## Health Nugget

"Did you know that the use of fabric softeners and dryer sheets can cause cancer, neurological disorders, and other serious diseases? The majority of Americans use fabric softeners to make their clothes soft and smell fresh, but what most do not realize is that the chemicals contained in these products have definitively been linked to various cancers and brain damage. In fact, they are actually so pungent, that fabric softeners often contain 50 times as much fragrance as other products just to cover up the strong odor produced by these chemicals. It would be wise to research the products we use in our homes, and those willing to take the time to do so will be quite startled by what they discover. The chemicals used in fabric softeners include benzyl acetate, ethanol, chloroform, ethyl acetate, pentane, and camphor. Each of these has been linked to conditions such as pancreatic cancer, respiratory disease, and central nervous system disorders. They remain in our clothing and are absorbed through the skin or by inhalation. While most accept the benefits touted by advertising that encourages us to use such products, in reality they are compromising their lives and the lives of their loved ones by doing so. Good health is always a choice, but when you consider the value of having soft clothing, you may also want to consider the dangers.
