Next Sunday: The Second Sunday of Advent Isaiah 11:1-10 Romans 15:4-9 Matthew 3:1-12 Readings:

Theme: The Era of Justice and Peace

The reading from Isaiah is drawn from that section of the book known as the book of Imannuel wherein the future messianic king is depicted as well as the era of peace which he inaugurates. As he concludes his letter to the Romans, Paul stresses the importance of hope, drawn from the teaching of the scriptures, to be lived in a community spirit of harmony and charity. In Matthew's gospel, the beginning of John the Baptist's ministry presents the prophet as an ascetical forerunner whose call fro conversion of life sets the stage for the One who is to come.
