# Program Request - Abbreviated Template Dixie State University Psychology Minor 07/17/2013

Section I: Request

Dixie State University (DSU) requests approval to offer a minor in Psychology, effective fall 2014 or the first full semester after approval. The minor requires foundational courses in Psychology as well as electives totaling 21 credits, 12 of which must be upper-division.

#### Section II: Need

Psychology is a popular area of study at DSU, which currently offers two Psychology baccalaureates. A minor would make this area of study accessible to even more students from other areas. The Psychology minor would be of particular use to students majoring in Criminal Justice, Education and Business, several of whom have requested this minor, but the study of Psychology supplements many other areas of study as well, including History, English, Art, Music, Theatre and the biological sciences.

All other baccalaureate-granting institutions in the Utah System of Higher Education offer majors, minors, and/or emphases in Psychology:

- University of Utah: Academic major and minor in Psychology
- Utah State University: Academic major and minor in Psychology
- Weber State University: Psychology major and minor, Integrated Studies emphasis in Psychology, and Psychology Teaching Minor
- Utah Valley University: Academic majors in Behavioral Science with an emphasis in Psychology, and Integrated Studies with an emphasis in Psychology
- Southern Utah University: Academic major and minor in Psychology

#### **Section III: Institutional Impact**

Because the Psychology major currently exists, there will be minimal institutional impact. All courses required or offered in the minor are offered as part of the major and are taught by qualified faculty with Ph.D.s. Full-time, tenure-track faculty teach the core and elective upper-division courses in addition to lower-division GE courses. As enrollment in the upper-division courses increases and additional sections become necessary, qualified adjunct faculty will be able to assist full-time faculty with some of the lower-division courses. Full-time faculty will continue to

teach lower division courses as part of their regular workload. Advising will be available through one full-time Advisor in psychology, an additional lecturer/advisor and Psychology faculty.

#### **Section IV: Finances**

There is minimal anticipated cost to the institution. Increased enrollment in upper-division Psychology courses would better utilize the staff and facilities devoted to those classes in support of the Psychology major. As enrollment in the upper-division courses increases, additional adjunct faculty will be hired to assist with some of the lower-division courses.
