
# Fall 2016 Weber Honors College Application

#### **Contact Information**



Thank you for your interest in the Weber Honors College at San Diego State University. We look forward to reviewing your application. *Given the competitive nature of the application process, we strongly urge all interested students to apply to the Weber Honors College by January 15.* Applicants will be notified of their Weber Honors College admission decision in mid-February.

Each year, the Weber Honors College awards approximately 15-20 scholarships to incoming honors freshmen. To apply for these scholarships you must first complete your application to the Weber Honors College by the January 15 deadline. After you submit your Weber Honors College application, you will receive an email with a link to the Weber Honors College Scholarship Application. You must complete the Weber Honors College Scholarship Application by January 22, 2016 in order to be considered for these scholarships.

After January 15, applications will be accepted and evaluated on a space-available basis until March 30. A limited number of applications received after January 15 will be admitted into the Weber Honors College. Applicants applying after January 15 will be notified of their Weber Honors College admission decision in mid-April.

You CAN apply and be admitted into the Weber Honors College even if you haven't yet been admitted to SDSU. However, your participation in the Honors College is dependent upon admission into SDSU.

Please note that all first time freshmen Weber Honors College students are required to live

on campus in the Honors Residential College in Zura Hall during their first year at San Diego State University. Click here for more information about this requirement.

BEFORE you begin completing the application, please review the following **Frequently Asked Questions** from our applicants:

- 1. How many honors classes are required to complete the Weber Honors College? Students enrolled in the Weber Honors College must complete the Honors Minor in Interdisciplinary Studies. The Honors minor consists of 15 units of honors coursework; three of these units fulfill General Education requirements. In order to complete the Honors minor, students typically enroll in one honors class per academic year.
- 2. What are the benefits of the Honors Minor in Interdisciplinary Studies? The minor includes a unique offering of courses and seminars dedicated to interdisciplinary inquiry. The minor provides the ideal avenue for students to become intellectually well rounded. The integrative nature of the coursework invites students to reach beyond the boundaries of their academic major and join in scholarly conversation with students and faculty from disciplines other than their own. By facilitating a more sophisticated exploration of issues in an area by drawing from other relevant bodies of knowledge, the minor broadens and deepens a student's academic focus, and provides the intellectual tools for success in graduate school, professional work, and the modern workplace.

### 3. Is study abroad required for the Weber Honors College?

Yes, all Weber Honors College students are required to complete a credit-bearing study abroad experience. Students may choose from short-term study tours, to summer abroad programs, to semester-long and year-long exchanges. The university offers a number of affordable study abroad options and honors students are eligible to compete for study abroad scholarships.

4. If I am admitted, how do I remain in good standing and graduate from the Weber Honors College?

In order to graduate from the Weber Honors College, students must complete the Honors Minor in Interdisciplinary Studies, study abroad, achieve a cumulative 3.2 GPA, and participate in Weber Honors College sponsored meetings and events.

5. Do students in the Weber Honors College receive priority registration?

No. However, all freshmen students receive early registration privileges. After your freshmen year, honors students register according to the standard registration schedule provided by the university. Despite not having priority registration, our students are very successful in getting the classes they need to graduate on time. In fact, 77% of our Weber Honors College graduates, many with double majors and double minors, graduate in four years or less.

#### 6. Can I save my application and come back and work on it later?

Yes. You are under no obligation to finish your application in one sitting. To save your work and continue later, click the text at the top of the screen that says, "save and continue application later." When you click on that text, you will be prompted to supply your email address in order to save your work. You will then receive an email containing a unique web link that will allow you to return to your application where you left off. Do not misplace or delete this email. It is very important that you remember to submit the application after you are satisfied with your work and after you have copied and pasted your essay responses into the essay text boxes. Once your application has been submitted, you will be unable to access it again.

- 7. Does applying to the Weber Honors College commit me to attending to SDSU?

  No. You DO NOT have to commit to SDSU in order to apply to the Weber Honors

  College.
- 8. If I get accepted into the Weber Honors College, does that commit me to attending SDSU?

No. You DO NOT have to commit to the Weber Honors College until you have decided if you are going to attend SDSU.

9. If accepted to the Weber Honors College, am I required to live in Zura Hall?
All first time freshmen Weber Honors College students must live in the Honors
Residential College located in Zura Hall. Current SDSU students and transfer students
are not required to live in Zura Hall.

### To complete the WHC application you'll need to:

- 1. gather and report your GPA (and SAT or ACT scores for high school applicants),
- 2. list extracurricular and community service activities, and
- 3. write one 750 word essay (based on the provided prompts located on the last page of the application).

Neither letters of recommendation nor transcripts are required. Simply fill out the online application, including your short-answer responses and upload your essay.



- 1. Leave yourself time to rewrite and revise.

  Start early and leave plenty of time! Most likely that means to give yourself weeks (not days, and certainly not hours!) to rework your essay.
- 2. Be original.

As you are writing and revising, continually ask yourself if you would be interested in reading your essay. Tell us something new that we may not have heard before.

- 3. Show genuine enthusiasm. Nothing draws a reader more than writing that is invigorating. Your enthusiasm will show through.
- 4. Be specific, give examples and answer every part of the question.

  You need to include concrete details when responding to the essay question.

  Responding to only parts of a question will result in lower marks.
- 5. Proofread your work.

Make sure you do not have any typographical errors. Do not rely on your computer's spell check. Although some software programs make grammatical changes for you, chances are you will need to read your essay word for word to make sure you have not goofed, for example, by using "there" instead of "their" or "form" instead of "from." Also make sure your intended meaning is coming across.

## **ESSAY INSTRUCTIONS**

Every applicant MUST write an essay, consisting of three distinct parts, based on the following questions. Your essay should be approximately 750 words in total (so, approximately 250 words per question). Remember to be specific, give examples, and answer EVERY part of each question.

- 1. Describe your short-term (3-5 year) and long-term (8-10 year) goals and how you plan to accomplish them. How does participation in the Weber Honors College relate to these goals? Finally, what does it mean to be successful in life and how is your definition of success similar or different from your parents?
- 2. Leadership Starts Here, SDSU's tagline, is a bold statement of the university's impact and commitment. What is your definition of leadership and provide a specific example of when you demonstrated leadership, including the outcome of your leadership. What did you learn about your own individual strengths and weaknesses through this leadership experience?
- 3. Describe a time in which you collaborated or interacted with people whose background, experiences and/or beliefs differed from yours. How did you react and what conclusions did you draw from the experience? Address how you think your reactions and conclusions from this experience will impact your time at SDSU and your participation in the Weber Honors College.


