

# 'AWE'-Academic Writing Excellence program continues to drive forward

The AWE program across Year 7-10 continues to be a focal point at the College with students already completing several writing tasks, along with receiving teacher feedback during the Tuesday morning Pastoral lessons. This is being complimented with explicit <u>writing marking criteria in assessment tasks across all KLA's</u> so as to support effective and sophisticated writing in all our students. To that end I share with you <u>two strategies</u> being promoted by our Literacy team which teachers are using with students in our classrooms (indeed there are posters of these in all classrooms, to constantly prompt and embed in students a strong mindset of writing effectively). These are: **PEEL** (Point; Elaborate; Example; Link) and **CUPS** (capital letters; understanding; punctuation; spelling) as demonstrated in the below diagrams, which I would also encourage parents/carers to use with their children when supporting them around Homework and Assessment tasks.





# Year 12 Mandatory Subject Seminars – Friday Afternoons.

The first of our Year 12 subject seminars begins this Friday afternoon, immediately after lunch. All **Business Studies** students in Year 12 are required to attend this seminar. The following weeks will see seminars for other subjects taking place.

Each seminar has a **specific writing focus** and is designed to provide the Year 12 students with instruction, timed preparation and immediate feedback on **HSC examination style questions**. Students should come to each seminar with a pen, ready to write, as laptops will not be permitted.

Parents are asked to support this initiative by not making appointments for Year 12 students who have a scheduled seminar or assessment task on Friday afternoons and by not providing notes with permission for early leave.

# **HSC Disability Provisions**

Any Year 12 student with a medical or learning disability that requires special conditions in examinations, should by now have provided me with the necessary paperwork to be submitted to BOSTES. All such submissions need to be with BOSTES before the end of Term 1 for their approval, so if this pertains to you, or to your son or daughter, and you are yet to have acted on this, please make contact with me before the end of this week. No examination provisions will be granted to students who have not submitted the necessary documentation. If you are unsure, please check.

# Assessment Schedules and Handbooks.

Assessment schedules (Years 7–9) and handbooks (Years 10-12) are all on SEQTA and viewable by students and parents through the documents section. It is a student's responsibility to have read the relevant documents, including the rules and procedures that accompany them and to be present for/or submit all assessment tasks on/by the due date. Consequences for failure to do this lead to a zero result for students in Years 10-12 and a percentage loss, followed by a zero result for students in Years 7-9.

Students in Stages 4 and 5 will notice that there is a literacy criteria appearing on many of their assessment tasks. This has been introduced across the curriculum and in conjunction with the AWE program to support and enhance writing skills and will also appear as a feature of student reports.

# Numeracy at Aquinas





Numeracy is regarded as "the capacity to bridge the gap between 'mathematics' and the 'real world' to use in-school mathematics out-of-school." People are considered numerate based on "how well they choose and use the mathematical skills they have in the service of things other than mathematics" (Willis, 1998).

At Aquinas Catholic College, in 2016, we have introduced "Numeracy Thursday". This initiative uses the time during Thursday morning pastoral to focus on activities involving numeracy.

Year 7 and year 9 students have been completing 10 NAPLAN style questions each Thursday for the past 5 weeks and will continue these until the NAPLAN tests in Week 3, Term 2. Year 7 have been focusing on non-calculator questions but will change this week to calculator questions. It is important that all year 7 students bring their calculator to school every day from now on. The students will be learning how to use their calculator in Maths lessons and they will need it to help them on Thursday mornings.

The NAPLAN numeracy tests have non-calculator and calculator allowed components. The numeracy questions are not directly based on the content that is covered in the Mathematics course, but rather on the basic numeracy that students are expected to know by Year 7 or Year 9. Doing NAPLAN preparation allows students access to the style of questioning, ensuring they are not confused and bewildered.

Year 8 and year 10 students have been focusing on numeracy in the real world, completing tasks such as Numeracy in Cooking, Gardening, Travel and Medicine. These tasks involve basic questions revolving around measurement, time, money, etc. After NAPLAN, Year 7 and Year 9 will begin to cover these basic numeracy tasks too.

The introduction of Numeracy Thursday, has resulted in students being very settled during pastoral and they all seem to be working efficiently to complete all the set tasks. Thanks to the pastoral teachers for their support in getting this initiative up and running this term.

**NOTE:** These teams are not Aquinas Catholic College teams but NSWCCC teams. Students are nominating to trial at STATE level and as such should be a strong representative player of that sport.

# **NSWCCC Entry into individual Sports and Team Sports**

### TEAM SPORT ENTRIES

Southern Sydney Combined Catholic Colleges is the pathway for our students to progress to the NSWCCC Championships and NSWCCC selection.

SSCCC run trials for the following teams:

Baseball	U/15 and Open Rugby League	Swimming	Soccer
Cross Country	U/15 and Open Touch	Athletics	

If students wish to trial for the SSCCC teams there is a school trial first, before they progress. When students are successful in making the school team they will be asked to register on the NSWCCC website to progress to the SSCCC selection.
