OnTRA Instructor, Martha Lloyd-Smith, Awarded Ontario Medal for Good Citizenship

An OnTRA Instructor has been recognized for her outstanding contribution to the community.

A ceremony was held at Queen's Park to honour Martha Lloyd-Smith and the other 11 recipients in the province for an Ontario Medal for Good Citizenship.

The Honorable David C. Onley, Lieutenant Governor of Ontario and OnTRA Patron with Citizenship Minister Michael Chan presented the medals at a ceremony at Queen's Park on October 20th.

Created in 1973, the Ontario Medal for Good Citizenship recognizes people who, through exceptional long-term efforts, have made outstanding contributions to the well-being of their communities.

"These people have made tremendous contributions to their communities and the province of Ontario," Onley said. "Their volunteerism and community service are a gift to their fellow citizens."

Martha Lloyd-Smith of Markham, ON was recognized for over 32 years of volunteer work with the Ontario Therapeutic Riding Association (OnTRA) and Community Association for Riding for the Disabled (CARD), a therapeutic riding center in North York.

Therapeutic riding was first introduced to Canada in 1968. In 1969, CARD was incorporated. CARD was relocated to G. Ross Lord Park in 1979 with the enthusiastic support of Mel Lastman, then Mayor of North York.

Ever since 1976 when Martha first began volunteering at CARD she saw the huge benefits to the participants. The program benefits riders who seek physical or cognitive therapies who have a variety of disabilities. The swinging, repetitive motion imparted to the rider through therapeutic horseback riding helps improve balance, coordination, strength and muscle tone while gently mobilizing the joints.

She provided lessons improving muscle tone, balance and coordination at the same time encouraging appreciation of their equine partners.

Lloyd-Smith has instructed and coached well over 700 riders with a disability making a huge positive impact on both their health and quality of life. Some of her students have progressed to Provincial, National and International competitions.

Martha Lloyd-Smith has also participated in fundraising and competitions to raise public awareness and help people with disabilities.

In addition to supporting the riders Lloyd-Smith also sup-

OnTRA Thanks Four Members With Over Eight Decades of Service

Ontario Therapeutic Riding Association (OnTRA) members with a cumulative 8+ decades of service to therapeutic riding will leave the OnTRA Board of Directors at the November Annual Meeting.

Karen Sibbald, Board President, and Sonia Koczekan, Vice President, announced in June that they would be retiring at the AGM. Also retiring are John McClellan, CA, Treasurer, and Gay Harper, Secretary.

"We recognize that it is time for OnTRA to grow with new Board members and new ideas," Karen said. "We'll continue to vigorously support therapeutic riding, but without the responsibility of Board membership."

Sonia noted that "we will all continue to support OnTRA's programs whenever

possible."

Karen Sibbald came to OnTRA in 1997. She served as Director and OnTRA representative to the Ontario Equestrian Federation (OEF) Association Council and most recently as OnTRA President.

Karen came to OnTRA from the Community Association of Riding for the Disabled (CARD), where she became a Director in 1992 and served as President of the Board from 1994 to 1996. She raised funds for, and produced, a fundraising CARD video with \$40,000 in support from the Bank of Montreal, Cadillac Fairview and the Variety Club.

A lifetime horse person, Karen is a communicator and marketer with a flare for fundraising and corporate and special events. She was co-chair of CARD's

first major special event, a celebration of the career of former championship jockey, Sandy Hawley.

Sonia Koczekan has been involved with horses for 45 years. She has been a certified CTRI (Canadian Therapeutic Riding Instructor) since 1985. She recently qualified as a Canadian Therapeutic Riding Association (CanTRA) coach, the highest level of certification for therapeutic riding instructors in Canada.

Sonia became an examiner with CanTRA in 1991, travelling across Canada training and examining individuals who wish to become certified instructors. She was on the CanTRA Certification Committee and is past chair and a mem-

ber of both the Competition and Education committees. She also conducts insurance inspections at therapeutic riding centres around Ontario.

Sonia served on the CanTRA Board for nine years and on the OnTRA board for more than 10 years. In addition to her role as Vice President, she is chair for education, membership and special events.

Sonia is a volunteer instructor for CARD in Toronto where she started her career in therapeutic riding more than 30 years ago. She is also the Director of Therapeutic Riding for the Exhibition Therapeutic Riding Academy (ExTRA) which runs out of the Riding Academy at the Horse Palace at the CNE. It is Sonia's commitment to riders with disabilities which keeps her involved in therapeutic riding and involved in mentoring others who are looking to get certified.

John McClellan became a board member in 1998 where he served as treasurer for almost 10 years. He arrived at OnTRA at Karen's request and stayed on as he acquired a growing appreciation for therapeutic riding.

Gay Harper is a "CARD retired horse mother," who joined the CARD Board in 1990 at the invitation of the late Sandra Silcox. A fundraiser by profession, she drafted foundation and corporation proposals and helped to expand CARD's fundraising base.

Gay joined the OnTRA Board in 1995. She has served in many roles including: Fundraising Adviser

OEF Council Vice Chair
OEF Board of Directors.

After 13 years serving on the OnTRA Board she steps down from her current position as Secretary of OnTRA.
