Recently, during our Wednesday evening and Sunday morning worship services, our Gospel lessons have been with Jesus after he has entered into Jerusalem for the final time and after he has cleansed the temple of the money changers and all of what got in the way of worshiping God Yahweh. The chief priest, elders, and the Pharisees have been looking for a way for Jesus to be arrested and finally quieted in whatever way. This was evident as they asked Jesus "Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?" Jesus, aware of their malice and intent, picks up a denarius coin and asked "Whose head is this and whose title?" When they respond "the emperor," Jesus tells them, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's and to God the things that are God's." What Jesus shares with the religious leaders of his day has been used to help define the "separation of church and state." What I would like for us to consider is how what Jesus says to the religious leaders, the disciples, and to us can help us bring what belongs to God in everything and see how that can be applied to what is of the emperor or of the government. This month of November, we have several opportunities to take what belongs to God and to apply that to what belongs to the government.



Tuesday, November 4, throughout the United States, is Election Day. As we approach Election Day, we


may have come to our own personal conclusions to the electoral process for particular candidates to receive our vote for their election. Before we are quick for the mute button on the television remote control whenever there is an electoral advertisement, what can help us when we come to Election Day is to look at those particular electoral races we have an interest in and see where the candidates stand upon those issues that are important to us, especially in our Christian faith. As we become more informed about those candidates who we are interested in, we take what is everything from God and pray for the Holy Spirit to guide us in how we vote come Election Day. Then, when the candidates are elected, we continue to pray for the Holy Spirit to help guide them, as we share with those newly elected what our personal concerns and interests are through communicating with them and supporting them throughout their terms in office.

Thursday, November 27, throughout the United States, is Thanksgiving Day. This annual holiday of thanks has a rich history in the government, with the observance of an annual Thanksgiving Day beginning with President Lincoln; dates were changed with President Franklin Roosevelt; and finally, placing this day on the fourth Thursday of November was made by a vote from Congress in 1941. How we can take everything that belongs to God to this annual holiday that was put into place by the government is to observe Thanksgiving by actively giving thanks and praise to God for everything that we have and continue to receive from our Lord and Creator. At St. John, we will have that opportunity during our Thanksgiving Eve Worship Service, Wednesday, November 26, at 7:15 pm, where we will focus

upon the Scripture texts for Thanksgiving Day and give thanks and praise to God for everything, as we come to our Savior Jesus both in God's Word and in the celebration of Holy Communion. Before the All of what is Thanksgiving for each of us and our families and friends, let us start this day of thanks right the night before, as we come in thanks and praise to God for everything that we have and continue to receive.



May our Lord God bless us with everything that comes from our Creator, especially on our Election Day and then bless and guide those who are elected with the Holy Spirit. May our Lord and God bless us with everything that comes from our Creator, especially on Wednesday, November 26 and Thanksgiving Day, as we come in thanks and praise for everything we have from our God. May we find new ways to give to what is of the "emperor" or the government in our vote, prayer and support for those elected and in our thanks and praise as we prepare for All of Thanksgiving Day from everything that comes from God!

JAMAICA MISSION IN "GREAT SHAPE!"

Happily, we all have special parts of our lives. These "parts" are things that we love to be a part of, love to participate in and love to share. Some of these are our families, our faith, our friends, our extra activities....

My story of "Great Shapes, Jamaica!" is one of those very special parts of my life that I'd love to share with you. Seven years ago, Susan and I traveled to Jamaica to celebrate our anniversary. Of course, we were additionally taking advantage of a dental continuing education class! In that week, we literally fell in love with the people of Jamaica. Our experiences with meeting a few Jamaicans were so very special! When two of our new friends asked us "to come back to help Jamaica"..... We both took this invitation very seriously. (We later were told this was a great compliment....to be asked!)

After our return to Louisville, I began to explore ways to return to Jamaica. While I found outreach opportunities to Guatemala, Haiti and Dominican Republic (to name a few), I was at first unable to find a way to help Jamaicans. I believe passionately that indeed "prayers are answered" (even though the answers we sometimes get....aren't necessarily the ones we want!)......my prayers WERE answered!

My great friend, Dr. Joe Schmidt, phoned me at my office, ironically just as I was checking our daily mail. As I opened the <u>ADA News</u>, I picked up his phone call as he excitedly asked me to turn to page 11 and look at the "Great Shapes, Jamaica!" Dental outreach project! The rest is history, so to speak!

Susan and I have returned to contribute and participate in 13 weeks total of dental treatment and dental hygiene care for four different rural parishes (counties) in Jamaica, over the past 6 years. Typically during a project week, approximately eight dentists, 10-12 dental hygienists and another 50 or so other project participants contribute to our successes. I won't attempt to tell you the history and "story" of Great Shapes, Jamaica! I will ask you to explore my friends, by checking out: www.gsjamaica.org where you can learn about this wonderful organization.

Our project name is called "1000 Smiles!" and we provide services to any children or adults in need during our project. Additionally, we are involved in the largest "Dental Sealant Project" in the world. The application of sealants in the permanent molars of children is an incredible, preventive dental service—preventing a large percentage of cavities which would occur in the deep grooves of "unsealed" back, permanent teeth.

If this story inspires you, or if your research at www.gsjamaica.org moves you to contribute or investigate other ways you may participate, PLEASE contact me at any time. I passionately believe that this is "a mission of my life." Once again this year I returned (this time from Westmoreland Parrish in rural southwest Jamaica) really exhaustedyet renewed! We did some good! Now, 6 weeks later: When I think about "1000 Smiles!"......I already can't wait to get back to work!

Lutheran Where God is doing new things

Now to the One who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen -Ephesians 3:20-21, NRSV



When I was campus pastor at Penn State University I enjoyed the bold, confident declarations of team identity that would erupt at home sporting events. One side of the arena or stadium would shout with one voice, "WE ARE!" and the other side would respond with equal vigor, "PENN STATE!" Back and forth it would go, sometimes for minutes at a time, filling the stadium with boisterous proclamation for all to hear, often when the team needed it most: "WE ARE...PENN STATE! WE ARE...PENN STATE!"

I was reminded of this energetic collegiate phenomenon at a Region 6 ELCA Networks for Mission event in October. Nearly 100 folks from the six synods that encompass Ohio, Michigan, and Indiana-Kentucky gathered in Perrysburg, OH for two and a half days of worship and fellowship, learning and growth. About eight of us attended from the IN-KY mission territory. The inspiring event included worship, multi-session tracks for synod network leaders (and others interested in networks, such as Global Mission, Mission Interpretation, Malaria Campaign, World Hunger, Lutheran Disaster Response, etc.), skill development workshops (e.g. social media, community organizing skills, etc.), small group discussions in synod groups, and plenary presentations (e.g. Campaign for the ELCA). The final morning Bishop Eaton presented a helpful keynote on the transforming power of networks from the apostle Paul to today, followed by a question and answer session with the synod bishops present.

At the beginning of her Saturday morning keynote, Bishop Eaton referenced the four themes that shape her ministry as presiding bishop these days. As she began to recite the first, someone near the front said we could say them with her. "Really?" Bishop Eaton asked. "Okay, let's give it a try."

"We are..." she began tentatively. "CHURCH!" the gathered folks shouted.

"We ARE," our bishop ventured, a little bolder. "LUTHERAN!" was the instant response.

Confident now, the bishop cried: "WE ARE"

"CHURCH TOGETHER!"

One more time, "WE ARE!"

"CHURCH FOR THE SAKE OF THE WORLD!!"

As our cheerleading bishop chuckled with delight, I thought, "There it is, bold, boisterous, confident, clear declaration of who we are and what we are about, just when we need it most: We are...church...Lutheran...church together...church for the sake of the world."

As we move through the month of Thanksgiving, I find myself particularly grateful that we are church together, sisters and brothers. Now into my fifth year as your bishop, I see more clearly than ever that we are able to do so much more together than any of us could dream of doing on our own. As we share our energy, our resources, our faith, our common commitment to sharing and embodying the good news of Jesus, keeping our eyes on what unites us more than on what divides us, amazing things happen. As we each offer our particular loaves and fishes, Jesus multiplies them, and, by the power of the Spirit, we offer to the world unexpected, overflowing abundance.
