SAINT ATHANASIUS

POPE FRANCIS AND BISHOP KEN UNTENER +

This month of March has become memorable because of two religious leaders who have been an inspiration to many priests and parishioners. Certainly they have become an inspiration to my priesthood.

POPE FRANCIS

"THE POPE WHO KNOWS HOW TO POPE"

MARCH 13, on this day in 2013, Archbishop Jorge Bergoglio was elected pope. As a Cardinal he had rented out his Cardinal's Residence and lived in a simple residential apartment/house. He also got rid of his special Archbishop's car with chauffeur and took public transportation, carrying his own briefcase. The new Holy Father quickly showed his individuality and willingness to break with tradition. Following his election, he chose to travel with his fellow cardinals on the bus from the Sistine Chapel back to the hotel where they were staying...and then the next day, he returned to pay his own hotel bill at the place where he had stayed before the conclave. He eschewed the ornate papal garb for a simpler style and chose to live not in the papal apartments but rather in the Domus Sanctae Marthae (a guesthouse located on the edge of Vatican City), where he eats dinner with lower-ranking priests and visitors. He was heard saying, "I didn't want to live in the Apostolic Palace. I go there only to work and for audiences. I live in St. Martha's House, which is a boarding house...I am visible to people and I lead a normal life."

BISHOP KEN UNTENER +,

"The people's Waiter for a long, long time"

MARCH 27, is the 10th death anniversary of Bishop Ken Untener. I am lucky to have attended one of the last recollections he gave at our annual Clergy Retreat (and have a souvenir photo of him). Bishop Ken Untener was born on the Detroit recreational island of Belle Isle. He was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Detroit in 1963. In 1980, the 43-year-old rector of St. John's Provincial Seminary in Plymouth, Michigan, was named the fourth bishop of the Diocese of Saginaw in mid-Michigan. Bishop Untener, who held a doctorate in theology, soon sold the bishop's residence and, for the next 24 years, lived with his priests at parishes throughout the 11-county diocese. Without a Bishop's residence, he scheduled his year going to different parishes, lived with the Pastor and Parochial Vicar of each parish, ate what they ate, and participated in helping them in the weekend and weekday Masses of the parish. He became known for a simple lifestyle and his spirituality and short but powerful homilies. If he received a sweater as a gift, he gave one from his closet away. To encourage his priests to give short and powerful homilies he wrote the now famous book "Preaching Better". And to encourage people to pray, he started the Little Book as a Lenten project for his diocese in 2000. At his installation as Bishop of Saginaw in 1980, he said in his homily, "Hello, I'm Ken and I'm going to be your waiter for a long, long time." Pray for all of us your fellow "waiters in the Lord's table", Bishop Ken, and rest in God's peace.

FASTING DURING LENT

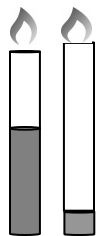
All Catholics between 18 and 59 years old, are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means partaking of only one full meal throughout the day.

BOLETIN HISPANO

EL PAPA FRANCISCO Y EL ARZOBISPO KEN UNTENER

Este mes de marzo se ha hecho memorable debido a dos líderes religiosos que son una inspiración para muchos feligreses y para muchos sacerdotes. Ciertamente son una inspiración para mi sacerdocio.

EL PAPA FRANCISCO, AQUEL QUE SABE COMO SER PAPA

El día trece de marzo de 2013, el arzobispo Jorge Bergoglio fue electo Papa. Cuando era Cardinal, el había rentado su residencia de Cardinal y vivía en una modesta casa/ apartamento. También se había deshecho de su automóvil especial para Cardinal y de su chofer y tomaba transporte público llevando consigo su portafolio. El nuevo Santo Papa rápidamente demostró su individualidad y su habilidad de romper con lo tradicional. Después de la elección, decidió viajar junto con sus compañeros cardinales en el autobús desde la capilla Sextina hasta el hotel donde se hospedaban... el siguiente día, el mismo regreso a pagar la cuenta del hotel en el lugar donde se había hospedado durante el conclave. El evito ponerse los hábitos papales y opto por un atuendo de un estilo simple y de no vivir en el apartamento Papal sino que en el Domo de Santa Marta (una casa de huéspedes ubicada en las afueras de la ciudad del Vaticano), allí él toma sus alimentos con los sacerdotes que no tienen altos cargos y con visitantes. Se le escucho decir: "No quise vivir en el Palacio Apostólico. Allí solamente llego a trabajar y a dar audiencias. Vivo en la casa de Santa Marta, porque es un pupillage... estoy a la vista del público y vivo una vida normal".

EL OBISPO KEN UNTENER (+), "EL MESERO DEL PUEBLO POR MUCHO, MUCHO TIEMPO"

El 27 de marzo es el décimo aniversario del fallecimiento del Obispo Ken Untener. Tuve la dicha de haber asistido a una de las últimas recolecciones que él dio en un retiro de sacerdotes (y tengo una fotografía de recuerdo con él). El Obispo Ken Untener nació en la isla recreativa de Belle Isle en Detroit. Fue ordenado como sacerdote en la Diócesis de Detroit en 1963. En 1980, a la edad de 43 años, era el rector del seminario de San Juan de la Provincia en Plymouth, Michigan, fue nombrado el cuarto Obispo de la Diócesis de Saginaw en el centro de Michigan. El Obispo Untener, quien tenía un doctorado en teología, rápidamente vendió la residencia para Obispos y por los siguientes 24 años, vivió en las parroquias junto con los sacerdotes de los once condados de la Diócesis. Al no tener una residencia, él planeaba cada año visitando a diferentes parroquias, viviendo con el pastor y el vicario de cada parroquia. Él se alimentaba lo mismo que los otros padres comían y les ayudaba participando en las misas de la semana y de los fines de semana de la parroquia. Se dio a conocer por su estilo de vida tan simple y por su espiritualidad, también por sus cortas pero poderosas homilias. Si alguien le regalaba un abrigo, él regalaba uno de los que tenía en el ropero. Para incentivar al clero a dar cortas pero poderosas homilias, él escribió el libro "Predicando Mejor" que hoy es famoso. También, para inspirar al pueblo a orar más, él escribió el "Pequeño libro" como proyecto de cuaresma en su Diócesis en el año 2000. En su ordenación como Obispo de Saginaw en 1980, él dijo en su homilía: "Hola, mi nombre es Ken y voy a ser su mesero por mucho, mucho tiempo." Oren por todos nosotros sus "Meseros en la mesa del Señor", Bishop Ken, y descansen en la paz de Dios.

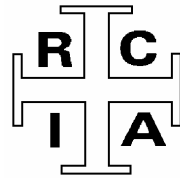
VIA CRUCIS EN ESPAÑOL TODOS LOS VIERNES
