WHERE: North Dakota State University - Memorial Union, Fargo

<u>ABOUT THE WORKSHOP</u>: This **FREE EVENT** is open to the first 125 fifth graders and their teachers within Fargo and surrounding communities to respond. Real World Camp will offer participants a first-hand look at life through five hands-on break-out sessions that resemble a stroll through the "Real World" and allow students to make financial decisions that will affect their daily lives. The free event includes materials, t-shirt, and lunch.

**<u>CURRICULUM</u>**: Teachers are asked to complete the registration form. <u>Select your top three out of five lessons by placing</u> <u>an "X" by the session name</u>. In case a particular lesson is full, please provide us with one other lesson topic option by placing an "A" by the session name so we can assign your class accordingly if sessions are full.

## The Five Curriculum Options Include (select your top three):

**1. Capital One Smart Money Quiz Show-**Similar to Jeopardy, students start out with \$10,000 in debt. If they answer the questions correctly, they decrease their debt. Students learn how to manage their own money to "get out of debt" and stay out of debt.

\_\_\_\_\_2. Keeping Your Balance-Students receive Occupation Cards and observe how different jobs provide different monthly salaries. Based on these monthly salaries, students evaluate the opportunity cost of their decisions to form a budget.

\_\_\_\_\_3. Choose Your Success-Student play a board type game in which the connection between personal finance, education and career options is demonstrated. Students will be able to identify the link between the three and apply decision making skills.

**\_\_\_\_\_4. Savvy Shopper** - Students will discuss the advantages and disadvantages of using cash or credit and play a game that reinforces their understanding of the cost of credit and opportunity costs. They will also learn how to identify appropriate situations to use cash and credit.

**\_\_\_\_\_5. Survivor Island**-Students will discuss the difference between needs and wants. They will determine the role money plays in setting priorities and identify their needs in order of importance. A role play/case study in which students are considered a family that has to live on a secluded island and need to determine what they family needs to survive and how to spend their limited funds.

**ABOUT THE WORKSHOP CURRICULUM AND PRESENTERS:** The curriculum used for this workshop is material provided by Junior Achievement, the American Bankers Association and other organizations. Presenters are individuals from the financial service industry – Credit Unions, Banks, and Financial Counselors for example.
