Ourphilosophy

Our Philosophy:

Haslemere Preparatory School is a school where the individual is known and valued. We develop a thorough knowledge of the boys in our care and make it our goal to unlock their full potential. The following aims are central to what we are trying to achieve:

- To provide an education for boys characterised by quality, rigour and fun.
- To provide a broad and balanced education that will instil an enthusiasm for learning.
- To help Haslemere Preparatory School boys become well-rounded individuals equipped with the skills to be able to flourish at their senior schools and in their later lives.

The Four Quadrants of Learning:

We believe in joined-up learning. The education we offer will enable boys to develop life skills that will ensure they flourish at their senior schools and in later life. Our holistic approach develops the whole child through a broad and balanced education represented by four quadrants of learning.





The Academic Curriculum

Haslemere Preparatory School caters for a wide spectrum of academic ability. Small class sizes enable us to provide an education that is truly tailored to the needs of each child.

The school boasts an experienced, enthusiastic staff with a strong commitment to the benefits of boys' independent school education. Specialist subject teaching is introduced much earlier than in state primary schools. The knowledge and enthusiasm for their subject enables specialist teachers to inspire and accelerate a pupil's learning. The following academic subjects are taught by specialists at the school: English, Maths, Science, French, Latin, History, Geography and Religious Studies. Specialist ICT teaching is delivered from Nursery to Year 8.

Teachers at the school receive rigorous and regular training to support the delivery of a quality education.

The Early Years Foundation Stage, The National Curriculum and Independent Schools' Common Entrance syllabus form the basis of the school's curriculum, but each is strengthened and enhanced in many ways.

The school caters for the needs of academically able boys. In the last ten years academic scholarships have been gained at Charterhouse, and the Royal Grammar School, Guildford.

Specialist help is also offered to boys requiring support with their learning. Learning support is offered free of charge with the option for parents to pay for additional help. Building the self-esteem of the individual is a vital part of what this school is about. Each boy is known individually and the needs of every child in the school are regularly discussed by the whole staff.





The Value Added Curriculum

A broad and balanced curriculum enriches pupils' learning. We aspire to ensure pupils' educational experience in non-academic subjects is inspiring, varied and characterised by quality and fun.

A broad education provides individual pupils with the opportunity to discover and develop a range of skills and interests.

The school caters for all sporting abilities. Boys need plenty of energetic activity. A 'sports for all' philosophy provides every pupil with the opportunity to play in matches and develop the attributes that come with being part of a team. The school also prides itself on catering for and developing the skills of gifted sportsmen. Guided by expert coaches, our teams enjoy an impressive record on the sports field competing up to national level.

The Arts play a central role in school life and specialist music, art and drama teaching takes place throughout the school year. A number of quality performance opportunities arm boys with the confidence to enjoy expressing themselves in front of an audience. The end of year production includes every boy in Years 5-8 and richly deserves the reputation for quality it enjoys in the local area. Many pupils learn musical instruments and participate in ensemble groups and choirs. All boys are encouraged to perform in mini concerts and numerous other musical events.

An extensive selection of extra-curricular activities is available to pupils, from judo to golf, and eco activities to Science Club. The boys are also encouraged to suggest new clubs they would like offered.

A wide range of exciting educational trips is organised within the UK and overseas, including regular theatre and concert trips, sports tours and other day and residential trips. Popular activity weeks take place in the school holidays.







Our Community

One of the uniquely special facets of Haslemere Preparatory School is its strong sense of community. Visit the school and you will at once sense its warm, family atmosphere.

Parents, pupils, teachers and many others are encouraged to contribute towards the development of the school, via the school council and the environment committee (for the boys) and P.T.A. events for parents and staff.

We also aim to help pupils understand their responsibility to serve the wider community, developing worthwhile links with people and organisations both in and around Haslemere and in other parts of the world.

Nursery

Our Nursery is a happy, thriving community and an outstanding success. We welcome both boys and girls from the beginning of the term in which they turn three years old until they move on to join their Reception class.

We operate from a spacious and bright building within Haslemere Preparatory School's grounds. There is lots of equipment for large and small construction, messy play and role play to include all areas of learning and development: Personal, social and emotional development; Communication and language; Physical development; Literacy; Mathematics; Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design. In addition, we have our very own garden with climbing and ride-on equipment, sand and water play, an undercover outdoor classroom, a quiet book area, a role play area and a planting area.

We are also very much part of the main school, making use of the French room, the Performing Arts Studio and ICT suite for specialist teaching, in addition to music and movement classes with Suzie Songtime. Nursery and Reception children join together for twice weekly specialist P. E. lessons and enjoy regular use of the school's timber trail. One afternoon a week, Nursery children join with St Ives' Nursery for a fun and stimulating Forest School session.

Laying the Foundations for Future Learning:

Our qualified, experienced team plans in accordance with the 'Early Years Foundation Stage'. Our teaching combines child initiated play with more structured topic based activities such as display work, cookery and preparing for our sports morning and Christmas nativity play. Throughout their time with us, we ensure your child is nurtured and cared for, supporting them in their playing and exploring, their active learning and their creative and critical thinking, whilst building the necessary skills they require for the future.

Our Ethos:

We offer a happy, safe and stimulating environment where children can learn and grow as individuals. With an emphasis on good manners, classroom skills and learning through exploration, your girls and boys leave us happy and confident to face the challenges that await them.

- After school care including snack 3.00pm 6.00pm chargeable in half hour slots.
- Full wrap around all day 8.00am 6.00pm including am and pm snack and hot lunch.







Admissions

Reception to Year 8:

We are proud of the fact that we are a non-selective school, and we believe that this ethos encourages parents from a wide range of social backgrounds to send their boys here. We accept boys into any year group, although the most usual entry points are Reception and Year 3.

In the first instance, parents who are considering Haslemere Preparatory School or the Nursery for their child should contact our Admissions Registrar, to arrange to visit the Headmaster and take a tour of the school once registered. They are then invited to send their son for a 'taster morning' during which he will share a normal school day/morning with boys in his age group. This enables parents and boys to gain first hand insight into what the school offers and allows us to assess whether we shall be able to meet the boy's educational needs. If a child is seeking entry into Year I or above, a copy of his most recent school report will be requested. A place is offered on the basis of the assessment undertaken on the taster morning, the most recent school report and any other information that helps determine whether a boy's needs can be met at Haslemere Preparatory School.

Nursery:

Girls and boys are accepted into the Nursery from the beginning of the term in which they turn three years old and may join us at any time during the year. Please contact the Admissions Registrar, if you would like to bring your child for a visit; we will be delighted to show you our facilities and answer any queries you may have.

Before and after School Care is provided each day:

Breakfast club runs from 7:30am each morning and costs £3 per day.

For boys in Reception to Year 8, they can remain at school for clubs, prep and after school care until 6pm. There is no charge for after school care and prep and the majority of clubs until 5.00pm. Thereafter there is a £6 charge as tea will be provided along with supervision until 6pm. After 6pm, the charge for all boys is £10 per 15 minutes or part thereof.




How to find us
