

## **FROM POPE FRANCIS' ENCYCLICAL LETTER "LAUDATO SI** ON THE CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME"

# **Regarding "Continuity of Church** Teaching'

"Saint John Paul II became increasingly concerned about this issue. In his first Encyclical he warned that human beings frequently seem "to see no other meaning in their natural environment than what serves for immediate use and consumption". Subsequently, he would call for a global ecological conversion. At the same time, he noted that little effort had been made to "safeguard the moral conditions for an authentic human ecology". The destruction of the human environment is extremely serious, not only because God has entrusted the world to us men and women, but because human life is itself a gift which must be defended from various forms of debasement. Every effort to protect and improve our world entails profound changes in "lifestyles, models of production and consumption, and the established structures of power which today govern societies". Authentic human development has a moral character. It presumes full respect for the human person, but it must also be concerned for the world around us and "take into account the nature of each being and of its mutual connection in an ordered system". Accordingly, our human ability to transform reality must proceed in line with God's original gift of all that is." ~ 5

Our operational expenses average \$9,300 per week. Last weekend's contributions brought our shortfall to seven weeks behind our year-to-date budget objective. The parish councils and staff are currently evaluating necessary measures to eliminate this chronic weekly deficit.

### **The Christian Enrichment Corner is Back**

We have a fresh start for children and youth beginning Sunday, September 13, at 9:45AM in the Fr. Lacey Room. This first

session will be our student orientation day. We will pray, hand out copies of prayer books, establish class space, and discuss class rules. All children and youth registered in any of our Christian Enrichment sessions should plan to attend. Our final pre-registration day is August 17. We will have a sign-up table in the vestibule this weekend. Sign-up information is available in the vestibule in the information rack.

#### What is Christian Enrichment?

Christian Enrichment is the title we give for all of our sacrament preparation, on-going faith formation, RCIA/RCIA adapted for Children, and adult faith formation. We make available Scripture Study sessions, a Divine Mercy Prayer Group, Brews and Views, RCIA, and Eucharistic Adoration for adults. Our High School teens are encouraged to participate in our Confirmation Preparation sessions. Intermediate age and Middle School age children who have received First Holy Communion are invited to attend On-Going Faith Formation sessions. Adults wishing to enter more deeply into Catholic spirituality are may explore RCIA. Information about all of these different sessions is available at the Christian Enrichment Registration Table August 8 and 9.
