About the play:

A 12-year-old boy finds himself separated from his family in the unfamiliar streets of a war torn city. He takes refuge in a bombed-out house and in the total blackness his bravado crumbles into tears. Into his life steps Anna older, street smart and scornful of his crying. As a way of calming the boy down she starts to tell him a story that she vaguely remembers from her own childhood. And so begins a journey into the shifting, shimmering world of ogres, princes, singing bones, foolish lads and wolf-mothers. *Stories in the Dark* explores the power of storytelling and with humour and hope mingles the magic and earthy wisdom of folk tales with a story of conflict and the struggle to survive.

About the author:

Debra Oswald is an Australian writer, author and playwright. Her TV writing credits includes Offspring, Police Rescue, The Secret Life of Us and even Bananas in Pyjamas. She has written numerous plays and is the author of a number of books for both children and teenagers. Her play *Stories in the Dark* won Best Play in the 2008 NSW Premier's Literary Awards.
