A beautiful cavalier quilt is being raffled (see picture to right). The quilt being offered was designed and hand sewn by Rebecca Land. Becky is a lifelong friend of CKCSCUSA member, Debra Cline. Becky has a cavalier, Boudreaux, who suffered a small intestine perforation from eating a foreign object. Boudreaux spent the better part of the 2011 holiday season in the veterinary ICU at Texas A&M vet school. He had several surgeries to remove the object and correct the subsequent infection. He pulled through these and the accompanying

infection and nutrition issues thanks to the excellent but expensive care he received.
Boudreaux's bills were paid in part by rescue benefactors and a rescue honorarium from the vet school. In return for this assistance, Becky crafted this 40x40 hand sewn quilt to help raise money for cavalier rescue. Tickets are \$5 each for this raffle and can be



Make a Lasting Impression

Did you ever want to have a keepsake of one of your "heart" cavaliers. You know the one I am talking about. The one that you let sleep with you, the one you find hugging and kissing more than the others (is that just possible), the one, well that is the one...

I have two cavaliers. One is my heart, my first cavalier, my boy Finn. The other is my Skye, the little man who came to me at 9 months of age and captured my soul with his loving eyes.

Paula and Brenda can attest to how much I love my little boys.

Sometimes I could be mistaken for a crazy dog lady as I love my boys so much!

I wanted to make a lasting ornament for our Christmas tree of my two boys, something special. This fit the bill. It is that old elementary school "salt dough" we used to make our handprints in and bring home to our parents! I just use it for PAWPRINTS! It's easy and here is the recipe:

SALT DOUGH
2 cups all-purpose
flour
1 cup salt
1 cup water
2 tablespoons
vegetable oil

- Preheat oven to
 degrees
 Fahrenheit.
- 2. Use a stand mixer to mix all together. Use dough hook to knead until soft and pliable.
- 3. Roll out on parchment paper about 1/4 inch thick. Press in paws. Cut around with the top of a glass or you can use a knife. Place on cookie sheets. Make a hole in the top (with a toothpick) for threading later.
- 4. Bake for 1-2 hours or until hard.
- 5. Paint and/or seal with clear varnish.

Voila! A perfect capture of your best friend's paw! You can of course use this recipe to make imprints of baby's feet, baby's hands,

children's hands, etc.

They make great keepsakes and gifts too!

FYI - don't try it with a cat unless you can herd them real good! LOL!

Special Class (4-5 mo)

Acadiana Louie (Barrios/Casey) - A youngster just over 4 months of age, not quite used to the lead. He has a very nice shape, with good front and rear angles as well as plenty of substance for his age. His expression is nice with a beautiful eye. Well broken markings. A promising puppy.

Senior Puppy Dog

AutumnHill Brookhaven Gone Country (Casey) - A richly colored Ruby that presents an overall nice shape. He has the beginnings of a nice coat with the correct texture. Excellent substance. Nice front with strong rear, which he used to his advantage. He moved with energy and confidence around the ring. An attractive more moderate head, with longer, less filled, muzzle, though he is young and this may come with time. Best Puppy Dog, Best Puppy in Match.

Graduate Puppy Dog

Acadiana Marshall (Casey) - A very well balance Blenheim, that at first was not quite up to the task of showing, but gained confidence quickly. Excellent size. Rich Color and well broken markings. He has a stand out head, soft, yet masculine. A full muzzle and a large, dark eye, gave him the desired expression. A nice proportion of top skull to foreface. A firm, straight topline and nicely angled rear completed the package. I like him a lot. Winners Dog, Best In Match

Junior Puppy Bitch

Riverview Jierans Skies The Limit (Farthing/Barrios) - A young puppy full of energy. She showed very confidently for just five months of age. A well broken Blenheim with a nice eye. Less angled in the front and rear but balanced overall. Moving close behind today.

Graduate Puppy Bitch

Tidewater Rebellion (O'Brien) - A nice compact bitch with good bone for size. Showed exuberantly, constantly wagging her tail. She had a good expression with large dark eyes. A level topline, however there is a slight drop off in croup. Moved correctly with drive. Winners Bitch and Best of Opposite, Reserve Best in Match.

Bred By Exhibitor



2nd: Pretty As Lace (Harrel/Allen) - A Happy older girl carrying a little extra weight today. She had a dense well broken coat. Shorter back. Moved confidently, but close in the rear today.

Judge's Critique - COS May Specialty

Puppy Sweeps - COS Specialty, May 2012

Judge: Mr. Mark Smith

Firstly I would like to thank the committee for inviting me to judge and for their kind hospitality throughout our stay, and to my steward for keeping things in check and running smoothly.

Junior Puppy Dog

1ST Hodges; Mimric Consensus

Blenheim male with lovely head, broad skull with good width between ears, large round dark eyes giving a soft expression. Correct dentition, Moderate neck into well laid shoulders, level top line with a tail carriage that came straight of the back and was level with his spine, good spring of rib, good bone, loved his overall shape and moved well coming and going. Delighted to award him BEST PUPPY DOG.

2ND Painter's; Brookhaven Smoke & Mirrors At Granlaurel

Tri Boy, who is well marked with lovely round dark eyes, good body and substance, nice head with good tan markings in all the right places, well sprung rib. Moved well when settled would have preferred a little more neck to have completed the picture but never the less a quality exhibit.

3RD Ayers & Martz; *Brookhaven Believe It Or Not*.

7 month old quality promising puppy that was lacking the maturity of the previous 2 in this class. Large round dark eyes, correct scissor bite, moderate neck and shoulders, level top line, good angulation throughout, quality coat of good colour, moved well.

4th Kates; Saintsbridges Darne Come Sail Away.

Well marked Blenheim dog who was very immature, large eyes, lacks fill under eyes at this moment in time, Moderate neck would have preferred a better lay of shoulder, can lose his top line at times when on the move.

Senior Puppy Dog

1st Bialek; Bonitos Companeros Kaleo at Diochavon.

Masculine male with large round dark soft eyes, lovely head properties well feathered ears, black nose pigment, nice arched neck into well placed shoulders, good spring of rib and depth to chest, level top line, presented beautifully, would prefer a little more drive from behind.

2nd Maddox: Denham Dream Boat.

A Quality ruby , large lustrous dark eyes, well feathered ears that framed his face, moderate neck into well laid shoulder, placement, level top line moderate bone, just needs to spring in rib and just lacked the maturity in body to 1 but a lovely exhibit, nice coat colour and put down in wonderful condition.

3rd Mixon; *Tudorr Apollo*.

Blenheim male, large dark eyes, flat skull and well feathered ears, moderate neck, would prefer a slightly better lay of shoulder and slightly shorter in loin to complete the picture

4th Bales; Oggbrae Don Ottavio.

Blenheim male with large dark eyes, good nose pigment, moderate bone and neck although his shoulders could be laid back more, he needs to spring in rib and fill out all over.

Graduate Puppy Dog

1ST Fairchild; Lynsfaire Hot Off The Press.

Blenheim male, well broken markings , he has large round dark eyes , Black pigment and correct scissor bite . Moderate neck and shoulders into a level top line , well turned stifles, correct tail set and carriage just needs a little more body. Very showy.

2nd Brown's; Brookhaven Enchanted Dreamer.

Blenheim dog who was more me in head type, large dark expressive eyes, moderate neck, not the lay of shoulder of 1, level top line, good sprung ribs and good turn of stifle, a little weak in rear and not the muscle tone of 1, would benefit from road work.

Junior Puppy Bitch

This was a very good class for overall type and quality and I am sure several of these bitches could change places at different times.

1st Ayers &Martz; Brookhaven In The Garden.

Pretty headed well broken Blenheim bitch, large round dark eyes, nice arched neck into well laid shoulders, moderate bone and well sprung ribs. She presents a well-balanced picture when viewed from across the ring and is exactly that when you go over her. Moves well. Am sure she has a bright future.

2nd Whitmire's; Almera Scrumdillyicious

A very apt name for this bitch cause she is exactly that, she has a gorgeous head and the softest of eyes that you melt into she is very together for 6 months of age and has a good body and substance for her size, a firm level top line which she kept at all times and was very well schooled for her age and very attentive to her owner, just not the neck of 1.

3rd Hoopers; Starmarc I Believe

Tri bitch lovely head and expression 7 months, good tan, moderate neck and shoulders, well sprung ribs and depth to chest, level top line moved well needs to drop back into herself.

4th Dephillip's; *Darane Casablanca at Chewcreek*

Narrow blazed Tri bitch large eyes although she does show white in one eye and along with the narrow blaze gave her a slightly harsh expression, good tan markings in all the right places, moderate neck, shoulder placement could have been a little better, nice sprung ribs, level top line and good tail set.

Senior Puppy Bitch

1st Bale; Oggbrae Donna Elvira

A well-marked Blenheim girl of just 9 months, large dark eyes and nose pigment was ok, adequate neck and shoulders, well sprung ribs, she is longer cast that I would like and would prefer a better turn of stifle, she would benefit from road work as she needs to strengthen in the rear.

Graduate Puppy Bitch

This was a quality class of bitches and it really did come down to splitting hairs on the 3 places.

1st Cline's; Forrestcreek Princess Diana

What a princess this little girl was, gorgeous head, large round dark eyes giving the softest of expression, correct dentition and black pigment, excels in breed type and make and shape, she looks elegant going around the ring in profile. standing she gives the picture of a well-balanced bitch and when you go over her she doesn't disappoint and to top it off she had a great coat texture which was very rich in colour. Delighted to award her BEST PUPPY IN SWEEPS.

2nd Ayers &Martz; Tassajara Brookhaven Louisa May Alcott

Pretty feminine bitch, neat in shape, large dark lustrous dark eyes, blackest of noses, nice neck into good shoulders good spring of rib, level top line, short coupled, moderate bone. She was a little erratic and fidgety at times and her handler certainly had to work hard was pleased to see that by the following day she was more settled.

3rd Mixon & Clines; Forrestcreek Pippa

Litter sister to one and boy are they a like, Lovely head and dark soft expressive eyes. Like her sister she has a quality textured coat and was so rich in colour, she has a lovely arched neck into well laid shoulders good depth of chest and spring of rib, a level top line which she kept at all times. She was slightly longer in loin to the previous 2 but a quality exhibit.

4th Hardwick; TuSus Your Secret is Safe.

Blenheim girl who was larger in size and different in type to the previous 3 in this class, large eyes but unfortunately she shows white in both eyes and this did not help her expression, good nose pigmentation she has a moderate neck, her shoulder placement was not as good as the previous 3, she has a level top line but falls away at the croup. Needs to tighten in movement.






THE CKCSC USA 2013 National
