Dear Students and Parents,

At the end of Term 4, all Grade 9 students will have the opportunity to participate in an Adventure and Enrichment Activity offered by the College.

The purpose of this letter is to provide students and parents with some general information about the options available, so that choices may be made soon. Grade 9 students will attend an information session this Friday where they will hear more details and will have the opportunity to ask questions.

The rationale behind the Enrichment and Activities Week (December 9-11, 2014) is to offer students a range of activities, covering a broad spectrum of individual interests and abilities, and providing them with the opportunity to learn beyond the classroom. Some activities, such as the Canberra/ Sydney trip, offer insights into our cultural and historical identity. The outdoor education experiences encourage students to undertake new and exciting personal and physical challenges. A variety of activities is available and all students should be able to find something that is of interest. The Grade 9 Adventure and Enrichment Week is not an optional extra for students and attendance is compulsory.

The list of activities available to students is detailed below. They vary in terms of cost and the amount of preparation required. The planning and booking of activities will occur in the coming months, and at this stage we are asking families to nominate (and preference) the three activities which best suit their interests, abilities and budget. Once students have made these choices, travel arrangements and the booking of travel, venues, guides and equipment can get underway.

Students need to discuss the options carefully with their families, friends and teachers before they make their choices. For logistical reasons, we **discourage students from switching their options in Terms 3 and 4.** The aim is for students to attend their first option, but because numbers are set for some activities (such as scuba diving and surfing), we must operate on a 'first come, first served' basis. For these reasons, this Choice Form must be returned to the school office by <u>Tuesday 10 June, 2014</u>.

Once the forms have been received and collated, students and parents will receive written notification confirming their choice. They will also receive an invoice requiring payment of a <u>non-refundable deposit</u> - \$50 for Outdoor Activities or \$500 for the Canberra/ Sydney trip.

• All deposits are payable by 4 July 2014, the final day of Term 2.

• Final payments for all activities must be received by 26 September 2014, the final day of Term 3. Please do not hesitate to contact either of us by phone or email if you have any questions or concerns about the activities. Our email addresses appear below.

Detailed information about final costs, itineraries, equipment requirements, attending staff, and medical and consent forms will be forwarded to families as soon as it is available.

Grade 9 Adventure and Enrichment Activities 8-11 December 2014

Option 1: Canberra/ Sydney Trip

As you may be aware, in past years Grade 9 students have been offered the opportunity to travel to Canberra and Sydney for an educational tour which encourages students to learn more about Australia's historical, cultural, political and contemporary identity.

A Canberra trip is now part of the Grade 6 curriculum, but we are keen for all students to have the opportunity to visit our national capital and largest city. The option to visit Canberra/ Sydney is offered to Grade 9 students during Adventure and Enrichment Activities Week.

It is proposed that the four-day/ three-night trip will depart on the morning of Monday 8 December and return on the evening of Thursday 11 December. The tour would comprise a two-night, motel accommodation stay in Canberra with visits to attractions of national significance including New Parliament House, the Australian War Memorial, the National Gallery of Australia, and the Australian Institute of Sport. Following the Canberra experience, the tour would travel by bus to Sydney for an overnight stay which would include a visit to Mary MacKillop Place in North Sydney, some sightseeing of Sydney's famous landmarks, and perhaps a bit of shopping.

We are working with Trekset Travel Agent to set up our itinerary and bookings, and at this stage the estimated cost of the trip is approximately \$1300. Once we have an indication of firm numbers, we will be able to furnish more substantial details about cost, accommodation and itinerary.

We understand that the cost of this trip may be prohibitive for some families, and we ask for careful consideration before students make a firm commitment. The final price for this trip will be determined by the travel agent based on the number of people of travelling. Once this figure is set we will be unable to make changes and as a result all deposits and payments made to the travel agent will be non-refundable. If a student pulls out of the trip during terms three or four their costs will still need to be covered in full.

As with all activities, we will keep families up to date with our planning and preparation, and we ask for your patience during this planning term. Let us know if you have any preliminary questions about this trip. There will be more formal information sessions for families once we have more information from students.
