From Pastor Sharon Huff



Last month I wrote about my dog Eddie, this month I thought I'd give equal time to my cat, Tux.

Tux, a black and white tuxedo cat, was adopted about 12 years ago, from a rescue organization. Tux has two distinctive personality characteristics: his love of food and his cowardice.

A former stray, Tux is what's known as "food driven." In other words, all he wants to do is eat. Apparently Tux was hungry on his own, and according to the rescue organization, it was hard to catch him as a stray. The only reason they were able to was because of his love of food. He's one of the most shy cats I've encountered, startling at any noise and running from just about everyone except my son Craig and me. I have no doubt that a stray he was pretty miserable as he's the biggest "scaredy cat" I've ever seen. At home he generally hides in my closet or in Craig's room.

A couple of months ago Tux developed an abscess in a rather unfortunate location which I shall tastefully decline naming. By the time we discovered it, it was on its way to healing. Craig and I took him to the vet even so, where he meowed loudly and clung tightly to Craig's jacket with all his claws. Call us cold hearted, but he was such a wuss that we couldn't help laughing.

When we got him home, in order to comfort him, he filled up his food bowl. That did the trick!

I write about Tux and his fear because fear is one of the biggest factors for human behavior. Fear can keep us locked into unhealthy patterns and lifestyles, afraid of what our friends will think, afraid of ridicule, afraid of failing, afraid of being hurt. In this time after Easter, we are reminded that the disciples of Jesus were also quite fearful (who wouldn't be, given their circumstances?) but that Jesus was constantly reassuring them, "Do not be afraid."

Someone has said, "The presence of fear is a sure sign that we're trusting in our own strength."

Christ said, "Peace be with you!" Peace is possible because Jesus will never leave you or forsake you. When our actions are dictated by fear, we do well to turn to Jesus, who has the wherewithal to help us deal with our fears to healthier living.






Winter, Summer, Spring.....I truly don't know what time of year it is with the weather changing like it is. Come on Summer.
