## Algebra 2 Course Syllabus

Welcome to Algebra 2. This is a continuation of Algebra 1, where the material you learned in Algebra 1 will be enhanced and new ideas will be introduced. We are looking forward to a great year.

## Materials needed for class everyday are:

- 3 Ring Binder ( 1 inch min) with 4 sections for Classwork, Homework, Assessments, Toolkit
- Hole-punched lined paper and graph paper (for use in binder)
- TI-84 Graphing Calculator
- Pencils and erasers

Students will not be permitted to go to their lockers during class.

## Textbook

This course uses the CPM Core Connections textbook. Resources are available online from the textbook manufacturer at http://www.cpm.org/. Students will receive a username and password to access the textbook online. There is a Student Support, Homework Help, and Parent Support section of the website.

## Calculators

Students are required to have a graphing calculator for this course. A TI-83, TI-83 Plus, TI-84, or TI-84 plus can be used in this course. Students need to engrave their name on the back of the calculator. Students are not permitted to use the TI-89's or any calculators equipped with a Computer Algebra System (CAS) are not allowed for this course.

## Homework Policy

Homework will be randomly checked for completeness.

- All work must be shown, and an understanding of the material must be clearly presented. Any homework problem you are having difficulty with, must have your question or concern written out underneath the problem.
- Periodically homework may be collected and checked for accuracy.
- Homework quizzes may be given.

- Review the exam with math teacher
- Received tutoring from a math teacher, STARS tutor, or private tutor

- Students will receive the higher of the two exams, not to exceed a $75 \%$ maximum
- 35\% - Quizzes, Projects, and Graded Assignments
- 10\% - Homework, Classwork, and Assignments that are checked for completion only
