On Tuesday, September 15, "Student Fee Invoices" will be distributed to students. As of this date, parents will be able to view and pay student fee invoices online through the Powerschool Parent Portal (https://powerschool.eips.ca/public/home.html). Deadline for payment of student fees will be October 31, 2015. Current fees include a \$50.00 Learning Resource Fee (\$25.00 for Kindergarten), \$6.00 for an agenda, and noon supervision fees (if applicable). If you have difficulty accessing or setting up your parent portal account, please contact the school office.

This year the <u>James Mowat School Family Handbook</u> is included in each student's agenda. The handbook includes a wealth of information about the upcoming school year. Please go through the information with your child. A thorough familiarity with the information will be helpful to having a successful school year.

New Report Cards: A Pilot Year!

James Mowat School is pleased to be one of 11 schools within Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) piloting the new elementary report card this year. Developed by EIPS, the report card is exceptionally designed and intended to clearly communicate student achievement to parents and guardians. Long-term, the new report card will help to enhance the quality of education within EIPS by building strong partnerships among students, teachers, and parents.

As many of you know, EIPS established a Communicating Student Learning committee in 2014. The committee was made up of parents, teachers, administrators, trustees, and central office staff. Using feedback from close to 1,000 parents and 400 principals and teachers, the committee worked to create an innovative system, which reports academic achievement levels and learner attributes.

Similar to the previous report card, students will still be assessed in all areas of the current programs of studies. However, what will be new is the way student learning is reported. The current EPAL scale (excellent, proficient, acceptable and limited) will no longer be used. Instead, teachers will be using a clear and parent-friendly five-point numeric scoring scale to indicate student achievement. Additionally, the report card allows teachers to share personalized information about each student in relation to learner attributes, areas of strength, areas for growth, and next steps.

James Mowat School is excited about its new method of communicating student learning - it's innovative, inclusive, and based on what stakeholders have indicated they want to see in a reporting system. The 2015–2016 pilot is taking place in 10 other EIPS elementary schools. The full implementation of the report cards will take place in the 2016–2017 school year.

An information session about the report card and how students are being assessed will be held later this fall. The first report card will be sent home on Monday, November 23, 2015.

PowerSchool Correction Forms

On the first day of school, families will receive a PowerSchool Correction Form for each student enrolled in James Mowat School. The form ensures the school has the most up-to-date information regarding each of its students. When you receive the form, please review it carefully and make sure all the information in it is still correct. If any changes need to be made, please update it and add any new details you think necessary. All forms must be returned to the school by **Friday, September 4**. What is Numeracy?

Being numerate means having the confidence and skill to use numbers and mathematical approaches in all aspects of life - at work, in practical everyday activities at home and beyond, as consumers, in managing our finances, as parents helping our children learn, as patients making sense of health information, as citizens understanding the world about us.

Numeracy complements literacy and is sometimes called 'mathematical literacy'. Both skills are needed in order to function fully in modern life.

Being numerate means being able to reason with numbers and other mathematical concepts and to apply these in a range of contexts and to solve a variety of problems. Being numerate is as much about thinking and reasoning logically as about 'doing sums'.

- It means being able to:
- Interpret data, charts and diagrams
- Process information
- Solve problems
- Check answers
- Understand and explain solutions

At James Mowat Elementary, we will continue to focus on numeracy and creating mathematically literate students. The James Mowat staff and students would like to extend a HUGE thank you to Dow Chemical Canada ULC for an educational grant we received for our numeracy program. We received a donation of \$2500 to purchase teacher resources, classroom resources as well as manipulatives for our math room which will be used to help all students work on becoming more mathematically literate.

Drive - Thru Reminders

Please remember that there is no left turn out of the drive-thru between 8:15-8:45am and 3:00-3:30pm, when traffic congestion is at its worst.



Also, please do not park your vehicle or leave it unattended on the right hand side of the loop. This lane is intended to be a "drop off" zone only. Please keep traffic flowing by parking on the left side of the loop or on the street in front of the school. Thank you in advance for keeping the traffic flowing smoothly.





VOLUNTEERS All volunteers in the school are required to fill in a form. It will not be necessary to review the form with the administration this year if you volunteered last year in the school. If you are a new volunteer to the school we would like to meet briefly with you after you complete the form. All volunteers are asked to sign in at the office and to wear a volunteer badge (located at the office).

EARLY ARRIVALS Supervision is provided at the school beginning at 8:10 in the morning. If your child is dropped off earlier than this there is no supervision provided. (The bus students are an exception and will be allowed into the school). Students who go home for lunch are not to return to the school before 12:10pm as there is no supervision outside until this time.

LUNCHES AND CUTLERY Loss of school cutlery, due to students borrowing and not returning, is and has been an ongoing problem. Please ensure that your son or daughter has proper utensils, which will in turn minimize disruptions and monetary loss. Thank you.

DOGS We encourage you not to bring your dogs onto the school grounds when dropping off children in the mornings, at recess times, or when picking children up after school. Some children are very nervous and anxious around dogs and we want all the children to feel safe.

EARLY DISMISSALS A reminder that students will be dismissed early the first Wednesday of each month because of the monthly staff meeting. Classes will be dismissed at 2:05 p.m. There will be no kindergarten classes (AM and PM) on the first Wednesday of each month due to early dismissal.

EXACT CHANGE We are asking that parents send exact change for any transactions paid in cash this year (hot lunch, school fees, field trips, pictures, etc.). <u>Change will not be provided</u>. Thank you for your support and cooperation.

Dress Code Reminder

As weather continues to be sunny and warm we want to ask students and parents to please observe the dress code as per our student handbook: "Skimpy tank tops, halter tops, short shorts, half-shirts, short cut-offs and T-shirts with obscene, vulgar or inappropriate messages, and clothing which may offend others, are not appropriate. Students wearing inappropriate clothing will be asked to change. Makeup is not considered appropriate for elementary students. Shoes must be worn at all times. Each child needs two pairs of shoes, one for indoor use and one for outdoor wear. Indoor shoes should have soles that do not mark the floor."

Pay school fees easily using PowerSchool

The 2015–2016 school fee information will be available through PowerSchool beginning September 2. EIPS will send out student school fee invoices the **week of September 14**. To access your fee information, simply login to your Parent Portal account (https://powerschool.eips.ca/public/home.html) and click the green dollar sign symbol. Once logged in you will be able to view fees and have the ability to pay online using Visa, MasterCard, or INTERAC Online (if available from your financial institution).

Keep in mind, school fees may change. Junior high and senior high fees will change as courses are added and deleted. School fees may also be added to your child's account throughout the year for various school activities including field trips, class projects, athletic team fees, and more—so be sure to login to your account regularly in case new fees are added.

2015–2016 Grade 3 Student Learning Assessments Pilot

As many of you are aware, this fall Alberta Education will continue the Grade 3 Student Learning Assessment (SLAs) pilot. The pilot is mandatory for all Grade 3 students and will take place between September 14 and November 1. The assessments will focus on numeracy, literacy, and critical thinking; be digitally based; and offer an opportunity for students to show their learning in ways not possible with paper-based tests. The goal is to provide timely information to parents and teachers, help enhance classroom instruction, and ensure any student learning needs are identified.

Based on feedback from last year's Grade 3 SLAs pilot, Alberta Education has made a variety of revisions for this year's pilot, which include:

- Unlike the year previous, the 2015–2016 Grade 3 SLAs pilot will be mandatory for all Grade 3 students to ensure
 teachers, parents, and students have valid and reliable assessment information about strengths and weaknesses
 early in the school year. It will also ensure consistency for all Grade 3 students and assurance the education
 system is meeting the learning needs of students.
- The Grade 3 SLA pilot administration period for the digitally interactive questions will be from September 14 to October 9. The pilot administration for the performance task questions will be from September 14 to November 1. The earlier assessment will offer parents and teachers the opportunity to know a student's results sooner and allow teachers the flexibility to administer the assessments over a three-week period.
- Alberta Education will provide student results for the digitally interactive questions to schools, teachers, and parents by Nov. 16, 2015.
- The digital-numeracy component will focus more on basic math facts; performance tasks will be more streamlined; and accompanying materials, such as scoring rubrics, will be simplified.
- Student results for performance tasks will be reported only at the local school-authority level, and not to Alberta Education as was required in the first year of the pilot.

Video Surveillance on School Buses

Elk Island Public Schools Student Transportation would like to inform our parents and students using bus services that all EIPS buses are equipped with video surveillance equipment, which is in accordance with the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FOIP). The equipment records and stores several days of data and is reviewed regularly by Student Transportation staff who monitor both student and driver conduct. All video and audio recordings of individuals on school buses are for the safety and security of passengers, drivers, and property, and may be used as evidence in a disciplinary matter.

Update: Kindergarten Programming Survey

As many of you are aware, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) has been exploring the community's interest in a full-day Kindergarten program operating on alternating days. Over the past year, some parents within Sherwood Park and Fort Saskatchewan have posed questions regarding bus-ride times and transportation fees for Kindergarten students attending half-day Kindergarten programs, which are the predominant options in these communities. These questions led to discussions within the division about current Kindergarten programming offered within EIPS.

In late 2014, the Board of Trustees directed administration to complete public consultations within Sherwood Park and Fort Saskatchewan to determine the community's interest in a full-day Kindergarten program operating on alternating days. In the spring, the division conducted a series of focus groups—comprised of both teachers and parents—discussing the advantages and disadvantages of both a half-day program and an alternating full-day Kindergarten program. A survey followed, which gathered additional feedback from teachers, parents, community members, and staff within Sherwood Park and Fort Saskatchewan.

Overall, more than two-thirds of the 1,517 survey respondents agreed EIPS should explore offering more alternating full-day Kindergarten options in their communities. Close to two-thirds of the respondents indicated the division shouldn't eliminate the half-day program and only offer alternating full-day Kindergarten.

Based on all of the responses and suggestions gathered, the Board of Trustees has asked EIPS administration to further explore offering more alternating full-day programming in Sherwood Park and Fort Saskatchewan. As such, throughout the 2015-2016 school year, EIPS will be reviewing where additional alternating full-day programming possibilities may exist. EIPS will continue to keep families updated on any new developments.

Tips and guidelines for home-school communication

To enhance communication between families and schools, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) has recently developed a Communication Protocol for Schools document to provide a framework for communication between the school and our families. The purpose of this document is to guide, manage, and improve home-school communication by offering a standard format, structure, and sequence for regular, ongoing communication.

The document is a useful tool that outlines how schools within EIPS use a variety of communication formats, such as face-to-face meetings, email, Synrevoice, and social media. It also provides a process for parents or guardians to use if they need to bring forward a question or concern. We encourage families to review the document so they know what to expect and what we expect of families.

As communication changes, this document may also evolve. James Mowat School will work to keep parents informed as any processes evolve and change.
