

42nd Annual ACCT Leadership Congress

October 12-15 • Dallas

Information is Power: fostering sustainability and student success" is the theme of the 42nd Annual ACCT Leadership Congress, to be held Oct. 12-15 in Dallas. Every year, more than 1,000 community college trustees and presidents convene at the ACCT Leadership Congress, the largest international meeting of its kind.

"Everyone is talking about student success and completion these days—and for good reason," ACCT President and CEO J. Noah Brown said. "ACCT is putting that talk into action with a number of unprecedented projects."

One of those projects is the lauded Governance Institute for Student Success, a state-based initiative supported by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and in partnership with the University of Texas at Austin's Community College Leadership Program, which brings together college trustees and presidents to evaluate their colleges' effectiveness and set goals and processes for improvement.

The project with the longest history is the ACCT Leadership Congress itself. Last year, ACCT hosted the first-ever Summit on Completion in Toronto, which brought together community college trustees and presidents, policy makers, and other thought leaders to deliberate on concerted actions that can be taken to advance the completion agenda. This October 11, immediately before the ACCT Leadership Congress, ACCT will host a follow-up Symposium on Student Success. While this Symposium is by invitation only, presentations, sessions, and workshops throughout the October 12-15 ACCT Leadership Congress will give all attendees the opportunity to participate in the completion dialogue and gather new information and ideas to bring back to their home colleges.

The 2011 ACCT Leadership Congress will feature about 100 sessions organized around six tracks: financial reality, workforce demand, institutional accountability/effectiveness, equity and

diversity, sustainability, and effective governance. Three pre-Congress academies will offer educational and information-sharing opportunities on effective board governance, presidential contracts, and how to be an effective board chair.

While the primary audience for ACCT remains the community college trustee, the ACCT Leadership Con-


gress and annual Community College National Legislative Summit draw large numbers of college presidents and other leaders to learn about effective governance and advocacy.

"ACCT is excited and proud to play such a significant role in the community college completion movement," Brown said. "This October, we will be taking great strides in moving the completion conversation into action. We look forward to the participation of the trustees, presidents and other community college leaders, as well as federal and state legislators who will be in Dallas to listen to one another and make sure their own voices are heard."

In addition to the Annual ACCT Leadership Congress, ACCT offers a number of leading educational events and services for boards and executive community college leadership. Each February, more than 1,000 community college trustees, presidents and other leaders convene in Washington, D.C. for the annual Community College

National Legislative Summit to determine legislative priorities, learn about successful advocacy, and meet face-to-face with their federal representatives and members of their staffs. And in addition to the Washington and Texas Governance Institutes for Student Success, ACCT will have hosted three Governance Leadership Institutes by the end of 2011, including special institutes for new trustees and related to diversity. ACCT also recently launched a successful series of Virtual Leadership Academy webinars for aspiring community college presidents and currently is developing a series of state-of-the-art educational webinars for community college trustees to complement its existing educational events, services and publications.

Learning College Summit

June 10-13, 2012 • Phoenix

The League for Innovation in the Community College will hold its annual Learning College Summit June 10-13, 2012, at the Arizona Biltmore in Phoenix. Plans are under way for this gathering of educators who are committed to a deliberate, powerful focus on learning at their institutions. The Learning College Summit is designed to benefit colleges that are beginning the journey toward becoming more learning-centered as well as veteran learning colleges that are well on their way.

Terry O'Banion, president emeritus of the League for Innovation and senior advisor, Higher Education Programs, at Walden University, will lead the opening plenary session at the 2012 Learning College Summit. His book, *A Learning College for the 21st Century* (Oryx Press, 1997), was pivotal in launching a movement, particularly among community colleges, to strengthen and intensify the focus on learning in postsecondary institutions. O'Banion has written and spoken extensively on the Learning College, and is currently examining the role of learning in the student completion agenda.

The Learning College Summit is a working retreat for college teams to connect with colleagues and to share experiences, discuss issues and explore strategies for overcoming obstacles and meeting challenges related to learning. Participants examine effective practices in crafting a culture of learning; aligning quality, inquiry, and accountability with student learning and success; establishing learning outcomes and assessment in all areas of the college; engaging students from recruitment to completion and lifelong learning; and designing and creating environments for learning.

Each year, the summit is organized around five topics. After an opening plenary session on the first evening, the program devotes a half-day to each topic over the next two-and-a-half days. An interactive symposium kicks off each half-day session, followed by a set of concurrent forums led by community college educators and scholars. Summit participants are engaged as full partners in the Summit since plenary and concurrent sessions are designed to be interactive.

The half-day session ends with

"Conversations about Learning," time designated for college teams to meet and discuss what they have learned and how it may apply to their institutions. Individual participants who are not with a college team are invited to join a facilitated conversation during this time. For those who wish to use it, a conversation guide is provided in the summit binder, which also includes the program and other resources related to the learning college.

Evaluation ratings and comments indicate that participants appreciate the summit format and content. One summit participant wrote, "Please keep the format as is for future summits. Our team thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to share and reflect on each ses-

sion." A veteran participant commented that, "The opportunity to work with our team...was truly invaluable. This is always a productive experience." One participant described the summit as "intense and thought-provoking," while another wrote, "I learned a lot. I was inspired." Still another said, "I look forward to making this my standing annual event."

The League has arranged for a special room rate for summit participants at the historic Arizona Biltmore. Opened in 1929, this "Jewel of the Desert" is renowned for its Frank Lloyd Wright-inspired design, and rests on 39 acres at the foot of the Phoenix Mountain Preserve. Panoramas of majestic Piestewa Peak are a backdrop for its elegant, relaxed atmosphere. Centrally located just eight miles from Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport, and with outstanding service, comfortable space, and striking architecture, the Arizona Biltmore provides a distinctive setting for the Learning College Summit.

Summit registration covers all sessions, the opening reception, three continental breakfasts and two luncheons.

After a full day of learning, summit participants can take advantage of the complimentary chartered evening shuttle to explore dining, shopping, and entertainment options in the Phoenix Biltmore and Old Town Scottsdale areas.



The Impact of Entrepreneurship

Oct. 9-12 • Portland, Ore.

Entrepreneurship education is taking hold at community colleges across the country, with hundreds of schools providing visionary leadership in this important and increasingly popular educational field. Local, regional and state efforts to foster entrepreneurship have grown substantially in the wake of the recession, prompting numerous community colleges to expand their traditional role of workforce development to include providing support for people who want to start and build businesses.

Entrepreneurship efforts at two-year schools range from traditional classroom courses in both credit and credit-free programs to more adventurous offerings such as student business incubators, virtual incubators for community businesses, micro loans and venture capital funds, and mentorship programs that match students and community members with local entrepreneurial role models.

"Entrepreneurship education at community colleges really started catching fire in the past decade, and the recession and the lingering high unemployment rate provided strong

impetus for more schools to get involved with preparing people to create a job instead of taking a job," says Heather Van Sickle, executive director of the National Association for Community College Entrepreneurship (NACCE), a nonprofit founded in 2002 at Springfield Technical Community College in Springfield, Mass. With the collective goal of providing quality programs and services in entrepreneurship education, NACCE partners with educators, entrepreneurs, and distinguished business development professionals. Together, they also serve as advocates of community-based entrepreneurship.

As the only organization solely focused on advancing entrepreneurship in the two-year college arena, NACCE serves as the hub for the dissemination and integration of knowledge and successful practices regarding entrepreneurship education and student business incubation.

The organization held its inaugural conference in 2003. Each succeeding annual conference has attracted an ever-larger group of college presidents, administrators, and faculty as well as

community leaders charged with making entrepreneurship happen in their regions. The 9th Annual NACCE Conference, to be held October 9-12, 2011 under the banner of "The Impact of Entrepreneurship," is expected to draw about 450 people.

"Our conference has become a must event for anyone interested in learning from hundreds of community college leaders and professionals on how to impact a community's economic future," said Van Sickle.

NACCE's vision of "creating economic vitality through entrepreneurship" has attracted a constantly growing body of over 1,200 members since the organization began signing up members in 2006. NACCE now represents nearly 300 institutions and its reach includes seven countries on four continents. In addition to its Annual Conference, NACCE's membership benefits include a highly regarded quarterly journal, *Community College Entrepreneurship*; popular monthly webinars and podcasts; a dynamic list-serve; best practices booklets and other resources.

"Community colleges are a natural place for fostering entrepreneurship

because they tend to be entrepreneurial themselves," said Van Sickle. "Community colleges generally take more risks than four-year schools in their program offerings and in the types of students they admit. They are often quicker to make decisions and open to trying nontraditional approaches. Community colleges also tend to be closer to the community and therefore closer to the evolving needs of students and local economies. This has been especially apparent in the wake of the recession, where school after school has stepped in to help their communities with a wide variety of entrepreneurship education programs designed to spur economic growth."

In the past several years, NACCE has expanded its reach by partnering with other organizations to make sure community colleges are part of the discussion about how to encourage and support entrepreneurship nationwide. Here are two examples of how NACCE is supporting its members through key relationships:

- NACCE is a founding member of the White House-initiated Startup

America Partnership, a coalition of mentors, advisors, funders, major corporations and service providers that delivers strategic and substantive resources to help entrepreneurs start and scale companies.

- NACCE has partnered with the Direct Selling Education Foundation, a nonprofit public education organization affiliated with the Direct Selling Association, to develop the curriculum for a non-credit program for a Direct Selling Entrepreneur Certificate that will be made available to community colleges across the country. Direct selling is a traditional pathway to entrepreneurship.
