- 8. Audition on Thursday, April 28 2016.

Please make sure that any individual who is providing a letter or transcript for your application is aware of the deadlines listed above.

You will receive a confirmation letter acknowledging receipt of your application. Auditions will be held on Thursday, April 28 in the Cultural Arts Center, 1103 Glenn St. Opelika. Parents and friends are invited to attend the presentation as well, and refreshments will be served. On the night of auditions, you will have five minutes to demonstrate your talent. If you are competing in two art forms, you may have an additional two minutes, for a maximum of seven minutes. A piano will be available for use, but there is no microphone or sound system and singers may <u>not</u> use recorded music. Those auditioning in dance may use pre-recorded selections, but must provide their own music player with speakers. Those auditioning in creative writing/literary arts must recite an original work, and provide written copies (3) of their work for the judges.
