Amniotic fluid is the liquid that surrounds the fetus during <u>pregnancy</u> (懷孕), and during an embolism it enters the mother's bloodstream and triggers an allergic reaction, resulting in heart and lung failure.

They will be exchangeable for compact fluorescent bulbs valued at up to HK\$100 at registered retailers from February 1 until the end of 2011. The shops taking part in the scheme will be announced later.

As a result of the move, CLP Power, who supply to Kowloon and the New Territories, and Hongkong Electric will charge an additional 50 and 60 HK cents respectively for each <u>kilowatt-hour</u> (千瓦時,一度 電(電的能量單位))of electricity.

Supplementary Note: Four Dutch tourists - two men and two women in their fifties - were killed in the scenic town of Yangshuo in Guangxi when a hot-air balloon burst into flames and plummeted 150 metres to the ground. The victims were among a group of seven people including five Dutch nationals who had ascended in the balloon for an aerial view of Yangshuo's famed karst hills, Xinhua reported. The two Chinese pilots lost control of the balloon, the report said. It then burst into flames and crashed to the ground. The others aboard the balloon were taken to hospital.
