The deadline to apply to be a Creative Mentor is Monday, November 4, 2013.

The Creative Mentor Application consists of 5 sections:

There is a required criminal background check for all applicants.

The Creative Mentorship Program is seeking artists from a diverse array of backgrounds who demonstrate a special interest in passing their artistic knowledge on to Student U students. The mission of Student U is to empower students in the Durham Public Schools to own their education by developing the academic skills and personal well-being necessary to succeed in college and beyond. Your student's relationship with you and the artistic skills they gain are meant to amplify their excitement about and commitment to their education.

Why do you want to work with these students and what will be your unique contribution to their ongoing education? How do you think your artistic practice has caused personal growth for you? As a mentor, how will you help your student grow in his or her own way, and keep him or her engaged in higher learning activities?





SAMPLE ART ACTIVITY

As a Creative Mentor, you will be responsible for planning the activity for each of your meetings with your student. Please create a sample activity using the prompts below. If you receive an interview with DAG, you will be asked to teach an activity like the one described below as a part of your interview.

Personal Letter:

This letter can be from anyone who can speak to you *as a human being*... someone who can speak to your strongest characteristics that will ensure your success as a Creative mentor. This letter can be from a boss, a friend, your aunt, your little sister, a student who you are currently tutoring, a parent of a child who you babysit, etc.

The last two pages of this application packet are forms for you to give to your recommenders. Please fill out the sections: "Applicant's Name" and "Mail By" before giving the forms to your recommenders.
