

Prayer Garden Update

If you have recently visited the Prayer Garden, you will notice that progress is being made on the installation of the individual bronze Stations of the Cross. Also, bronze commemorative plaques are beginning to be installed on the benches.

Paver Campaign

Once again, we invite you to take this opportunity to purchase a paver to commemorate the celebration of life or special occasion. Since the cross-shaped walkway has already been installed, it would not be practical to take out individual pavers, engrave them, and then reinstall them in the walkway without disrupting the stability of the walk. The alternative solution was to have individual bronze plates engraved with a two-line commemorative text mounted on a bronze plaque. The bronze plaque measures 24" W x 36" H, and the individual bronze tags are approximately 3" W x 2 1/2" H. The plaque will be mounted on the wall behind the Blessed Virgin. The cost for each individual paver, including bronze plate, is \$200.00. 

Fortnight for Freedom

The Fortnight for Freedom, which we celebrated for the first time last year, began June 21—the vigil of the Feasts of St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More—and continues through July 4, Independence Day.

A Mass will be offered on **July 4** at **12:00 p.m.** at the Washington, D.C. **Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception**, celebrated by Cardinal Donald Wuerl of the Archdiocese of Washington. The Eternal Word Television Network will carry the Shrine Mass live.

In 2013, we face many challenges to religious liberty, including the August 1, 2013 deadline for religious organizations to comply with the HHS mandate; potential Supreme Court rulings that could redefine marriage in June, causing serious religious liberty issues for Catholic adoption agencies and many others; and religious liberty concerns in other areas, such as immigration and humanitarian services.
