STAFF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT ... Participating in the course at the beginning of the year means that the teaching staff benefit from the training *now* rather than attending a School Development Day at the end of Term 4.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURE :- During the week all staff and students were involved in our Term 1 **Emergency Evacuation Procedure**. With it now being autumn and as we head towards winter I reminded students that they need to check if they and all Huntington families have an emergency evacuation plan at home, especially in case of fire during the night.

We discussed the importance of installing smoke alarms and if there's a fire to get 'low and go, go, go! At school they know where we go to assemble to ensure everyone is safe but they also need a plan at home. Several years ago one of our families unfortunately had part of their house burn down due to an electrical fault and luckily everyone escaped without any injury.





Reading Eggs, ZIP-tales, Mathletics and **ZOO-Whiz** are just some examples of the programs that our school, together with the financial help of our enthusiastic P & C committee, make available to all of our students.

It's really interesting listening to some of our new families and how amazed they are at how **little** we ask our families to contribute towards the costs we incur in providing our students with everything they need to be successful at school. We have never asked our students to bring in boxes of tissues or photocopy paper!

Unfortunately, the cost of purchasing students' text books and students' work books, as well as photocopying their daily work sheets and providing them with stationery and other items continue to rise. We aim to provide our students with quality work books and stationery items and this includes the materials they need for their art and craft work. In order to enable us to continue to provide these items to all of our students we need **all** families to kindly assist us by paying their annual **School Book and Stationery Fee** which is set at \$40.00 per student this year. This amount does not necessarily have to be paid in full, payment by instalments is acceptable. That's just \$10.00 per term!

Nutrition Snippet

The simplest way

...to bake a healthy lunch box treat.

Homemade muffins are a great way to add a fruit or veg-filled treat to lunch boxes.



Apple and date muffins

Ingredients: 3 apples, chopped; 1 cup boiling

water; 200g dates, chopped; 50g butter; 2/3 cup brown sugar; 2 tsps mixed spice; 1 egg; 1 tsp baking soda; 1 tsp baking powder; 2 cups wholemeal flour.

Method: Preheat oven (180°C). Chop apples and dates. Add boiling water, butter and sugar. Mix until butter melts and sugar dissolves. Add spice and allow to cool. When fruit mixture is warm, not hot, add spice and egg. Mix well. Add baking soda, baking powder and flour. Mix, but do not overbeat. If mixture is too dry, add a little milk. Spoon into the prepared muffin tin. Bake for about 15 minutes.
