

Assignment 27.1
Analysis: Schubert, "Der Lindenbaum" Ω (anthology)
Before listening to the song, read the poem by Wilhelm Müller (last page of score, p. 356), and number each strophe. Think about imagery that might be reflected in the music. Then listen to the song while following the score to see how Schubert's realization does or does not match what you anticipated.
A. Poetic structure

 - a. The beginning of each strophe or stanza (write strophe 1, strophe 2, etc.)

 - c. Mark the cadences (indicate type and key if not tonic)
 - d. Mark changes of key or mode
 - e. Mark large sections (use capital letters)

*Hint: There are 4 large sections, an introduction and a postlude
