not present but the Chairman noted that there were three reported crimes: 1 Domestic Assault, 1 theft of a motor scooter from George Beck Road and 1 theft of copper piping and a boiler from Bush Road

In addition there were 14 routine calls to police

4. Planning Applications:
