23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the final verses of today's Gospel reading Jesus says that when two or three are gathered in his name, "there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20). So we understand that fraternal correction is always undertaken with Jesus present to us.

Likewise, encouraging the good in others is not only the right thing for us to do, it is a necessity. The Lord tells the prophet Ezekiel that if he "does not speak out" to dissuade a person from evil, then he, too, will be held responsible. We live in a "do your own thing" age when moral objectivity is often ignored. Clearly when the message we share with others is one of love, our motives cannot ever be misinterpreted. As St. Paul writes, "Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence, love is the fulfillment of the law" (Romans 13:10).

A TOUGH, COMPASSIONATE LOVE

The model of fraternal correction described by Jesus and enacted in the early church is often paralleled today in the ways that family members and friends respond to loved ones who abuse drugs.

First, there is a private encounter in which a family member or friend implores the abuser to recognize the destructive behavior and take the first steps toward seeking a new way. Should this step fail, an "intervention" takes place. More friends and acquaintances intervene and compel the abuser to seek professional treatment. Unfortunately, this step, too, sometimes fails. It is only then, when "tough love" takes over, that the abuser is left to hit bottom, in the hope that he or she can begin the climb to recovery.

A COMMUNITY THAT CARES

Today's Gospel gives Jesus' directions for correcting a member of the community who has sinned. Its three-stage process was likely practiced in the early church. The first step is private correction, to tell the person his or her fault so there is no chance for public humiliation. If this fails, the matter is to be brought before the assembled church. In the third step of this process, when the person does not listen to even the church acting in Jesus' name, then the sinner is to be dismissed from the community.

Even this dismissal is a qualified one. Jesus ministered to the most despised of society. And the church continues to offer pastoral care to all in need. More telling is Jesus' invitation to pray, that "if two of you agree on earth about any-thing for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father" (Matthew 18:19). Through prayer, we can be assured that even those whom we expel in the name of "tough love" will be treated mercifully and compassionately by our loving God.

HEALING, REPAIR, RESTORATION LOVE CORRECTION

Several weeks ago, we read about how Jesus started his Church by giving Peter the "keys" to the kingdom. Today, Jesus prepares the disciples and us for the challeng-

es we face in our community the Church.

In the Gospel reading, Jesus tells us what we should do if a brother or sister in Christ sins against us. Our natural instinct is to recoil, withdraw, tell someone else how we have been hurt and then get even. But Jesus says to

do the opposite. We should approach that brother or sister one-on-one in love to quietly resolve the conflict. Jesus wants us to be just as concerned for the offender's welfare as we are for our own.

What if that doesn't work? "If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, so that 'every fact may be established on the testimony of two or three witnesses.' If he refuses to listen to them, tell the church. If he refuses to listen even to the church, then treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector," (Matt 18: 16-17).

This is pretty strong medicine. As one commentator writes, "With this three-step prescription, Jesus wants

His followers to do everything in their power to effect reconciliation so that harmony and love will prevail among themselves and within their Christian community. ...Perhaps we are hesitant to carry out this Christian responsibility because we feel that we ourselves have our own weaknesses and faults. If this was the case, then no parent can correct his child, no teacher can straighten out a troublesome student, no judge can pass a sentence, no priest can advise a penitent. But the issue here is not about who is morally upright but about being a caring

person to one another. And this is because of the realization that a person's spiritual integrity is just as important – if not more so – as his physical well-being. "¹ Thus, it is with love that we correct a brother or sister. It is also with love that if our approach is rejected, we may need to be like

the Father in the parable of the Prodigal Son who prays and waits watching hopefully for the return of his wayward son.

"Lord, make me an instrument of your healing love and peace. Give me wisdom and courage to bring your healing love and saving truth to those in need of healing and restoration."² — Fr. Mike

It's time to register student candidates for 2015 Confirmation at St. Norbert's. If your child is in **sixth grade (or older)** this year and is eligible for the sacrament of Confirmation please submit a Confirmation registration form to



the Director of Religious Education **by Sept 12th**. Please note that the archdiocese requires that to be eligible for the sacrament, a child needs to have been participating in a Catholic religious education program for a minimum of the immediate two years before the sacrament (inclusive). Confirmation forms are available on the parish website, in the narthex, and from the religious education office. Confirmation this year will be on **Saturday**, **Feb 21, 2015**, at 10 AM.
