One major topic was the upcoming Christmas Eve party at the Lemuel Shattuck Hospital.

Brothers Weber and Deletetsky had a conference call with Shari Holstein from MDMH and below is what we have concluded to:

It's the time of year when the days grow shorter and colder.

That means that the annual Welcome Lodge Christmas Party at the Lemuel Shattuck Hospital is around the corner.

Each year we try to make this holiday event a more enjoyable and memorable occasion for the Shattuck clients and for those who help put the party together. To that end, we have met with management at the Shattuck and they have agreed to be less hands on and allow us to conduct the party as we see fit, (i.e. going back to a buffet feeding methodology, developing our own menu, doing our own prepwork/cooking and providing our own entertainment.)

However, there are two areas of concern raised by Shattuck management that we must address.

The first is an easy one. <u>All of those participating in the event in the Shattuck facility must by law be 18 years or older.</u>

The second area of concern is a bit more complex and we need your full cooperation to implement it. Over the years, the number of people who come to the Christmas Party to help has increased greatly. It is to a point where the old proverb of too many cooks spoiling the soup is applicable. Too many people come without specific job functions and as a result, there is an unacceptable level of inter-personal socializing amongst the attendees with no interaction with the clients.

This distraction takes away from the primary purpose of this party which is to provide a warm, giving and enjoyable evening for the Shattuck clients.

Keep in mind that we are not here for ourselves, we are here for them. While we are not necessarily looking to reduce the number of people who come to work at the Shattuck party, we

are asking that unless you or someone you are bringing has an assigned job function for the party that you not attend.

Please keep in mind that this is **not a punitive measure**, but a way to create a more festive and meaningful evening for the Shattuck clients.
