Unfortunately our current accommodation provision cannot provide the facilities required and we are therefore on the hunt for a suitable rental property. However, despite some extensive research, we haven't been able to find the right place, or been able to acquire the required commitment from a landlord. We would need to rent this property for a minimum of 3 years.



All change! New chairman for Padstones



Padstones, is pleased to announce the appointment of Alan Walters as its new Chairman. Alan was elected Chairman by the full Board of Trustees at their recent Annual General Meeting on 6th October 2011. He succeeds Dr John Kennedy, who has decided to step down, after 8 years of dedicated service.

Alan Walters is currently Chairman of South Bucks District Council. Originally from

Wales, he now lives in Beaconsfield and has four children. Alan spent the bulk of his career working in the Public Sector and also ran his own Consultancy business advising on Human Resources. He has also been a Councillor of SBDC for 10 years.

Commenting of his election, Alan Walters said: "I am very pleased to have been elected by the Board of Trustees as Chairman of such a special, local charity. The Charity has fantastic potential to contribute to the local area's future. I hope to contribute to the Charity's fundraising efforts by mapping out a 3-year strategy, using the expertise of the Trustees.

We also currently have provisional plans to operate a new Mother and Baby Unit. This will provide home and support for teenage mothers and babies, demand for which has continued to exceed supply in this area.

I look forward to continuing the excellent work of my predecessor, John Kennedy, with the support of my fellow Trustees, the staff and residents of Padstones."

John Kennedy got involved with the Charity when he was Chairman of Housing at South Bucks District Council in 1992. He joined as a Trustee in 1999 and became Chairman in 2003.

John Kennedy has overseen the extension of the Charity's housing provision, by opening supported accommodation in High Wycombe, and more recently, moveon housing there also. John also recognised the need to get more, younger Trustees on the Board in order to secure the Charity's future and was successful in recruiting six new members.

John Kennedy said: "Over the last few years the Charity has gone from strength to strength. Our profile has been raised; we have a fantastic team of Trustees on the Board; amazing staff who always go beyond the call of duty; and great residents, who see Padstones as a family and are all getting a good education and secure employment. It is with some regret that I have now decided to retire from my position as Chairman. I will continue to support Padstones as a trustee to the best of my ability and I know my successor will enjoy serving our great cause as much as I have."

By becoming a Friend you will receive invitations and priority bookings at special events and will be kept informed of all activities and developments.


