

This program has been designed so that students can begin at any point, or skip around through the material as desired. However, if you've just finished studying the S=V (subject-verb agreement) point, the following S=P (subject-pronoun agreement) point will be easy. There are fewer rules, and the rules are the same as the previous S=V rules. Subordination is still important when analyzing S=P errors; separate your clauses to correctly identify which pronoun refers to which subject, then check the agreement.

Before we begin our study of **S=P** errors, let's take a look at the various forms of pronouns. The following chart classifies all of the pronouns in English by their form (only the demonstrative pronouns, *this, that, these,* and *those* are not included) Refer often to this chart until the pronouns become familiar. This will also be important for the following **PFR** (pronoun form or reference) point.

The concept of subject-pronoun agreement is the same as that of subject-verb agreement. As mentioned, the rules are the same, but fewer. However, S=P errors can still be somewhat more difficult than S=V errors for one important reason: when checking the subject-verb agreement, there is only one singular or plural verb form from which to choose. But, when checking the subject-pronoun agreement, there are several singular choices from which to choose. We must think not only in number, but also  $\mathcal{P}$  gender, form, and reference. Let's begin with a few examples of S=P errors. Try to find the subject-pronoun agreement errors in the following five sentences.

- 1. Neither of the girls in my school has their own car.
- 2. The coach as well as the players is in their office.
- 3. Either Fernando or Eduardo should have brought their watch.
- 4. Each of the students has their credential.
- 5. All of the library books have its own identification number.

#### **RULES FOR SUBJECT-PRONOUN AGREEMENT**

 Words which end in "one", "body", or "thing", even though plural in meaning, take singular verbs (see rule number ten under "Singular Verbs"). Singular pronouns are also used to refer to these words.
For example:

*Everybody* at the conference receives **his** certificate today.

*Everything* should be put in **its** proper place.

Remember, in Spanish you don't distinguish between masculine and feminine gender when choosing a possessive pronoun; in English you must. For example, the pronoun *su* could be translated to *his* or *her*, depending on the appropriate gender.

#### SUBJECT-PRONOUN AGREEMENT

2. When two subjects are joined by *and* (unless preceded by *each* or *every*), a plural verb is required (see rule two under "Plural Verbs"). Plural pronouns are also used in this case.

For example:

Both Cristal and Edna are doing their homework.

Pedro and I are taking our cars.

Let's test our understanding of these two rules before continuing with the last two.

#### S=P RULES CONTINUED

3. *Either...or, neither...nor,* and *not only...but also* are correlative conjunctions that introduce two subjects. The verb (see rule eight under "Singular or Plural Verb") and the pronoun agree with the closest (second) subject.

For example:

*Either* my mom *or* my **dad** left <u>his</u> keys on the table.

Not only the senators but also the **president** will give his speech tonight.

4. Collective nouns (such as *family, team, police, class, audience, faculty,* etc.) can be used in a plural or singular form. If the verb is singular, use a singular pronoun. If the verb is plural, use a plural pronoun (see rule two under "Singular or Plural Verb").

For example:

The *committee* are in the process of making their decisions.

The *committee* is in the process of making its decision.

Let's test our understanding of the final two rules by completing the following exercise.
