- + At the Gathering you will explore the meaning of love as you consider that each participant is a "Beloved" child of God and a part of God's whole community of believers. ("See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!" 1 John 3:1)
- + You will look at the idea of being "deloved" and how sin separates us from the love of God and twists and distorts our lives with all kinds of temptations and cravings. (As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. Ephesians 2:1-2)
- + You will be reassured of God's love in Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection as you consider "LOVE Lived" and how Christ is the embodiment of God's love, truly the love of God in flesh and blood. (Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life. Romans 6:3-4)
- + "Live LOVED" considers our Christian identity formation begun in baptism when God lays His claim on us in water and Word and we become children of God. (But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. This is a trustworthy saying. Titus 3:4-8a)
- + Which brings us to "Live LOVE" where you will consider how we live for Jesus, empowered by His Spirit and live out acts of service which He has prepared for us. (This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters. 1 John 3:16)



L.S.S. NEWS

WEDGEWOOD SOUTH: The month of May ended with a full house of 49 residents. We have had 19 inquiries/tours during the month. At present, we have 47 residents with one moving in tomorrow. Everything is going well.

HEALTH FOR FRIENDS: The clinic numbers are up, and the outreach sites are seeing more clients also. Total clients screened in the month of May is 685. Twenty-two boxes of glucose test strips were distributed with 21 people being on the glucose test strip program. The number of first-time clients seen is 18 and there were 4 newly diagnosed diabetic patients.

NEIGHBORHOOD HOUSE: Utility assistance was distributed to 245 during the month, for a total of \$56,468. We gave out less food vouchers this month, as 126 were distributed, but that is expected to rise now that school is out. Additional funds have been received for the utility assistance program, with a portion also going for program costs. So far this year, we have served 565 for the first time ever...The dollar value of services, so far this year, is \$195,132.

FOSTER CARE/ADOPTION: The current census is 62, which is over the budgeted census. We have 21 families that are licensed with us and 5 families pending certification. We are still working on building up a kinship program through our office. Kinship families must have children in their care that have an open case with CPS. We are planning our end of summer swim party for all of our foster kids.

SPRING FLING: Net earnings from the Spring Fling were \$52,008. The date for the 2014 Spring Fling will be June 6. It will be held at the Frazier Alumni Center on the Texas Tech Campus.


THRIVENT NEWS

SPIRIT SNACKS


Bring joy to a friend by sharing a "peace" of this yummy dessert!

- two 8" cake pans
- cooking spray
- 9 cups mini marshmallows
- 6 tablespoons butter
- food coloring (green and red)
- 9 cups crisp rice cereal
- mini chocolate chips

What you do:

- 1. Spray cake pans.
- 2. Melt 4 cups marshmallows and 2 T. butter in microwave or on stove top. Add green food coloring. Stir.
- 3. Pour 4 cups cereal into bowl. Add green mixture. Stir with buttered spatula.
- 4. Put half into each pan and press along the sides with buttered hands.
- 5. Repeat using 5 cups marshmallows, 4 T. butter, 5 cups cereal and red food coloring.
- 6. Press half into the center of each pan, leaving a narrow outside border of green. Smooth the top.
- 7. Press mini chocolate chips into the red mixture.
- 8. Let cool. Then cut into wedges. Enjoy!


