

This schedule is a reminder to parents regarding upcoming Virginia Standards of Learning (SOL) testing. Parents are asked to ensure children are in school, on time (by 9:00) on testing dates. We ask that students are well rested and prepared to do their very best on each test.

Testing is being done on computers. Once a testing session has begun, there cannot be any interruptions until everyone is finished testing. Therefore, we respectfully ask parents to refrain from scheduling appointments on testing dates. If your child is absent due to illness, they will complete a make-up test as soon as we can get it scheduled, but it must be within the state-wide testing window.

#### Nurse Notes

#### **Attention Parents of Rising 6th Grade Students**

The following are additional immunization requirements of rising sixth grade students:



- A Tdap (Diphtheria, Pertussis, and Tetanus) booster is required of students enrolling in grade six. This
  vaccination may be listed as T, Td, DTaP, and/or Tdap and should be within the last five years. Tdap can be
  given to student's age 10 or 11. Multiple vaccine preparations are available, if your health care provider does
  not carry the preparation for your student's age, you may call the health department for an appointment.
- A HPV (Human Pappillomavirus) vaccine is recommended for girls entering 6th grade. If the parent/guardian opts not to have his/her daughter vaccinated, the school division will not require parents/guardians to sign a waiver form and no documentation is needed. Sixth-grade girls who do not have proof of HPV vaccine administration will not be excluded from school.

Should you need assistance in obtaining the necessary immunizations for your child and/or health records, please call your child's physician or the Stafford County Health Department at (540) 659-3101. The Stafford County Health Department offers free immunizations every Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., appointments are required. Proof of required vaccinations is needed at your elementary school prior to the last day of school or to your middle school by August 1st.

Transportation, meals and supplies are provided. This program is open to children who are 3 or 4 years of age by September 30, 2012, live in Stafford County, and meet the federal incomeligibility guidelines. Enrollment is available to children regardless of race, sex, creed, national origin, or handicapping condition. #### The Art Scene

Kindergarten has been working on a paper collage artwork featuring a vase full of colorful flowers. This project has been the longest and most involved artwork thus far this year. They are turning out wonderful and just in time for Spring.

First graders have created an artwork inspired by the book "If the Dinosaurs Return." We painted skyscrapers and added colorful dinosaurs! Next, we began learning about the color spectrum and ROY G BIV – an acronym for the colors and the order of the colors in the rainbow. Their rainbow paintings are simply wonderful!

Second graders have experimented with painting Chinese characters using a bamboo brush! We have started a bamboo painting, as well, and you will see some Pandas coming home too! China is a lot of fun to learn about and so is the artwork inspired by Chinese culture.

Third, fourth and fifth graders have been diligently working on the tile mural which is on schedule to be installed over Spring Break by John Levesque of J.E.L. Tile. The mural will have large panels featuring four ecosystems. Students drew their ideas for each of the ecosystems in the size of the large panels, and I used as many of their drawings as I could combine into each large panel. The drawings were so wonderful that I could have created a huge mural for each ecosystem! Next, the drawings were transferred on to the tiles and the painting began! After painting of the tiles was completed, I glazed and fired the tiles. Border tiles were previously painted by the younger grades. Kindergarten painted striped tiles which create a lovely pattern. First graders used their fingers to paint flowers and second graders painted insects to continue the ecosystem theme. Once installed, the Ecosystem Mural will be a permanent addition of Community Art to our school!
