NEC 3 – overview and case studies on the engineering and construction contract

This presentation on NEC 3 will be given by Mr Calvin Cheuk, a barrister at Des Voeux Chambers, and Mr David Gibson of DGA (UK).

Calvin will present on:

- The overall structure of the Engineering and Construction Contract
- The duty to act, “in a spirit of mutual trust and co-operation”
- The meaning of “completion”
- Dispute resolution

David will present on the practical solutions to the top 10 issues that arise when using the NEC 3 “Option C” form of contract based upon his experience of managing large infrastructure projects in the UK.

About the speakers:

Calvin Cheuk was called to the Hong Kong Bar in 2005, after obtaining First Class Honours in both architecture and law at the University of Hong Kong and the Bachelor of Civil Law at the University of Oxford. In 2004, he also was awarded the Bar Scholarship.

Calvin’s practice has since developed to cover a broad range of areas, with special emphasis on construction/arbitration disputes as well as company/commercial matters. He is regularly instructed to appear in disputes relating to large construction or commercial projects in both Hong Kong, Macau and the PRC, including cross-harbour tunnel, casino development, coal mines, substantial commercial complex, hotels and residential properties. Apart from appearing in Courts and Tribunals of various levels, he is also regularly instructed to appear in arbitrations.

David Gibson is the CEO of DGA (UK) Limited which he founded in 1993. David has more than 30 years’ experience in the construction industry. David is a Fellow of the RICS, the Chartered Institute of Civil Engineering Surveyors and the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. Between 2000 and 2013, David provided commercial and programme management consultancy services on major infrastructure projects in the UK using the NEC Option C form of contract. These projects were: The Channel Tunnel Rail Link, The London Orbital Railway and Crossrail.

In March 2013, David relocated from London to open and manage the Hong Kong Branch Office. He has been providing claims management, commercial and programming services to clients in Asia.
